Constitution, Rules & Playing Conditions

1 Constitution

1.1 Name

This combination shall be known as the Bassetlaw & District Cricket League.

1.2 Purpose

To foster and promote participation in the sport of Cricket within the Bassetlaw Community. To organise cricket clubs who wish to participate into an appropriate number of Divisions plus Cup Competitions and to manage these competitions and arrangements.

1.3 Affiliation

- 1.3.1 The League requires that all clubs playing in the Bassetlaw & District Cricket League are affiliated to the England and Wales Cricket Board through a primary affiliation to the County Cricket Board in which they reside. Clubs which reside outside of Nottinghamshire are able to secure a secondary affiliation to the NCB on a purely voluntary basis. The League Treasurer will act as an intermediary between clubs and the country boards, collecting all monies as required.
- 1.3.2 The League requires that its member clubs shall ensure that members abide by the Laws of Cricket and playing and non-playing members abide by the League's Code of Conduct which incorporates the Spirit of Cricket.
- 1.3.3 The League requires that all its member clubs shall adopt and implement the ECB 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children' and any future versions of the policy.
- 1.3.4 The League requires that all its member clubs shall adopt and implement the ECB Cricket Equality Policy and any future versions of this policy.

1.4 Membership

1.4.1 Applications from clubs desiring admission to the League must be in writing and received by the League Secretary by the last day of March in the year preceding that in which they wish to take part.

- Applications from existing clubs desiring admission of additional teams to the League must be in writing and received by the League Secretary by the last day of November in the year preceding that in which they wish to take part.
- 1.4.2 Before a club is accepted into the League the LMC will need to be satisfied with its status, facilities, and ability to provide active Umpires as per Rule 6.4. A member of the LMC will inspect the facilities before acceptance.
 - The LMC will decide to which Division of the League an applicant club will be admitted having considered the above criteria.
- 1.4.3 Clubs wishing to resign from the League or any Division of the League shall give notice in writing to the League Secretary by the last day in November; clubs resigning during the season shall be fined the current year's subscription. Individual teams resigning during the season will be fined prorata subject to LMC decision.
- 1.4.4 The LMC reserves the right to ask any club to resign if, in its opinion, the general conduct or appointments of such a club do not satisfy the requirements of the League. Fourteen days' notice of a complaint must be given in writing to the Secretary of the club affected.
- 1.4.5 Any club ceasing to be a member of the League shall at once forfeit any rights to participate in the assets of the League.

1.5 Finance

- 1.5.1 The BDCL is a not for profit organisation and subject to these Rules, the LMC shall have the responsibility for the management of all its funds, property and affairs.
- 1.5.2 The funds of the League shall be dealt with by and through an account with a bank in the name of the League. Cheques may be drawn on two signatures. The League Chairman, League Secretary and League Treasurer shall be authorised signatories.
- 1.5.3 The financial year shall end on 30th September, after which the accounts shall be inspected by an Independent Examiner who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 1.5.4 The entrance fee for any newly admitted club shall be £30.00.
- 1.5.5 The subscription from each club shall be £35.00 per team per annum to be paid not later than 31st March in any year. Any club failing to comply with this rule shall be fined £5.00 for the first month, or part of the month, after this date, and £20.00 for every month, or part of a month, thereafter that the subscription remains unpaid.
- 1.5.6 If the income from subscriptions is insufficient to meet League expenses, a further levy may be made on each club.

1.5.7 Honoraria, if any, to be paid to any individuals shall be agreed annually by the LMC.

1.6 Officers

- 1.6.1 The officers of the League shall consist of The President, Vice-President, Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Fixture Secretary, Statistician, Player Registrar and the Umpires Appointment Secretary, all of whom, with the exception of the President and Vice-President, shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 1.6.2 The President and Vice-President shall be elected by the LMC and during the year of office and for one year thereafter shall be entitled to serve on the LMC.
- 1.6.3 Life Members and Life Vice-Presidents may be elected by the LMC in recognition of past services to the League, the former being entitled to attend meetings of the LMC.
- 1.6.4 A Handbook Editor, an Independent Examiner, a Lead Sponsorship Officer and a Press/Advertising Officer shall be appointed by the LMC from its own elected members or by co-opting non-voting officers.

1.7 General Meetings

- 1.7.1 The Annual General Meeting shall be held in November each year. A Pre-AGM meeting may be held at least 28 days prior to the AGM for discussion with clubs of proposed changes to Rules and League Structure
- 1.7.2 Nominations of officers and members of the LMC must be received by the League Secretary not later than 42 clear days previous to the date of the Annual General Meeting. If the number of nominations makes it necessary, the election of such officers and members shall be by ballot at the Annual General Meeting.
- 1.7.3 Proposals for alterations to these rules to be considered at the Annual General Meeting must be received by the League Secretary not later than 28 clear days previous to the date of the Annual General Meeting. Proposals for such alterations may also be made by the LMC and the BDUA.
- 1.7.4 Ten clear days' notice of the Annual General Meeting, which will include nominations of officers and members of the LMC and proposals for alterations to these rules, shall be forwarded to each club.
- 1.7.5 Not more than two representatives of each Member Club shall attend the Annual General Meeting, only one of whom shall be entitled to vote on all issues generally transacted at such a meeting.
 - Should a Pre-AGM meeting be called, not more than two representatives of each Member Club shall attend; it is desirable that one of these two representatives should have played for their club in the current season.

- 1.7.6 The President, or Immediate Past President, or if both these officers shall be absent, a deputy appointed by the meeting shall preside at an AGM, and shall have a casting vote.
- 1.7.7 If it is thought desirable that only certain Member Clubs should vote on a certain matter, this restriction shall only be permitted with the specific consent of the Annual General Meeting.
- 1.7.8 Any club failing to be represented at the Annual General Meeting shall be fined £75.00.
- 1.7.9 If after the election of the members of the LMC at the Annual General Meeting any alterations duly made under Rule 1.7.3 at the same Annual General Meeting affect the constitution of the LMC, then these alterations will take affect from the date of the next Annual General Meeting unless an Extraordinary General Meeting is called under Rule 1.7.11 to authorise an earlier implementation.
- 1.7.10 All competitions will be played under the rules approved by the Annual General Meeting.
- 1.7.11 The rules applicable to the Annual General Meeting, with the exception of Rule 1.7.1, shall also apply to an Extraordinary General Meeting or Pre-AGM Meeting whenever such a meeting is convened.

1.8 League Management Committee

- 1.8.1 Subject to these Rules, the LMC shall have the responsibility for the management of the League, its funds, property and affairs.
- 1.8.2 The League shall be governed by a LMC consisting of the officers named in Rules 1.6.1 and 1.6.3 and thirteen representatives from all clubs in the League who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. One representative of the BDUA appointed by that Association and one representative of the NCB PL, appointed by their Management Committee, shall serve on this Committee.
- 1.8.3 Not more than one representative from any one club shall serve on this Committee, with the exception of the officers named in Rules 1.6.1 and 1.6.3.
- 1.8.4 Nine members shall form a quorum.
- 1.8.5 At least four clear days' notice of such meetings shall be given.
- 1.8.6 Members of this Committee shall not be allowed to vote on questions arising out of matters in which their clubs are concerned.
- 1.8.7 Travelling expenses of members of this Committee, over and above those expected in the normal course of their duties, shall be paid by the League.

- 1.8.8 Any member of the LMC failing to attend two consecutive meetings without reasonable cause shall forfeit his seat which shall be filled by the Committee at the next meeting. The member so appointed shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting.
- 1.8.9 The LMC may appoint such sub-committees as they may from time to time consider necessary.
- 1.8.10 A Vice-Chairman shall be appointed by the LMC from amongst their numbers at the first Committee meeting after the Annual General Meeting.
- 1.8.11 The Chairman, or in his absence the Vice-Chairman, or if both are absent, a deputy appointed by the LMC shall preside at all LMC Meetings and shall have a casting vote.
- 1.8.12 The LMC will meet, unless otherwise communicated, on each second Tuesday of the month.

1.9 Trophies

- 1.9.1 Each winning club shall be responsible for the insurance of the trophy it holds during the ensuing twelve months. Clubs will be advised of the value of each trophy for insurance purposes.
- 1.9.2 Each trophy must be returned in clean condition to the Appointed League Engraver not later than the last day of September in each year. Failure to observe this rule will render the club concerned liable to a fine of £75.00.

1.10 Return of Circulated Documents

- 1.10.1 Documents distributed by the League Secretary or other LMC members by email and/or post should be returned by the timescales provided.
- 1.10.2 Failure by a club to return a circulated document related to the administration of the League by the due date shall render that club liable to a £5.00 fine.

1.11 Winding-up

- 1.11.1 The members may vote to wind up the League at a properly convened Annual General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting. Three quarters of all member clubs shall form a quorum.
- 1.11.2 The LMC will be responsible for the orderly winding up of the League's affairs.
- 1.11.3 After settling all liabilities of the League, the LMC shall dispose of the net assets remaining to the Nottinghamshire Cricket Board.

2 League Competition

2.1 Constitution of Divisions

- 2.1.1 The constitution of the Championship and the other Divisions of the League shall be determined by the LMC.
- 2.1.2 The teams in membership shall be organised into an appropriate number of Divisions, with the top Division named the 'Championship'.
- 2.1.3 There will normally be a maximum of 12 teams in each division.
- 2.1.4 No club shall have more than one team in any Division, except the lowest.
- 2.1.5 Two teams from the same club shall not exchange Division.

2.2 Trophies

The following trophies shall be awarded to the Champions of the respective Divisions at the end of each season, where applicable:

The Bassetlaw Umpires' Cup	Division 4

2.3 Promotion and Relegation

2.3.1 At the end of each season the top two teams in all Divisions below the Championship shall be promoted. The winner of the Championship shall be promoted to the NPL

Promotion from the Championship to the NPL will be dependent on the criteria laid out by the NPL (please refer to the NPL Rules and Regulations found in the Document Library at http://nottinghamshirecbpl.play-criciket.com/). Should the winner of the Championship not meet these criteria, then promotion may pass to the runners up.

Promotion from Division 1 to the Championship is dependent on the criteria laid out in Rule 3.11. Should the criteria not be met by either the winner or runners up, the number of teams relegated from the Championship shall be reduced.

- 2.3.2 In order to keep the number of teams in each Division as per Rule 2.1.3, relegations will be made of the teams finishing at the bottom of each Division, up to a maximum of three.
- 2.3.3 In the event of two or more teams finishing the season on the same number of points, the matter shall be resolved by the following criteria, taken in order:

- 2.3.3.1 The number of matches won.
- 2.3.3.2 The number of points achieved from winning draws.
- 2.3.3.3 The net run rate over all completed matches.
- 2.3.3.4 The toss of a coin.
- 2.3.4 A team shall forfeit promotion in favour of the next eligible team if such promotion would result in a contravention of Rule 2.1.4.
- 2.3.5 Should the relegation of a team result in a contravention of Rule 2.1.4, the team in the lower Division that season shall be demoted, irrespective of its finishing position, instead of the team in the highest relegation position.

2.4 Fixtures

- 2.4.1 Fixtures will be played on dates arranged by the Fixture Secretary.
- 2.4.2 A club's league fixtures will take precedence over any other match.
- 2.4.3 The Fixture Secretary will publish all League Fixtures to all clubs by the end of December each year of the close season. Clubs will be allowed up to three amendments (arranged between them) and returned on a pro forma to the Fixture Secretary within 14 days. Where clubs cannot agree upon a desired amendment, a submission should be made to the LMC, whose decision shall be final. Clubs with a 3rd XI may be allowed additional flexibility with the consent of the Fixture Secretary.
 - Final fixtures will be made available to Clubs via email and published via the BDCL website and the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket website.
- 2.4.4 Fixtures shall be made for each Saturday between late April and mid-September. Bank Holidays during the season shall be used as required.
 - In exceptional circumstances, the Fixture Secretary may arrange fixtures to be played on Sundays.
- 2.4.5 Where, for any reason, there are more than twelve teams in a Division, the clubs in that Division shall be balloted to ascertain whether each team should play each other twice, both home and away, or should fulfil a reduced programme of fixtures arranged by the Fixture Secretary. Should a ballot be tied, the LMC shall decide on the number of fixtures to be arranged.
- 2.4.6 Any request for a change of fixture after 31 January must be submitted in writing to the Fixture Secretary not less than ten days before the date of the proposed change. Such changes must have the sanction of the LMC who will only allow them in exceptional circumstances.
- 2.4.7 The League Secretary will notify clubs of dates on which a Representative XI may be required. No player selected to play for the League in a representative match will be allowed to play in any competition within the League's jurisdiction on the day of that match without the express permission of the LMC.

2.5 Cancellation of Matches

2.5.1 A cancellation due to adverse playing conditions may be made by the home club ONLY WITH THE VERBAL AGREEMENT OF THE AWAY CLUB (email and text messages should not be used).

If the away team do not agree to the cancellation and wish to travel, both teams MUST regard the game as being 'on and to be played' and the umpires will then make their usual decisions at the start of the game as to whether play should begin in keeping with League Rules and the Laws of the game. If no umpires are present. Rule 2.5.5 applies.

2.5.2 No such cancellation shall be made before 10.00am on the day on which the match is to be played.

Failure by the home club to contact the away club to seek agreement that the game is cancelled due to adverse playing conditions, and the away team arrive at the ground believing the game is to be played, then the sanctions stated at Rule 2.5.6 shall apply, although no points shall be deducted from the Divisional total of the home team.

- 2.5.3 All such cancellations must be agreed by the two clubs and the appointed Umpires informed not later than two hours before the scheduled start time.
- 2.5.4 Unless a match is cancelled under this rule, the visiting team shall be responsible for the payment of the teas provided for it by the home club.
- 2.5.5 If the away team has travelled, the appointed Umpires shall assess the ground conditions and allow play to commence unless it is deemed dangerous. The Umpires shall be the sole authority in such matters. Should there be no appointed Umpires the Captains shall have sole authority. If the Captains disagree, the match shall be cancelled and the League Secretary notified.
- 2.5.6 Any club failing to fulfil a League engagement will be fined £10.00 and will have ten points deducted from the total of the team concerned. The game shall be counted as a win, with full bonus points, for their opponents.
- 2.5.7 All fines collected under rule 2.5.6 shall be paid to the non-offending club as a reduction in subscriptions for the following season.
- 2.5.8 If in the opinion of the LMC, undue advantage is taken of this rule by any club, it shall deal with it according to its discretion.
- 2.5.9 Any team which, having arrived at the ground along with the opposition and the officials, that either refuses to play or concedes the game, shall be referred to the LMC. The minimum sanction will be that as under Rule 2.5.6.

2.6 Match Points

- 2.6.1 A maximum of 20 points to be available to each team in all completed matches divided up as follows:
- 2.6.1.1 20 points for a win, 0 for a defeat.

When batting first, a win is achieved when the opposition is bowled out for a lower total than they achieved.

When batting second, a win is achieved when their batting total exceeds that of the team which batted first.

- 2.6.1.2 10 points for a draw for the side batting first and 2 points for the side batting second.
- 2.6.1.3 6 points to each side when the scores are equal, irrespective of the number of wickets lost.
- 2.6.1.4 1 bonus point to the batting side on reaching each of the following scores: 140 runs, 160 runs, 180 runs, 200 runs (Championship), 120 runs, 140 runs, 160 runs, 180 runs (Division 1-7).
- 2.6.1.5 1 bonus point to the fielding side at the fall of each of the following wickets: 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th.

Maximum bowling bonus points shall be awarded to the fielding side when the batting side is all out irrespective of the number of wickets to have fallen.

- 2.6.1.6 Bonus points will not be awarded to the winning team.
 - Bonus points will only be awarded to teams achieving a Winning Draw, a Losing Draw, Tied Matches, Lost Matches, Abandoned Matches and Incomplete Matches.
- 2.6.1 Six points to each side when a match is cancelled, or is not completed due to ground, whether or light conditions, or unforeseen circumstances.
- 2.6.3 In all Championship and Division 1 games, each team shall provide a competent scorer, whose name shall be entered as part of the formal scorecard submission on the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website.

Failure to comply with this rule will result in a 1-point deduction for each game without a scorer.

2.7 Notification of Results

It is the responsibility of both Captains to ensure that the home team has all the information required in order to comply with this rule.

2.7.1 All results must be entered on to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website by 10.00am on the day following the match.

For games played on any other day, the home club shall enter the result on to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website by 11.00pm on the day of the match.

2.7.2 All scorecards and match team cards must be entered on to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website within 48 hours of the completion of the match.

Scorecards are to be fully entered with no errors (as shown with red text), to include all participating players and the names of players involved with catches, stumpings and run outs. The Captain and wicket-keeper must also be listed correctly.

The names of all umpires and scorers (whether official or club supplied) are to be added to the summary page so that they appear on the scorecard.

The Match team card must be uploaded via the 'Edit Report' button as displayed in the results section of the Club ECB Play-Cricket site.

Any problems relating to the submission of a result or scorecard should be communicated to the League Secretary (preferably via email), in the first instance for investigation.

2.7.3 The home side has the full responsibility for the submission and correctness of the result and scorecard.

The home side has the full responsibility for the uploading of the match team card.

Both sides have the responsibility for the correctness of the match team card.

- 2.7.4 Details on completing Online Scorecards can be found under Rule 8.7.
 - Details on uploading the Match Team Card can be found under Rule 8.8.
- 2.7.5 Non-compliance with any part of this rule will face a sanction as determined by the LMC.

3 Playing Conditions

Players and Officials are not permitted to smoke or vape on the field of play whist a match is in progress.

3.1 Laws and Regulations

- 3.1.1 All matches shall be played under MCC Laws except where otherwise stated.
 - MCC experimental laws will be implemented by the league in the same season that they are applicable.
- 3.1.2 ECB recommendations and directives with respect to young players a) Fast Bowling, b) Wearing of Helmets and c) Fielding, shall be implemented in full. Any player under the age of 18 shall be bound by the ECB Directives. These can be found at www.ecb.co.uk/governance/regulations/non-first-class-regulations.

Age Groups are based on the age of the player at midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season.

3.1.3 Umpires (or Captains where no Umpires' are present) and any individual taking responsibility for players are requested to ensure that Rules 3.1.1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3, 3.1.4 and 3.1.5 are strictly adhered to in all circumstances.

3.1.4 ECB FAST BOWLING DIRECTIVES

The ECB Fast Bowling Directives are as follows and apply for the full season:

Having completed a spell, the bowler cannot bowl again, from either end, until the equivalent number of overs to the length of their spell having been bowled from the same end

For the purpose of these Directives a fast bowler is defined as a bowler to whom a wicket keeper in the same age group would in **normal circumstances** stand back to take the ball.

3.1.5 JUNIOR FIELDING RESTRICTIONS

No young player in the Under 15 age group or younger shall be allowed to field closer than 8 yards (7.3 metres) from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side, until the batsman has played at the ball. A fielder shall be allowed to move into the restricted area to make a catch or field the ball provided that they were outside the area when the stroke was made.

For players in the Under 13 age group the distance is 11 yards (10 metres).

These minimum distances apply even if the player is wearing a helmet.

Should a young player in these age groups come within the restricted distance the Umpire (or Captains where no Umpires' are present) must stop the game immediately and instruct the fielder to move back.

In addition any young player in the Under 16 to Under 18 age groups, who has not reached the age of 18, must wear a helmet when fielding within 6 yards (5.5 metres) of the bat, except behind the wicket on the off side. Players should wear appropriate protective equipment whenever they are fielding in a position where they feel at risk.

3.1.6 ECB SAFETY MEASURES FOR HELMETS WITHIN RECREATIONAL CRICKET

Players over the age of 18

The ECB strongly recommends that all adult recreational cricketers should wear helmets for certain activities, preferably which meet the most recent British Safety Standard (see below). This recommendation applies to batting

against all types of bowling, wicket-keepers standing up to the wicket (who may as an alternative wear face protectors) and fielders fielding closer than eight yards from the batsman's middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side.

Players under the age of 18

Batsmen and wicket-keepers standing up to the stumps must wear head protection when playing or practising. That Guidance should be referred to in full for the position in relation to U18's.

3.1.7 MATCH TEAM CARDS

Each side must provide the Umpires with a Match Team Card before the start of the match identifying any player in the U13, U15 or U19 age groups. This requirement also covers any young player taking the field as a substitute fielder.

3.2 Hours of Play - General Information

- 3.2.1 For the Championship, matches shall commence at 1.00pm in April to August and at 12.30pm in September. For all other Divisions, matches shall commence at 1.30pm in April to August and at 1.00pm in September.
 - Clubs may, if they so desire, start earlier if they mutually agree; the Umpires' Appointments Secretary must be informed.
- 3.2.2 There shall be an interval of 10 minutes between the innings plus 20 minutes for tea.
- 3.2.3 All sides are expected to be in position to bowl the first ball of the last of their allocated number of overs within 3 hours (Championship) or 2 hours 45 minutes (Division 1-7).
 - This equates to a minimum of 16.67 overs (Championship) or 16.73 overs (Division 1-7); teams should therefore aim for a minimum of 17 overs per hour.
 - It is the responsibility of the Captain to ensure that his team bowl their allocated overs within the playing time.
- 3.2.4 A variation in time of 3½ minutes per over shall be made if more or less than the allocated number of overs are scheduled to be bowled (rounded up to the nearest minute where necessary).
- 3.2.5 No match shall start later than 3 hours after the scheduled start time.
- 3.2.6 Umpires shall make due time allowance for all drinks intervals per innings, if taken, and for unavoidable stoppages caused by injury or other unforeseen circumstances.
- 3.2.7 The Umpires shall have sole authority as to when intervals shall be taken.

3.2.8 If in the opinion of the Umpires, either fielding team fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the innings, play shall continue, subject to the prevailing ground, weather or light conditions, until the required number of overs has been bowled, or a result has been achieved.

The Umpires shall record and report all overs started by the fielding side after the time allowed, and a team shall subsequently forfeit 1 league table point for each 'late' over.

Any intervals due shall be of the full duration.

3.2.9 The Umpires shall inform the fielding team Captain when taking the field for the first time and on every subsequent occasion if play is interrupted by the prevailing ground, weather or light conditions, of the scheduled cessation time for that innings.

The Umpires shall also inform the fielding team Captain after one hour's play, the time remaining at the end of the drinks interval, and when one hour of play remains.

The Umpire at the bowler's end will inform the fielding Captain, the batsman and his fellow Umpire of any time allowances as and when they arise (this matter will not be subject to retrospective negotiation).

- 3.3 Matches not Interrupted or Delayed by Weather, Light or Other Unforeseen Circumstances
- 3.3.1 Each side shall bat for 50 overs (Championship) or 46 overs (Division 1-7) unless all out earlier.
- 3.4 Matches Delayed at the Start or Interrupted by Weather, Light or Unforeseen Circumstances
- 3.4.1 The number of overs shall be arranged so that both teams have the opportunity of batting for the same number of overs.
- 3.4.2 No match shall be reduced to less than 80 overs (Championship) or 72 overs (Division 1-7) scheduled at 40 overs (Championship) or 36 overs (Division 1-7).

3.4.3 If the team fielding fails to bowl the required number of overs within the recalculated time allowance, the provisions in Rule 3.2.8 shall apply.

The calculations are shown as follows (Championship/Division 1-7):

The calculation of the time allowance with which to bowl the allocated overs is based on one over for each 3½ minutes, rounded up to the nearest minute where appropriate.

3.4.5 The number of runs required to achieve batting bonus points, when not winning the match, will be adjusted as follows (*Championship*/Division 1-7):

3.4.6 If, after 1 hour has elapsed, or after the game has started, interference by weather, light or unforeseen circumstances amounts to more than 30 minutes, a time limit shall be applied from the time 5½ hours (Championship) or 5 hours (Division 1-7) after the scheduled start of play.

A match which is delayed for more than 1 hour after the scheduled start of play, but is able to start before 1 hour and 30 minutes after the scheduled start of play (1 hour and 50 minutes should an early tea be taken), will remain a reduced overs game scheduled at 40 overs (Championship) or 36 overs

(Division 1-7) per team. The additional time lost (up to 30 minutes) will form part of the 30 minutes allowable before a time limit shall apply.

Should the interruption occur during the first innings, on resumption the batting side will be entitled to bat for the maximum allotted overs as scheduled at the start of play

- 3.4.7 When a time limit has been applied there shall, unless further interference occurs or the match is completed, be one hour's play or a minimum of 17 overs bowled.
- If further interference occurs by weather, light or unforeseen circumstances 3.4.8 when a time limit has been applied, or if time is lost during the last hour of play causes a time limit to be applied, the number of overs to be bowled on any resumption of play shall be reduced, from the total of 17, by one over for each full 3½ minutes which have elapsed after the scheduled commencement of the last hour.

During the last hour, the number of overs bowled prior to any interruption is not taken into consideration when working out the number of overs remaining. The calculation of the number of overs remaining is determined using the following table:

During the last hour, on resumption of play, any part overs count as a whole over. For example, if there are 8 minutes of playing time remaining and the bowler has 3 balls remaining of their current over. The minimum number of overs to be bowled will be 2.3 (and not 3).

3.5 Overs per Bowler

351 No bowler shall bowl more than a maximum of 12 overs (Championship), or 10 overs (Division 1-7).


3.5.2 For matches that are delayed and there is a reduction in the scheduled number of overs, the maximum number of overs per bowler is shown as follows:

- 3.5.3 In the event of a bowler being unable to complete an over for any reason, the over in progress shall be completed by any other player except the player who bowled the previous over or any player where this would contravene the ECB Fast Bowling Directives (please refer to Rule 3.1.1 and Appendix 1). Any such parts of an over shall count as a full over towards each bowler's allocation.
- 3.5.4 The Captain of the fielding side, in consultation with the Umpire(s) and/or scorers, shall be responsible for ensuring that no bowler exceeds the quota of overs laid down by Rule 3.5.1 or the ECB Fast Bowling Directives (please refer to Rule 3.1.1).

3.6 Scoreboard

- 3.6.1 It shall be the responsibility of the batting side to ascertain the details of the score, wickets and overs from the scorers and to see that the scoreboard is brought up to date with this information at least at the end of every over assuming that no official means of updating the scoreboard is in place.
- 3.6.2 The scoreboard must be unobstructed at all times.

3.7 Ball

3.7.1 All balls will be stamped as a BDCL ball and must be purchased through League arrangements as communicated. Each club shall provide its own balls for use when fielding.

In the Championship, the match ball shall be new and must be:

- Reader Special County Crown
- Reader Sovereign

In all other Divisions, the match ball may not be new and must be one of the following:

- Reader Special County Crown
- · Reader Sovereign
- Reader County Match
- Reader League Special (existing club stock only)
- 3.7.2 The balls (match and spare) to be used must be submitted to and approved by the Umpires and Captains before the toss of the coin when indication shall be given as to which is the first ball.
 - In all Divisions, the spare ball must not be new.
- 3.7.3 If and when the spare or any subsequent ball(s) are brought into play, they shall be brought into play in their present condition.

3.8 Late Start

3.8.1 In the event of a late start, notwithstanding Rule 3.4, the Umpires must intimate to the Captain(s) of the offending team(s) that a complaint will be made to the League Secretary. In the event of no umpires being present, the Captain(s) should make the complaint.

The LMC shall have the power to impose a fine not exceeding £20.00 on the offending club(s), with a deduction of 1 point for each over lost up to a maximum of 5 points.

3.8.2 A minimum of 7 players per side must be present before a game can start. If 8 players are not present within one hour after the scheduled start, the game shall be called off and the Umpire(s) shall report the fact to the LMC. In the event of no umpires being present, the Captain(s) should make the report.

3.9 Wearing Apparel

No players shall be allowed to play unless they are wearing recognised white cricket apparel.

3.10 Boundaries

- 3.10.1 The boundaries on all grounds must have a boundary line clearly defined with a rope or a white line and plastic markers for extra visability.
 - Metal or wooden stakes are not allowed due to the possibile risk of injury to a fielder through their use.
- 3.10.2 No part of any sightscreen should be within the field of play.

To comply with the MCC Laws of Cricket 2017, a rope should be placed on the ground around a sightscreen, with sufficient space to allow for the movement of over and around bowling actions, where an obstruction prevents the sightscreen being positioned outside the normal boundary line.

- 3.10.3 Where the frequent movement of a sightscreen is required the batting side should provide the necessary persons to achieve this with the minimum of delay.
- 3.10.4 Boundary hits shall count as four runs, except for a ball hit full pitch on to, or clear of, the boundary line shall count six runs, unless otherwise mutually agreed by the Captains before the commencement of play.

3.11 Ground Criteria

- 3.11.1 For entry to the Championship, the following ten requirements must be in place by the last day of November in the year/season in which the right to promotion to the Championship has been earned:
- 3.11.1.1 The outfield shall be flat with the grass cut short. The minimum distance to all boundaries should be 35 yards (32 metres).
- 3.11.1.2 There should be sightscreens at each end of effective height and width. They should be clean and white (or eggshell blue).
- 3.11.1.3 Boundaries to be clearly defined with a continuous rope or white line.
- 3.11.1.4 A competent scorer should be available for all matches. The scoring accommodation should be separate, with a manual or electronic system accessible to the scorers.

- 3.11.1.5 Ground equipment and requirements should consist of light and heavy rollers; wheel-on or sheet covers; correct marking of pitches; re-marking of lines between innings; sawdust available.
- 3.11.1.6 Where possible dressing rooms should be adjacent to the playing area, lockable, clean and decorated, of suitable size (100 ft². (9.3m²) minimum), with sufficient seating to accommodate both teams. Wash hand-basins and mirrors should also be available.
- 3.11.1.7 Ladies' and Gents' toilets should be available. They should be clean, convenient and contain hand-basins and towels.
- 3.11.1.8 The umpires' room should be separate and secure with sufficient clothes hanging facilities.
- 3.11.1.9 Club facilities should comply where possible with current Health and Food regulations in order to prepare satisfactory teas at a reasonable cost.
- 3.11.1.10 A first-aid kit and access to a telephone should be available.
- 3.11.2 Should the ten requirements as stated above not be fulfilled by the date stated, promotion to the Championship will not be accepted by the LMC.

3.12 Playing Conditions - Championship and Division 1

- 3.12.1 Any ball, not being a No Ball, that passes the striker's leg stump, irrespective of where that ball pitched, will be called and signalled a wide. It will not be a wide if the ball makes contact with the striker, his person or equipment, or the bat in hand before it passes the line of the stumps, or the ball passes between the striker and the leg stump.
- 3.12.2 A fielding circle shall be marked on the field of play by white plastic or rubber disks:
- 3.12.2.1 The fielding circle shall consist of two semi-circles which shall have as their centre the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The ends of which shall be joined by a straight parallel line.
- 3.12.2.2 The radius of each semi-circle shall be 30 yards (27.4 metres).
- 3.12.2.3 For the duration of the innings, only five fielders are permitted to be outside the field restriction markings at the instant of delivery.
- 3.12.2.4 In the event of an infringement of the above fielding restriction, the Umpire at the striker's end shall call and signal 'No Ball'.

3.13 Child Protection

3.13.1 All clubs must recognise that they have a duty of care towards all young players who are representing the club. This duty of care also extends to Leagues that allow the participation of young players in adult teams and the BDCL has adopted the ECB's 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding

Children' Policy as part of its commitment to ensuring that the game provides a safe, friendly and enjoyable experience for children.

The Policy provides the sport with the tools to ensure that the whole game takes up the challenge of continuously improving the participation conditions for children.

Safeguarding and Child Protection is applicable to all and this must be adhered to.

Safeguarding and Child Protection will not be implemented overnight. It is a long-term process. It is the responsibility of the whole club to implement the appropriate Safeguarding policies and procedures.

- 3.13.2 The duty of care should be interpreted in two ways:
- 3.13.2.1 Not to place a young player in a position that involves an unreasonable risk to that young player, taking account of the circumstances of the match and the relative skill of the player.
- 3.13.2.2 Not to create a situation that places members of the opposing side in a position whereby they cannot play cricket, as they would normally do against adult players.

3.13.3 Every club MUST:

- 3.13.3.1 Nominate a Club Welfare Officer who will advise and ensure that Safeguarding is being adhered to in the club. Full contact details for this person must be supplied to the League along with the Club Information Sheet prior to the start of every season.
- 3.13.3.2 Ensure the following club personnel undertake a Vetting Check (DBS):
 - Coach/Coaches
 - Scorer(s)
 - Colts/Junior Managers
 - Age Group Managers
 - Open Age Group Team Captains (where players under 18 are regularly in the side)
 - **Junior Supervisors**
 - First Aiders
 - Physiotherapists
 - Medical Support
 - Umpires (League Umpires are managed by the BDUA)
- 3 13 3 3 Ensure that all other club personnel not listed above undertake a Vetting Check if they are to have regular/unsupervised or sole access to children.

3.13.4 Every Club Welfare Officer MUST:

- Attend a 'Safeguarding and Protecting Children' course.
- Attend the 'Safe Hands' Course

- Undertake a Vetting Check
- 3.14.5 Further details can be obtained from:
 - · The NCB County Welfare Officer
 - The ECB Website (www.ecb.co.uk/safeguarding/dbs-checks-ecb-vetting)

3.15 Net Run-Rate

- 3.15.1 A team's net run rate is calculated by deducting from the average runs per over scored by that team throughout the competition, the average runs per over scored against that team throughout the competition.
- 3.15.2 In the event of a team being all out in less than its full quota of overs, the calculation of its net run rate shall be based on the full quota of overs to which it would have been entitled and not on the number of overs in which the team was dismissed.
- 3.15.3 Only those matches where results are achieved will count for the purpose of net run rate calculations.

3.16 Average Run-Rate

This calculation is only required for the team batting first and the calculation will be based in the number of overs that the team was scheduled to receive and not on the number actually received.

Therefore, the team batting first's average run rate is calculated by dividing the number of runs scored in its innings by the number of scheduled overs.

4 Individual Awards

4.1 Trophies

The following awards will be awarded annually:

4.1.3 Special Awards

4.2 Qualifications

- 4.2.1 Trophies shall be awarded to players who fulfil the following qualifications:
- 4211 Batting – a minimum of 50% of the scheduled number of innings for the season and 400 runs.
- 4.2.1.2 Bowling - a minimum of 35 wickets.

For average purposes, no record shall be allowed to count after the winning hit has been made; stumps shall be drawn immediately the winning hit is made.

Lowest Average

Should no players fulfil the above qualifications, then the award shall be a awarded to the player with the highest number of runs or the most number of wickets.

4.1.2 The previous season's League Averages will be listed on the league web site where the following criteria are met:

4.1.2.1 Championship and Division 1 a minimum of 300 runs Batting -Divisions 2 & 3 a minimum of 250 runs Divisions 4 and above a minimum of 200 runs

For all Divisions, a minimum average of 20 is required

4122 Bowling -All Divisions a minimum of 20 wickets

4.3 Timescales and Criteria

Outstanding issues with relation to any part of Rule 2.7 must be dealt with by Midnight on the Wednesday following the last match of the season otherwise players from those clubs may not be considered.

5 Qualification and Registration of Players

5.1 Registration

5.1.1 All players shall be registered under a defined category by their details being entered on the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket website and accepted by the Player Registrar.

It is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that players' registrations are in the correct category and have been received by the Player Registrar, along with relevant documentation (where applicable), within the necessary time-scales, with the exception of Category 3 (Exempt) players as indicated under Rule 5.2.4 [final paragraph].

No registration will be accepted whilst a player remains registered with any other club and/or there are any outstanding financial or disciplinary issues.

The BDCL complies fully with the ECB policy outlined in the Non-First Class Rules and Regulations regarding Player Discipline (i.e. any player banned from playing Cricket played under the auspices of ECB, will be banned from the BDCL until such ban is served). This is also compliant with NCB Policy.

The LMC has the discretion to reject any registration.

5.1.2 Any player playing Saturday cricket for a club outside the BDCL is not eligible to play on an occasional basis or must satisfy the requirements of this rule as detailed below. This rule does not apply for clubs that have teams in both BDCL and SNCL.

No player may be registered who plays Saturday cricket for any other club, except a Registered Cricketer with the ECB playing for a First-Class County, or a player who is able to provide evidence of being in full-time Further/Higher Education who is registered within another League within proximity of that registration, for whom a dual registration shall apply.

A player playing for a First-Class County can only play for one Saturday recreational club.

No player shall be registered concurrently with more than one club in the League.

5.1.3 Any club wishing to register an overseas player should ensure that it is aware of, and abides by, the Managed Migration Policy adopted by the ECB in conjunction with the UK Border Agency. The accountability for clubs who wish to become involved in this process should be thoroughly understood and complied with.

Clubs should not employ anyone who does not have the legal right to be in the country or have the legal right to be employed by them and, in case of action being taken it is the Chairman and Club Committee who will be held accountable. The decision of the LMC on any question of qualification shall be full and binding on both the player and the applicant club and in arriving at that decision the following matters together with any other relevant information shall be taken into consideration:

- 5.1.3.1 The nationality of the player.
- 5.1.3.2 Whether the player has a home in the UK.
- 5.1.3.3 Whether the player has or has had permanent full-time employment in the UK.
- 5.1.3.4 The length of any working contract outside the UK.

Clubs will be asked to forward a copy of a player's passport to the Player Registrar and/or such other documentary evidence that the LMC and/or Player Registrar may reasonably require to enable them to make their decision on the question of qualification.

5.1.4 Only players in Category 2 or Category 3 may be remunerated.

The registration of a Category 2 or Category 3 player may be cancelled with the prior agreement of the LMC. A replacement may then be registered and be eligible to play in accordance with the timescales as advised in 5.5.1.2. below.

The names of players registered in Category 2, Category 3, Category 3 (Exempt) and players registered under Category 1 whom are either registered with a First-Class County and overseas players now eligible to play for England due to either residence and/or citizenship will be made publicly available via the BDCL website.

5.1.5 Any Junior Player in Year 8 at School (Under 13 at Midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season) is eligible to play in the BDCL providing explicit written consent from a parent or guardian is obtained before participating in Open Age Cricket. The form submitted must follow the template as supplied by the NCB, which is available via the BDCL website.

Copies of the completed forms are to be submitted to the Player Registrar prior to the registration being submitted.

Therefore, anyone born between 1st September 2005 and 31st August 2006 inclusive is <u>NOT</u> eligible to play in this League <u>UNTIL</u> explicit written consent has been received by the Player Registrar.

Any such breach <u>will</u> result in the player(s) being deemed as unregistered and the sanction advised under Rule 5.6.3 will apply.

5.1.6 Any Junior Player in Year 7 or below (Under 12 at Midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season), under a directive provided by the NCB, <u>cannot</u> play in open age cricket under any circumstances, unless they are listed on the NCB 'Approved List'. This also extends to include players not listed on team sheets but who take to the field of play under <u>any</u> guise.

Therefore, anyone born after 31st August 2006 is <u>NOT</u> eligible to play in this League, unless they have been approved by the NCB.

Any such breach <u>will</u> result in the player(s) being deemed as ineligible. The sanction will be determined by the LMC.

5.1.7 Registration data will be held electronically by the Player Registrar and made available to the ECB and other Leagues as required.

A registration will carry over from season to season and shall be effective until cancelled by the club.

5.1.8 All registrations are time stamped on receipt and acceptance. No unregistered player will be eligible to play. The sanctions for non-compliance shall apply.

All registrations are accepted or rejected on receipt. The submitted time shall apply on acceptance where there are no issues surrounding the registration.

5.2 Categories

Category 1 - Club Player

5.2.1 A player who is an EEA national; AND

They have not, within the 12 months leading up to April 1st immediately before the season in question either (1) played cricket for any Full Member Country outside the EEA at U17 level or above; or (2) played First-Class Cricket in any such Full Member Country except as an overseas cricketer under local rules similar to ECB Regulation 3 (Unqualified Cricketers) of the ECB Regulations Governing the Qualification and Registration of Cricketers, or in any other circumstances approved by the ECB; <u>AND</u>

They make, whenever requested by the ECB, a declaration in the form set out in Annex A to the ECB Regulations Governing the Qualification and Registration of Cricketers.

5.2.2 A player registered with the ECB by a First-Class County Cricket Club, who played for two consecutive seasons immediately prior to their First-Class registration.

They will be re-classified as Category 2 if they play cricket for another recreational club.

- 5.2.3 A Category 1 player subsequently engaged as a Club Professional by their club, or by any other club following a transfer, shall be re-registered under Category 2.
- 5.2.4 A Category 1 player, who becomes a registered cricketer with the ECB after the start of the season, but remains with their original club, shall retain their Category 1 status for the remainder of the season.
- 5.2.5 All other players except those in Category 2, Category 3 or Category 3 (Exempt), subject to acceptance by the Player Registrar.

Category 2 - Club Professional

- 5.2.6 Club Professional; a player, or a player whose family receives remuneration, financial inducement, or benefit in any form from a club, its sponsors, its other players, or any third party acting on the club's behalf. To include:
- 5.2.6.1 Inflated payments for coaching, work on the club's ground or behind the club's bar or any other remuneration where the payments do not represent a fair or proper reward for the hours spent by the player on behalf of the club.
- 5.2.6.2 The provision of equipment without charge or at discounted value.
- 5.2.6.3 Payment of travelling expenses to matches.
- 5.2.6.4 Any other benefits in kind enjoyed by the player or their family where the cost is borne by the club, its sponsors, its other players or any third party on the club's behalf and not by the player himself.
- 5.2.7 County Professional; a player with a First-Class County Cricket Club who is a registered cricketer with the ECB and does not qualify under Category 1.
- 5.2.8 Ex-County Professional; a player who, although not currently registered with the ECB by a First-Class County Cricket Club, has been so registered in either of the previous two years.
- 5.2.9 A player engaged by a County Club on a 'Summer Contract'.

Category 3 – Overseas Player

- 5.2.10 Any players who meet the following criteria shall <u>NOT</u> be deemed to be an Overseas Player:
- 5.2.3.1 They are an EEA national whom meets the criteria for a Category 1 Player.
- 5.2.3.2 They have been resident in England or Wales for the immediately preceding seven consecutive years (for which purposes 'year' shall mean a year ending 1st April and in each 'year' they have spent a minimum of 210 days per year within England or Wales).

Category 3 (Exempt) – Overseas Player (Exempt)

- 5.2.11 A Category 3 player will qualify under Category 3 (Exempt) if they fulfil <u>ALL</u> of the following conditions:
- 5.2.11.1 They have been resident in this country for a period of eighteen months before the date of their request for registration.
- 5.2.11.2 They have not been out of this country for longer than 35 days consecutively or 70 days in total during the previous two years.
- 5.2.11.3 Any remuneration they receive from playing cricket is not their main source of income.
- 5.2.12 Clubs are unable to assign any player to this category. Only the Player Registrar can perform this task and only after receipt and acceptance of all requested documentation.

5.3 Eligibility

5.3.1 Each BDCL club will be allowed to register one Category 2 or Category 3 Player.

Any such player shall be eligible to play for a club's First Eleven, providing that that team plays in Division 4 or above.

- 5.3.1.1 Therefore, NO Category 2 or Category 3 players will be permitted to play for the following NPL clubs in BDCL teams:
 - · Cavaliers & Carrington
 - Cuckney
 - Farnsfield
 - Papplewick & Linby
- 5.3.2 A Category 3 (Exempt) player may be employed by a club as a Category 2 Player.

They will be listed on the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website as a Category 3 (Exempt) player but identified by the Player Registrar as a Category 2. Rule 5.3.1 shall apply.

A Category 3 (Exempt) registered player will become a Category 1 registered player once the residential rules have been satisfied as determined using current ECB regulations.

- 5.3.3 A player who would ordinarily be registered within Category 3, but whose exceptional circumstances, in the opinion of the LMC, merits inclusion within the spirit of this rule, will be permitted to play on a purely recreational basis in Divisions 4 or below, or a club's second XI should they play in a higher division (and the club does not have any additional teams), providing that they do not contravene the second paragraph of Rule 5.2.1 above.
- 5.3.4 On all dates, no player shall be eligible for a team more than one lower than that for which most, or equal most, appearances have been made during the current season.

Additionally, in a fixture played after the after the third Saturday in August, on a Bank Holiday Monday, on a Sunday, or any other date that a more senior team has no fixture, or a fixture cancelled, a player who has only appeared at a higher level than the match being played, or a player who has not played a match within the BDCL during the current season, shall not be eligible to play. This shall not apply to fixtures up until the first Saturday in June.

- 5.3.4.1 The 1st part of the rule applies all season and restricts players from dropping down by more than one team (i.e. 1st to 3rd, 2nd to 4th etc.). Players have to move down 1 team at a time (i.e. 1st to 2nd to 3rd etc.).
- 5.3.4.2 The second part of the rule adds extra restrictions after the 3rd Saturday in August, non-Saturday fixtures, when a higher team has no scheduled fixture and when a higher team has a fixture cancelled. This part of the

rule restricts teams from artificially inflating lower teams when players from higher teams are, or become available.

This part of the rule will not apply until the first weekend of June in order to allow players to 'find their level'. The first part of the rule remains. Clubs found in abuse of this allowance will receive the sanction as advised under Rule 5.6.2.

This part of the rule states that any player that has only played for a higher team is not eligible to play for a lower team. For example, players that have only played for a club's 1st XI would not be eligible to play for any of the clubs other teams. The same applies to players that have only appeared for both a clubs' 1st/2nd XI as they would be ineligible for a clubs' 3rd XI.

Under this part of the rule, where a player has played for a clubs' 1st and 2nd XI they are eligible to continue to play for both the 1st and 2nd XI. Where a player has played for all a club's teams, the player would be eligible to play for any team, as long as they do not go from 1st to 3rd team (would have to go 1st to 2nd to 3rd).

5.3.5 Any such breach may result in the player(s) being deemed as ineligible and the sanction as advised under Rule 5.6.2 may apply.

Clubs are asked to consider the Spirit of Cricket (see rule 7.4.2) and the need to 'Get the Game On' when making a complaint under this rule.

5.4 Movement

- 5.4.1 Category 2 and Category 3 players may not play for more than one BDCL club in a season.
- 5.4.2 No player may play for a club if they have already played Saturday cricket for, or are registered with, another Saturday club, either inside or outside the BDCL, unless application is made to the Player Registrar via the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Registration System for a transfer, unless the player holds a dual registration.

The application must be accompanied by written evidence (email accepted) by the Chair or Secretary of the player's previous club, that there are no outstanding financial issues and/or any disciplinary matters.

Players will be transferred by the Player Registrar on receipt of such written confirmation (email accepted). Neither club needs to remove or submit a registration.

5.4.3 A transfer from a club within the BDCL must not be unreasonably withheld or the request will be dealt with by the LMC.

A club approached by, or seeking to approach, a member of another club to move or transfer, must notify the player's present club prior to entering into

any negotiations with the player concerned. Failure by a club to comply with either will result in a ban on registering any new players other than graduates from its own youth system, the length of ban to be decided by the LMC.

It is to be expected that such transfers are completed within 7 days out of season and 24 hours in season.

5.4.4 No player who has played Saturday cricket for another club, either inside or outside the BDCL, is permitted to play for a club in the BDCL after the third Saturday in August unless a transfer is registered on or before the third Saturday in July.

This rule does not apply if the club that the player is registered to has fully withdrawn from the BDCL during the season.

This rule does not apply to any player in Year 12 or below (Under 17 at Midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season).

Therefore, this rule does not apply to anyone born after 31st August 2001.

Any such breach <u>will</u> result in the player(s) being deemed as ineligible and the sanction as advised under Rule 5.6.2 will apply.

5.4.5 If any player leaves a club who is not transferring to another club, and has no outstanding financial issues or disciplinary matters, his registration should be cancelled by the club without any unnecessary delay.

If any player leaves a club and has outstanding financial issues or disciplinary matters, his registration should remain until such time that those issues are resolved.

5.5 Timescales

- 5.5.1 Clubs will need to ensure that all new players are registered within the following timescales:
- 5.5.1.1 Category 1 Players, who are to be registered to play for clubs in Division 1 and below, and all Cup Competitions, are to have their registrations submitted and accepted prior to the first match they play.

In <u>exceptional circumstances</u>, and at <u>short notice</u>, a player may be registered to play by contacting the BDCL Help Desk <u>BEFORE</u> the start of the match, providing the basic details for the player (full name, address and date of birth). The player must then have their registration submitted and accepted prior to the scorecard being submitted.

- 5.5.1.2 All other players, who are to be registered to play for eligible clubs, are to have their registrations submitted by midnight, on the Thursday prior to the match in which they will first play.
- 5.5.1.3 Any player in the U12 age group and below will not be registered within this League, unless compliant with Rule 5.1.4.

552 It is recommended, in order to reduce the possibility of sanctions that ALL player registrations are submitted (with accompanying documentation where stipulated) and those registrations have been accepted, before any player participates in any match.

It is also recommended that no player born outside of the UK plays until their registration has been accepted by the Player Registrar, unless the club are in possession of documentation which shows the player's entitlement to them being registered under Category 1, and this documentation is sent to the Player Registrar no later than midnight on the day of the match.

Clubs should be aware that it may not be possible to contact the Player Registrar with any queries relating to player registration after 3 hours before the scheduled start time. If any club is unsure about the status of any player or has any gueries, the player should not play.

5.5.3 Using the registration timescales stipulated in Rule 5.5.1. clubs are to be aware that there is no guarantee that a registration will be accepted. It is imperative that the club is aware of the player's past registration history, and whether they may have any outstanding financial issues or disciplinary matters which would delay or deny a player's registration.

When a late registration is submitted and subsequently rejected, this will result in the player(s) being deemed as unregistered and the sanction advised under Rule 5.6.3 will apply.

5.5.4 Using the registration timescales stipulated in Rule 5.5.1.2, clubs are to ensure that the player does not play until their registration is confirmed by the Player Registrar.

5.6 Sanctions and Appeals

- 5.6.1 Clubs found to be in serious breach of regulations in respect with Player Registration will be dealt with at the discretion of the LMC.
- 5.6.2 Clubs playing ineligible player(s) will retain no points from the game and will incur a £10.00 fine for each ineligible player. Their opponents will be awarded the maximum points available.

In the event of both teams playing ineligible player(s), each ineligible player will incur a fine and neither team will benefit from the award of any additional points as a result of its opponents' misdemeanour.

- Further point deductions may be imposed and financial penalties levied at the discretion of the LMC.
- 5.6.3 Clubs playing unregistered player(s) will face a sanction as determined by the IMC
- 5.6.4 Both players and clubs may appeal against registration decisions. Such appeals must be submitted in writing (email accepted) to the League Secretary

within four days of the registration decision. The onus will be placed on the club to clarify the registration position of any of its players prior to their inclusion in a match

5.7 Spirit of the Rule

The reputation of the club is enhanced if it:

- Is open about any approach to a player of another club, or any approach by a player of another club.
- · Does not offer hidden incentives to players.
- · Acts within the spirit, as well as the letter, of this rule.

6 Umpires

The use of light meters is not permitted.

6.1 Umpires' Panel

The BDUA, of which each League Umpire shall be a member, shall maintain a panel of Umpires to which any competent person, whether associated with a member club or not, may be appointed.

6.2 Match Appointments

- 6.2.1 Neutral Umpires shall officiate in all matches.
- 6.2.2 The BDUA shall appoint Umpires from their panel to officiate in all BDCL matches. The appointments will be made by the Umpires' Appointments Secretary.

Appointments will be made prior to the season start, and details of appointments are shown against the fixtures listed in the handbook. A copy will also be sent to Umpires individually, and to all clubs, via email.

All appointments listed are subject to change at the discretion of the Umpires' Appointments Secretary.

- 6.2.3 Should any Umpire be unable to accept his appointment he must immediately notify the clubs and the Umpires' Appointments Secretary who shall appoint a substitute. Except in extreme and unavoidable circumstances, the Umpires' Appointments Secretary must be informed by 10.00am on the day of the match at the very latest.
- 6.2.4 In the event of an Umpire failing to keep his appointment, the home Club Secretary must at once inform the Umpires' Appointment Secretary.
- 6.2.5 In the event of the appointed Umpire(s) failing to attend the match, or their being no Umpires appointed, the Captain of the batting side shall use his best endeavours to appoint substitute Umpires who are senior players. In the event that this is not possible, then the Captain shall use best endeavours to ensure that juniors stand as Umpire at the striker's end only.

- 6.2.6 League appointed umpire/s have full responsibility and sole authority for the conduct of the game and in deciding whether a game should start, be stopped or re-started due to unsatisfactory condition of the ground, weather or light.
- 6.2.7 If no Umpire (or substitute) is available, Captains take full responsibility and sole authority for the conduct of the game. In deciding whether a game should start, be stopped or re-started due to unsatisfactory conditions of the ground, weather or light, every attempt should be made to reach an agreement. Bearing in mind that the safety of players is paramount, should an accident occur which is due to unsatisfactory conditions, then the Captain could be held liable. When in doubt, or if the Captains disagree, then play should not take place. Captains are encouraged to report incidents where the actions of players in terms of their behaviour, language and/or conduct is such, that it is felt that the relevant players should be reported to the LMC under its Code of Conduct.

6.3 Payment of Umpires

- 6.3.1 Each appointed Umpire shall, not later than the end of the interval, be paid match expenses of £45.00, the cost to be shared by both clubs concerned.
 - Should there be no play in the game following the arrival of both teams and the Umpires at the ground, the match expenses of the Umpires shall be £15.00 each, shared by the clubs concerned.
- 6.3.2 Any such expenses shall be paid by the away club if, due to the condition of the ground, no play is possible, and that club has insisted on travelling against the advice of the home club.
- 6.3.3 In the event of a match being cancelled in accordance with Rule 2.5, but the appointed Umpires, not having being told of the cancellation, arrive at the ground in time for the scheduled start time, they shall be paid full match expenses by the home club.
- 6.3.4 In the event of only one registered League Umpire being appointed, or turning up for a match, and that Umpire takes the bowling end throughout the match, they shall be paid full match expenses plus £10.00.
- 6.3.5 There shall be an annual review of the Umpires expenses, carried out by a group constituted by members of the LMC and the BDUA, the findings of which shall be binding.

6.4 Provision of Umpires

Any club wishing to join the League shall provide one Umpire for each team it wishes to enter into the League. All such Umpires should be acceptable to the BDUA and should not be drawn from the existing pool of Umpires.

The LMC appeals to all existing clubs to make every effort to provide at least one Umpire for each team entered in the League.

6.5 Assessment of Umpires

6.5.1 Umpires in <u>ALL</u> Championship and Division 1 matches shall be confidentially assessed by Captains on their performance in every match, by completing the 'Umpires Assessment Form' available via the BDCL website.

All reports submitted are to be received within five days of the match.

A report is not required if a match is cancelled.

A sanction of a 1-point reduction from any team's Divisional total in the relevant season shall be imposed for each match where there is non-compliance with this rule.

6.5.2 Umpires in all other Divisions may be confidentially assessed by Captains of all teams on their performance, by completing the 'Umpires Assessment Form' available via the BDCL website.

6.6 Ground Assessment

Ground conditions, and especially pitches, shall be confidentially assessed by the umpires in consultation who shall submit a report to the League Secretary at their discretion.

7 Extraordinary Matters

7.1 Objection

Any club, having any objection to the conduct of any Umpire, player or team, or any Umpire having any objection to the conduct of any player or team in a League match, must state such objections in writing to the League Secretary who, in matters concerning Umpires, will forward a copy to the Secretary of the BDUA. If the objection is sustained, such Umpire, player or team shall be dealt with at the discretion of the LMC.

The standard of proof required at all Disciplinary Hearings will be achieved by considering the 'Balance of Probability'.

7.2 Protest

- 7.2.1 Any protest shall be lodged with the League Secretary in writing within 4 days following the match.
- 7.2.2 A copy of such protest shall be sent to the club against whom the protest is made and confirmation that this has taken place must be lodged with the League Secretary.
- 7.2.3 Each protest is to be accompanied by a fee of £5.00 which shall be forfeited if in the opinion of the LMC there be no reasonable grounds for such protest, but which shall be refunded if such protest is sustained.

- 7.2.4 The club sustaining the protest may have the contested points added to its total points gained.
- 7.2.5 Clubs when making a protest shall state under which rule the protest is made.

7.3 Disputes

- 7.3.1 Any disputes having reference to the Laws of Cricket shall be referred to the MCC for settlement and their decision shall be final, but in all other matters the decision of the LMC shall be final and binding on all parties concerned.
- 7.3.2 If any question shall arise in connection with the League competition or any cup, tournament, or any other competition organised by the LMC, whether or not the same is dealt with elsewhere, either in these rules or in the rules of any cup, tournament or other competition, the LMC shall have full power to inflict such penalties on both clubs and players as they shall think fit and their decision shall be final and by way of example, and not by definition, such penalties may be either a fine, deduction of points, suspension or expulsion from the League or any combination of them, and the amount of any fine, the number of points deducted or period of any suspension shall be at the absolute discretion of the LMC, whose decision shall be final PROVIDED THAT before any such penalty is imposed:
- 7.3.2.1 The player and/or the Secretary of the club against whom any complaint has been made shall be notified in writing of the complaint and shall be advised that in the event of the complaint being substantiated the Disciplinary Sub-Committee may act in reliance of its powers as contained in this rule.
- 7.3.2.2 Shall be notified of the date, place and time when the Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall consider the complaint and shall be entitled to attend and listen to all evidence given in support of the complaint, to question any person giving any such evidence, to call evidence on their own behalf, and to address the Disciplinary Sub-Committee and comment on all points raised.

7.4 Discipline

League umpires will be following the regulations, laid down by the MCC, which came into effect in October 2017.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND SPIRIT OF CRICKET

7.4.1 Code of Conduct

- 7.4.1.1 The League is committed to maintaining the highest standards of behaviour and conduct. This Code of Conduct incorporates the Spirit of Cricket, as set out below.
- 7.4.1.2 The Captains are responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within the Spirit of Cricket as well as within the Laws.

- 7.4.1.3 Players and team officials must at all times accept the Umpire's decision. Players must not show dissent at the Umpire's decision or react in a provocative or disapproving manner towards another player or spectator.
- 7.4.1.4 Players and team officials shall not intimidate, assault or attempt to intimidate or assault an Umpire, another player or spectator.
- 7.4.1.5 Players and team officials shall not use crude and/or abusive language (known as 'sledging') nor make offensive gestures or hand signals nor deliberately distract an opponent.
- 7.4.1.6 Players and team officials shall not make abusive comments nor indulge in abusive actions against fellow players, officials, members or supporters because of their perceived membership in a certain social group. Examples of such groups include but are not limited to: racial group, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity or gender identity. Clubs must operate an active open-door membership policy whist respecting player qualification regulations and welcome players/members irrespective or their social group.
- 7.4.1.7 Players and team officials shall not use or in any way be concerned in the use or distribution of illegal drugs.
- 7.4.1.8 Clubs must take adequate steps to ensure the good behaviour of their members and supporters towards players and Umpires.
- 7.4.1.9 Participants shall not make any public or media comment that is prejudicial or detrimental to the interests or reputataion of other participants or the game of cricket in general. In this instance, media shall include (but not necessarily be limited to) press, radio, television, external websites, Member Club websites, social networking sites and club match programmes. Nothing in this provision shall prevent any comment which constitutes honest opinion in regard to cricketing matters and which is made in a fair and respectful manner.

7.4.2 Spirit of Cricket

Cricket is a game that owes much of its unique appeal to the fact that it should be played not only within its Laws but also within the Spirit of the Game. Any action which is seen to abuse this spirit causes injury to the game itself. The major responsibility for ensuring the spirit of fair play rests with the Captains.

There are two Laws which place the responsibility for the team's conduct firmly on the Captain.

7.4.2.1 Responsibility of Captains

The Captains are responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within the Spirit of the Game as well as within the Laws.

7.4.2.2 Player's conduct

In the event of a player failing to comply with instructions by an Umpire, or criticising by word or action the decisions of an Umpire, or showing dissent, or generally behaving in a manner which might bring the game into disrepute, the Umpire concerned shall in the first place report the matter to the other Umpire and to the player's Captain, and instruct the latter to take action.

7.4.3 Fair and Unfair Play

According to the Laws the Umpires are the sole judges of fair and unfair play. The Umpires may intervene at any time and it is the responsibility of the Captain to take action where required.

7.4.3.1 The Umpires are authorised to intervene in cases of:

- Time wasting
- Damaging the pitch
- Dangerous and unfair bowling
- Tampering with the ball
- Any other action that they consider to be unfair

7.4.3.2 The Spirit of the Game involves <u>RESPECT</u> for:

- Your opponents
- Your own team Captain and team
- The role of the Umpires
- The game and its traditional values

7.4.3.3 It is against the Spirit of the Game:

- To dispute an Umpire's decision by word, action or gesture
- To direct abusive language towards an opponent or Umpire
- To indulge in cheating or any sharp practice, for instance:
 - To appeal knowing that the batsman is not out
 - To advance towards an Umpire in an aggressive manner when appealing
 - To seek to distract an opponent either verbally or by harassment with persistent clapping or unnecessary noise under the guise of enthusiasm and motivation of one's own side

7.4.3.4 **Violence**

There is no place for any act of violence on the field of play.

7.4.3.5 **Players**

Captains and Umpires together set the tone for the conduct of a cricket match. Every player is expected to make an important contribution to this.

7.4.4 Failure to comply with the provisions of Paragraph 1 may lead to disciplinary action, irrespective of an alleged breach being related to a match not under the jurisdiction of the League.

7.5 PROCEDURE

- 7.5.1 Any alleged breach of discipline within Levels 1 to 4 of the Laws and any other alleged breach of the conduct, shall be reported in writing, only on the prescribed Disciplinary Report Form, and sent to the League Secretary within a time limit of 5 days from the date of the alleged incident.
- 7.5.2 Any such report received by the League Secretary must be referred to the Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee, who will consider the complaint and the evidence as soon as practicable and make a decision on one of the following three options:
- 7.5.2.1 No further action will be taken against a player and/or the club officials.
- 7.5.2.2 From the evidence in the report, the matter is suitable to be dealt with via the League's Accumulated Offences Process. Therefore, notification to a player and the club, of three Accumulated Offences within the same current season, will result in a ban from all forms of cricket for three weeks (a week is Saturday to Friday inclusive). Accumulated Offences gained or reported during the last two games in any one season, which cannot count as one of the three in the same current season, will be carried into the following season as active sanctions or breaches.
- 7.5.2.3 From the evidence contained within the report, the matter is more serious and warrants a full Disciplinary Hearing of the League Disciplinary Sub-Committee, which shall be convened and arranged by the League Secretary on behalf of the Chairman.
- 7.5.3 Accumulated Offences will not be considered, where the victim of the alleged incident is a young person who, due to age, is a player who is competing under the 'YOUNG PLAYER REGULATIONS' and the relevant safeguarding regulations.
- 7.5.4 The decision of the Chairman of the League Disciplinary Sub-Committee as to which of the above options will be implemented is final and binding.

7.6 DISCIPLINARY HEARING

- 7.6.1 The Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall convene a hearing as soon as practicable and in any event within 21 days of the decision to refer. Any adjournments may be granted at the discretion of the Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.
- 7.6.2 In any case which is referred for a Disciplinary Hearing, at least seven days' notice in writing of the hearing and of the offence(s) alleged shall be given to the player, or in the case of a club, its Secretary.

- 7.6.3 The player and Captain shall be required to attend the hearing (in the case of a club by its Secretary or other official). In addition, the player can be supported by a club colleague and to call witnesses.
- 7.6.4 The hearing shall be conducted by the Disciplinary Sub-Committee of the League which shall consist of not less than three persons.

7.7 LEVELS and PENALTIES

- 7.7.1 The umpires shall act on any unacceptable conduct. Four levels of offence and the corresponding actions by the umpires are identified as Level 1, Level 2, Level 3 and Level 4 Offences in Law 42.2 to 42.5.
- 7.7.2 If either umpire considers that the conduct of a player, at any time during the match, is unacceptable, the umpire concerned shall call and signal 'Dead Ball'. This call may be delayed until the umpire is satisfied that it will not disadvantageously affect the non-offending team.
- 7.7.3 The umpire concerned shall report the matter to the other umpire and together they shall decide whether there has been a breach of the disciplinary code. If so, they shall determine into which of the levels of conduct it falls, as set out in the Level 1 to Level 4 Offences below, and then apply the appropriate sanction.
- 7.7.4 If the offence is committed by a batsman, the umpires shall summon the offending player's captain to the field. Solely for the purpose of this Law, the batsman at the wicket may not deputise for his captain.

7.8 Level 1 Offences and action by the umpires

- 7.8.1 Any of the following actions by a player shall constitute a Level 1 offence:
- 7.8.1.1 Wilfully mistreating any part of the cricket ground, equipment or implements used in the match.
- 7.8.1.2 Dissent at an umpire's decision by word or action.
- 7.8.1.3 Using language that, in the circumstances is obscene, offensive or insulting.
- 7.8.1.4 Making an obscene gesture.
- 7.8.1.5 Appealing excessively.
- 7.8.1.6 Advancing towards the umpire in an aggressive manner whilst appealing.
- 7.8.1.7 Any other misconduct which is, in the opinion of the umpires, equivalent to a Level 1 offence.
- 7.8.2 If such an offence is committed, 7.8.2.1 to 7.8.2.6 shall be implemented as appropriate, according to whether it is the first offence at any Level.
- 7.8.2.1 The umpire shall call time if necessary.
- 7.8.2.2 Together the umpires shall summon and inform the offending player's captain that an offence at this Level has occurred.

- 7.8.2.3 If the Level 1 offence is the first offence, at any Level, by that team the umpire shall:
 - Issue a first and final warning that shall apply to all members of that team for the remainder of the match.
 - Warn the offending player's captain that any further Level 1 offence, by any member of his/her team, shall result in the award of 5 Penalty Runs to the opposing team.
- 7.8.2.4 If the Level 1 offence follows an offence, at any Level, by that team, the umpire shall award 5 Penalty runs to the opposing team.
- 7.8.2.5 As soon as practicable the umpires shall call Play.
- 7.8.2.6 The umpires shall report the occurrence as soon as possible after the match to the League Secretary who will take any further action that is considered appropriate against the captain, any other individuals concerned and, if appropriate, the team.

783 Penalties

Offences at this Level will receive a ban from all cricket of at least 2 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points.

7.9 Level 2 Offences and action by the umpires

- 7.9.1 Any of the following actions by a player shall constitute a Level 2 offence:
- 7.9.1.1 Showing serious dissent at an umpire's decision by word or action.
- 7.9.1.2 Making inappropriate or deliberate physical contact with another player.
- 7.9.1.3 Throwing the ball at a player, umpire or another person in an inappropriate and dangerous manner.
- 7.9.1.4 Using language or gesture to another player, umpire, team official or spectator that, in the circumstances, is obscene or of a seriously insulting nature.
- 7.9.1.5 Any other misconduct, the nature of which is, in the opinion of the umpires, equivalent to a Level 2 offence.
- 7.9.2 If such an offence is committed, 7.9.2.1 to 7.9.2.6 shall be implemented as appropriate, according to whether it is the first offence at any Level.
- 7.9.2.1 The umpire shall call time if necessary.
- 7.9.2.2 Together the umpires shall summon and inform the offending player's captain that an offence at this Level has occurred.
- 7.9.2.3 The umpires shall award 5 Penalty Runs to the opposing team.
- 7.9.2.4 The umpire shall warn the offending player's captain that any future Level 1 offence by any member of his/her team shall result in the award of 5 Penalty Runs to the opposing team.
- 7.9.2.5 As soon as practicable the umpires shall call Play.

7.9.2.6 The umpires shall report the occurrence as soon as possible after the match to the League Secretary who will take any further action that is considered appropriate against the captain, any other individuals concerned and, if appropriate, the team.

7.9.3 Penalties

Offences at this Level will receive a ban from all cricket of at least 4 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points.

7.10 Level 3 Offences and action by the umpires

- 7.10.1 Either of the following actions by a player shall constitute a Level 3 offence:
- 7.10.1.1 Intimidating an umpire by language and gesture.
- 7.10.1.2 Threatening to assault a player or any other person except an umpire.
- 7.10.2 If such an offence is committed, 7.10.2.1 to 7.10.2.6 shall be implemented as appropriate, according to whether it is the first offence at any Level.
- 7.10.2.1 The umpire shall call time if necessary.
- 7.10.2.2 Together the umpires shall summon and inform the offending player's captain that an offence at this Level has occurred.
- 7.10.2.3 The umpire shall direct the captain to remove the offending player immediately from the field of play. The player shall be suspended for one fifth of the number of overs allocated to the innings at the commencement of the match.

Any balls remaining in the over in progress at the time of suspension shall not count towards the overs for which the player is suspended. The calculation of the number of overs a player shall be removed from the field of play is determined using the following table:

SO	LS
36<39	8
40-49	9
50-00	10

Note: SO - scheduled number of overs to be bowled at the commencement of the match

LS - Length of suspension

- If the offending player is a fielder, no substitute shall be allowed for him/her. The offending player may return to the field of play after serving the period of suspension and may bowl immediately if in accordance with the ECB Fast Bowling Directives as laid out in Rule 3.1.4.
- If a bowler is suspended mid-over, then that over must be bowled by a different bowler, who shall not have bowled the previous over nor shall he/she bowl the next over (and must be eligible to bowl in

accordance with the ECB Fast Bowling Directives as laid out in Rule 3.1.4).

- If the offending player is a not out batsman, he/she shall be replaced
 by another member of the team. The offending player may return
 after having served the period of suspension only at the fall of a
 wicket. If no batsman is available to bat during a batsman's
 suspension, the innings is completed. If the offending player does
 not continue his/her innings for whatever reason, he/she is to be
 recorded as 'Retired Not Out'.
- If the offending player is a dismissed member of the batting side the
 period of suspension will not start until the beginning of the next
 innings. Furthermore, in these circumstances, the offending player
 shall not act as a runner during the innings when he/she was
 suspended.
- Any overs remaining to be served from a suspension shall be carried forward to the next and subsequent innings of the match. A partover at the end of the innings shall not count the overs for which a player is suspended.
- 7.10.2.4 The umpire shall warn the offending player's captain that any future Level 1 offence by any member of his/her team shall result in the award of 5 Penalty Runs to the opposing team.
- 7.10.2.5 As soon as is practicable the umpire shall:
 - Award 5 Penalty Runs to the opposing team.
 - Signal the Level 3 penalty to the scorers.
 - Call Play.
- 7.10.2.6 The umpires shall report the occurrence as soon as possible after the match to the League Secretary who will take any further action that is considered appropriate against the captain, any other individuals concerned and, if appropriate, the team.

7.10.3 Penalties

Offences at this Level will receive a ban from all cricket of at least 6 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points.

7.11 Level 4 Offences and action by the umpires

- 7.11.1 Any of the following actions by a player shall constitute a Level 4 offence:
- 7.11.1.1 Intimidating an umpire by language and gesture
- 7.11.1.2 Threatening to assault a player or any other person except an umpire.
- 7.11.1.3 Physically assaulting a player or any other person.
- 7.11.1.4 Committing any other act of violence.

- 7.11.2 If such an offence is committed, 7.11.2.1 to 7.11.2.6 shall be implemented as appropriate, according to whether it is the first offence at any Level.
- 7.11.2.1 The umpire shall call time if necessary.
- 7.11.2.2 Together the umpires shall summon and inform the offending player's captain that an offence at this Level has occurred.
- 7.11.2.3 The umpire shall direct the captain to remove the offending player immediately from the field of play for the remainder of the match and shall apply the following:
 - If the offending player is a fielder, no substitute shall be allowed for him/her. He/she is to be recorded as 'Retired Out' at the commencement of any subsequent innings in which his/her team is the batting side.
 - If a bowler is suspended mid-over, then that over must be bowled by a different bowler, who shall not have bowled the previous over nor shall he/she bowl the next over (and must be eligible to bowl in accordance with the ECB Fast Bowling Directives as laid out in Rule 3.1.4).
 - If the offending player is a batsman, he/she is to be recorded 'Retired Out' in the current innings, unless he/she has been dismissed under any of Laws 32-39, and at the commencement of any subsequent innings in which his/her team is the batting side. If no further batsman is available to bat, the innings is completed.
- 7.11.2.5 As soon as is practicable the umpire shall:
 - Award 5 Penalty Runs to the opposing team.
 - Signal the Level 4 penalty to the scorers.
 - Call Play.
- 7.11.2.6 The umpires shall report the occurrence as soon as possible after the match to the League Secretary who will take any further action that is considered appropriate against the captain, any other individuals concerned and, if appropriate, the team.
- 7.11.3 Penalties

Offences at this Level will receive a ban from all cricket of at least 10 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points.

7.12 Captains refusing to remove a player from the field of play

- 7.12.1 If a captain refuses to carry out an instruction under Level 3 or Level 4 offences, the umpires shall invoke Law 16.3 (umpires awarding the match).
- 7.12.2 If both captains refuse to carry out instructions under level 3 or Level 4 offences in respect of the same incident, the umpires shall instruct the players

to leave the field. The match is not concluded as in Law 12.9 (Conclusion of match) and there shall be no result as in Law 16 (The result).

7.13 Additional points relating to Level 3 and Level 4 offences

- 7.13.1 If a player, whilst acting as wicket-keeper, commits a Level 3 or Level 4 offence, Law 24.12 shall not apply, meaning that only a nominated player may act as wicket-keeper, even if another fielder becomes ill or injured and is replaced by a substitute.
- 7.13.2 A nominated player who has a substitute or runner will also suffer the penalty for any Level 3 or Level 4 offence committed by the substitute or runner and will be reported under Level 3 offence or Level 4 offence.
- 7.13.3 The following signals are for Levels 3 and 4 of the player conduct offences. Each signal has two parts, both of which should be acknowledged separately by the scorers:

7.13.3.1 Level 3 conduct:

- Part 1 by putting one arm out to the side of the body and repeatedly raising it and lowering it.
- Part 2 by raising both hands, all fingers spread, to shoulder height, palms facing towards the scorers.

7.13.3.2 Level 4 conduct:

- Part 1 by putting one arm out to the side of the body and repeatedly raising it and lowering it.
- Part 2 by raising an index finger, held at shoulder height, to the side of the body.

7.14 Further Information

- 7.14.1 The conduct listed in Levels 1 to 4 above cannot be considered to be exhaustive. Where any alleged breach falls outside the conduct above, whether on or off the field, the disciplinary committee shall determine the appropriate Level with reference to the following factors:
- 7.14.1.1 The level of harm potentially caused to the interests or reputation of the League or the game of cricket in general.
- 7.14.1.2 Whether any alleged language is used or gesture made which may offend, insult, humiliate, intimidate, disparage, threaten or vilify another person on the basis of that person's (or that person's perceived) age, race, religion, sexual orientation, colour, descent or national or ethnic origins.
- 7.14.1.3 Wwhether it is alleged that any conduct was intended to cause physical harm to another person, or such harm was foreseeable.
- 7.14.1.4 Whether the alleged behaviour breached the Child Protection Code.

- 7 14 1 5 Any other factor relevant to the particular circumstances of the alleged behaviour.
- 7.14.2 In addition, where a Club, individual or their representative and witnesses behave inappropriately or fail to respect the formality at any level of hearing, the Disciplinary and Appeals Sub-Committees reserve the right to impose further corrective actions or penalties as they see fit.
- 7.14.3 Decisions of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee (a finding that a complaint is proved or not proved or a decision or penalty) shall be by majority vote; where necessary the Panel Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 7.14.4 Where any player has been found guilty of disciplinary offences in the same season on two or more occasions, both the player and his/her club shall be fined a sum not exceeding £50 by the LMC. An additional ban from playing of a further 2 weeks shall be imposed upon that player at each separate subsequent disciplinary hearing, in addition to any penalties imposed by the Disciplinary Sub-Committee on each occasion.

A ban from ALL CRICKET shall remain in place, until both fines (club and player) have been satisfactorily paid to the League Treasurer.

7.15 Appeals Procedure

- 7.15.1 A player or club found guilty of a Disciplinary offence will have the right of appeal to the Appeals Sub-Committee. Notice of Appeal stating whether the appeal is against the finding, or is against the penalties imposed, and setting out the grounds must be given in writing to the League Secretary within seven days of the decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee, together with a deposit of £50.00.
- 7.15.2 If Notice of Appeal is given the penalty shall not take effect pending the hearing of the Appeal.
- 7.15.3 The Appeal shall be by way of re-hearing before a different Committee. The composition of the Committee shall be at the discretion of the Chairman and shall consist of not less than three persons. The player or club shall have the same rights of attendance and representation, and to call witnesses as they had before the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.
- 7.15.4 The Appeals Sub-Committee may confirm, vary or reverse the decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee and it shall have the power to increase the penalty. Decisions of the Appeals Sub-Committee shall be by majority vote, where necessary, the Chairman having a casting vote.
- 7.15.5 The Appeals Sub-Committee shall have the power, where they consider an appeal to be without merit, to order the deposit to be forfeited to the League.
- 7.15.6 The decision of the Appeals Sub-Committee or, if no appeal, of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee, shall be final and binding.

7.16 Fines

Any decision by the LMC ordering any club to pay Umpires' fees or expenses, or any other monies must be carried out by the club concerned within 21 days from the date the club received notification from the League Secretary, failing which a fine of £5.00 will be charged.

7.17 Unforeseen Matters

Any matters which may arise which are not provided for under these rules (except those relating to the laws of the game) shall be dealt with by the LMC whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties concerned.

8 Instructions to Clubs

8.1 The Pitch

- 8.1.1 The pitch must be properly prepared before the toss and shall not be changed during the match unless it becomes unfit for play, and then only with the consent of both Captains.
- 8.1.2 No match may be played on an artificial pitch.
- 8.1.3 The wickets should be pitched so that the centre of each stump is in line with the back edge of the bowling crease.
- 8.1.4 Dots should be placed on either side of the pitch, in line with the return creases and 5ft (1.52m), in front of the popping creases, to indicate the start of the danger area of the bowler's follow through.
- 8.1.5 Marks should be placed on the bowling crease, 1ft (0.3m) either side of the middle stump, to indicate, in conjunction with Rule 8.1.4, the restricted area.
- 8.1.6 Prior to the toss of the coin the Captain of the home team should indicate to his opposite number the roller(s) available for use between innings.
- 8.1.7 Between innings the ends of the pitch must be swept and the creases remarked as required.

8.2 The Square

- 8.2.1 Adequate repair of bowler's foot holes on used pitches should be carried out during the preparation of the ground.
- 8.2.2 There must be no practice on the pitch at any time on the day of the match.
- 8.2.3 There shall not be any practice on the rest of the square at any time on the day of the match, except with the approval of the Umpires.

If practice is allowed on the outfield between the call of 'Play' and 'Time', only fielders can participate in such practice. No ball other than the match ball is to be used for this practice.

8.3 Hospitality

- 8.3.1 Changing facilities, preferably separate from the players' dressing rooms, should be available for the Umpires and should be secure, clean and tidy.
 - Clean white coats should be available.
- 8.3.2 Each club must have adequate sanitary accommodation on the ground and a complete first-aid kit available in the pavilion.
- 8.3.3 The home club should provide twelve teas for the visitors who should pay for eleven, the twelfth being a complimentary tea for the scorer, and a complimentary tea for each Umpire.
 - The LMC requests that the charge levied on the visiting team should not exceed £33.00.

8.4 Personnel

- 8.4.1 If, at the toss of the coin, a player or players have not arrived at the ground the Captain should inform his opposite numbers and the Umpires giving the name of any missing player, who may not therefore be changed without the consent of the opposing Captain.
- 8.4.2 An incoming batsman should pass an outgoing batsman on the field of play.
- 8.4.3 In the case of illness or injury during the game a substitute, or a runner, is allowed of right; and at the discretion of the Umpires for other wholly acceptable reasons.
 - It is a sporting gesture for the batting side to offer a substitute to the fielding side when the latter has nobody available.

8.5 Insurance

- 8.5.1 Each club is strongly recommended to ensure that it has Public Liability, including employer's Liability, Insurance cover for a minimum of £2,000,000.
- 8.5.2 Clubmark Accredited Clubs, or those wishing to gain Clubmark Accreditation, will need to possess the minimum amount as specified by the ECB.

8.6 Scorers

8.6.1 In all games, each team shall provide their own competent, non-playing scorer.

If a team fails to provide a scorer, the scoring duties shall be provided by the players, when available. In instances where no player is available to score due to fielding duties, the Captain is to ensure that the scorer is aware of all Players names where necessary.

It is the responsibility of both teams to ensure that all the information required is provided in order to comply with Rule 2.7.

- 8.6.2 The scorers must accept the umpire's signals and instructions and, though it is no part of their duty to dictate to the umpires, mutual consultation to clear up doubtful points is, at all times, permissible and welcome.
- 8.6.3 The scorers must give the bowler's name if the batsman is out bowled, caught, stumped, leg before wicket or hit wicket.

The scorers must give the fielder's name if the batsman is out caught, stumped or run out.

- 8.6.4 If a batsman is caught, no run is scored, even though the batsman might have crossed but, if a batsman is run out attempting a second or subsequent run, the completed run(s) count.
- 8.6.5 The one run penalty for a no-ball or wide is in addition to any other runs scored. All runs scored off no-balls and wides, including the penalty run itself, are to be debited against the bowler. If, from a no-ball, the batsman plays the ball with his bat, runs which result will be credited to him, except for the one penalty run which will be a no-ball extra. If the batsman does not play the ball with his bat all runs will be no-ball extras.

NO-BALL

e.g. O = one run penalty

3 = one run penalty <u>plus</u> three runs scored off the bat

WIDE

e.g. + = one run penalty

+ = one run penalty <u>plus</u> one wide extra

8.6.6 The total runs scored by all batsmen plus all runs scored as no-balls or wides (the bowling extras) must equal the total runs conceded by all the bowlers.

The total runs conceded by all the bowlers plus all runs scored by byes, leg byes and penalty runs to the batting side (the fielding extras) must equal the total innings score.

The summary section of the bowling analysis should show the number of noballs and wides bowled as opposed to how many runs have been scored off the no-balls and wides.

8.6.7 During the progress of the game both scorers should frequently check the total to ensure that the score books agree; the home club scorer should complete the 'BDCL Result Sheet' as the game proceeds.

When recording details of the first innings of a match on the 'BDCL Result Sheet' before the end of the game, record any penalty runs, the total extras and the innings total in pencil. These are provisional and will have to be

amended if, during the second innings of the match, any 5 run penalties are awarded to the team which batted first.

8.7 Completing of online scorecards via the ECB Play-Cricket Network

Where scorecards are entered via electronic means (e.g. Laptop using TCS), clubs need to ensure the validity of the uploaded data.

Where scorecards are not entered, incomplete or contain errors, Rule 2.7.5 will be applied.

To enter a result, log onto your club's ECB Play-Cricket Website as an Administrator user and enter the 'Administration' pages. Using the 'Day to Day' button at the top and the 'Result' button on the left hand side, locate the relevant fixture using the search field and once located, click on the icon under 'Edit Result'.

8.7.1 SUMMARY TAB

- 8.7.1.1 In the first section, check the information for the 'Date', 'Start Time' and 'Ground' is correct.
- 8.7.1.2 In the second section, enter the following:
 - The name of the officials (Umpire 1/Umpire 2) if applicable)
 - The name of the scorers (Scorer 1/Scorer 2)
- 8.7.1.3 In the third section, enter the following:
 - The result
 - · Confirmation of the home team
 - Confirmation of which team batted first
 - Confirm which team won the toss
- 8.7.1.4 For the home team:
 - The total number of runs scored
 - The number of wickets fallen (where teams have less than 11 players and are all out, this will be the actual number of wickets fallen)
 - The number of overs and balls faced
 - Whether the innings was 'declared'
 - The number of penalty points gained (usually '0')
 - The number of batting points gained (0-4)
 - The number of bowling points gained (0-4)

Where a match was conceded or cancelled, bonus points gained will be ${\bf '0'}.$

8.7.1.5 For the away team:

- The total number of runs scored
- The number of wickets fallen (where teams have less than 11 players and are all out, this will be the actual number of wickets fallen)
- The number of overs and balls faced
- Whether the innings was 'declared'
- The number of penalty points gained (usually '0')
- The number of batting points gained (0-4)
- The number of bowling points gained (0-4)

Where a match was conceded or cancelled, bonus points gained will be '0'.

8.7.1.6 Under 'Highlights', teams can enter in any highlights of the match which they deem appropriate, and also leave any additional information for the LMC.

To move onto the next section, click 'Save'.

8.7.2 HOME TEAM TAB

- 8.7.2.1 Enter the players that played for the Home Team, from the registered player list.
- 8.7.2.2 Indicate which players were the Captain and Wicket Keeper.
- 8.7.2.3 List the players in batting order.
- 8.7.2.4 Where a player is not listed, forward the name, match and date to the Player Registrar by email to registrar@bdcl.org.uk.

To move onto the next section, click 'Save'.

8.7.3 AWAY TEAM TAB

- 8.7.3.1 Enter the players that played for the Away Team, from the registered player list.
- 8.7.3.2 Indicate which players were the Captain and Wicket Keeper.
- 8.7.3.3 It is best practice to list the players in batting order.
- 8.7.3.4 Where a player is not listed, forward the name, match and date to the Player Registrar by email to registrar@bdcl.org.uk.

To move onto the next section, click 'Save'.

8.7.4 FIRST INNINGS SCORECARD TAB

8.7.4.1 In the first section:

- Complete the First Innings batting scorecard in full, including the names of fielders that took catches and were responsible for run outs.
- Complete the extras fields
- Complete the 'penalties from other innings' field
- The Innings total is acquired from the score input on the 'Summary Result Page'. Ensure the scorecard tallies with this total.
- 8.7.4.2 In the second section, enter the score and batsman details at the fall of each wicket.
- 8.7.4.3 In the third section.
 - Complete the First Innings bowling analysis in full, the number of wickets taken by each bowler will be auto filled from the batting scorecard.
 - The total number of overs and balls bowled and wickets fallen must equal those entered on the 'Summary Result Page'. Ensure the scorecard tallies with this total.
 - Ensure that Runs + Byes + Leg Byes + PR + Penalties from other Innings = Total.
- 8.7.4.4 To move onto the next section, click 'Save'. Any errors will be displayed by a pop-up box. Review the information provided, click 'Cancel' then correct before proceeding.

8.7.5 THE SECOND INNINGS SCORECARD TAB

- 8.7.5.1 In the first section:
 - Complete the First Innings batting scorecard in full, including the names of fielders that took catches and were responsible for run outs.
 - Complete the extras fields
 - Complete the 'penalties from other innings' field
 - The Innings total is acquired from the score input on the 'Summary Result Page'. Ensure the scorecard tallies with this total.
- 8.7.5.2 In the second section, enter the score and batsman details at the fall of each wicket.
- 8.7.5.3 In the third section.

- Complete the First Innings bowling analysis in full, the number of wickets taken by each bowler will be auto filled from the batting scorecard.
- The total number of overs and balls bowled and wickets fallen must equal those entered on the 'Summary Result Page'. Ensure the scorecard tallies with this total.
- Ensure that Runs + Byes + Leg Byes + PR + Penalties from other Innings = Total.
- 8.7.5.4 To view the 'Result', click 'Save'. Any errors will be displayed by a popup box. Review the information provided, click 'Cancel' then correct before proceeding.

8.7.6 VIEW THE RESULT

The summary tab is now displayed, along with separate tabs for each innings. Review the information entered, noting that any information shown with red text indicates an error. Review and correct on the relevant tab, before exiting.

8.8 Completing the BDCL Team Card via the ECB Play-Cricket Network

The BDCL Match Team Card will need to be uploaded manually via the Clubs ECB Play-Cricket Site, against the relevant match.

Where the BDCL Match Team Card is not uploaded, incomplete or contain errors, Rule 2.7.5 will be applied.

8.8.1 CREATE A DIGITAL FORMAT OF THE BDCL MATCH TEAM CARD

In order to upload the BDCL Match Team Card, either:

- 8.8.1.1 Scan the paper copy of the BDCL Match Team Card to .jpg or .pdf file format, using a suitable device, OR;
- 8.8.1.2 Photograph the paper copy of the BDCL Match Team Card using a suitable device (i.e. smartphone).

8.8.2 UPLOAD THE BDCL MATCH TEAM CARD

- 8.8.2.1 Log onto your club's ECB Play-Cricket Website as an Administrator user and enter the 'Administration' pages.
- 8.8.2.2 Using the 'Day to Day' button at the top and the 'Result' button on the left hand side, locate the relevant fixture using the search field
- 8.8.2.3 Click on the icon under 'Edit Report'.
- 8.8.2.4 Scroll down and click either 'Choose File' or 'Browse' depending on your browser.
- 8.8.2.5 Locate the digital format of the BDCL Match Team Card and click 'Open'.
- 8.8.2.6 Click 'Save and Activate Match Report', or 'Save' depending on your browser.

Rules and Playing Conditions apply with the exceptions/additions as varied hereunder.

Rules & Playing Conditions

1 Title

The title of the Competition shall be the John J. Mallen t20 Trophy.

2 Entry

- 2.1 The competition is open to all member clubs.
- 2.2 Each member club may enter one team.
- 2.3 Member clubs are required to submit their application to the League Secretary prior to the LMC meeting in January of each year.
- 2.4 Withdrawal after the draw has been made will be treated as non-fulfilment of fixture and the club will be fined £25.00 for each match affected and will be immediately eliminated from the competition. The game shall be counted as a win for their opponents.

3 Organisation

3.1 Constitution

- 3.1.1 The draw for the competition will be made by the LMC at its January meeting.
- 3.1.2 Teams will be drawn in Groups and will play each other team once on a tournament basis. In exceptional circumstances, teams may play each other twice. Each team shall play a minimum of two matches.
- 3.1.3 In Group Matches, two points shall be awarded for a win and no points for a loss. Each match will result in a win or a loss.
 - The top four placed teams will go forward to the Finals Day.
- 3.1.4 On Finals day the matches will be straight knock-out matches. The winner will proceed to the next round, or in the final, will be crowned winners.
 - The overall winner of the competition will go forward to the Nottinghamshire Feeder League t20 Challenge Match to play the winner of the South Nottinghamshire Cricket League t20 competition.

The winner of the Nottinghamshire Feeder League t20 Challenge Match will go forward to the Nottinghamshire Premier League t20 Finals day, the winner of which will enter the ECB National Club t20 competition.

3.2 Group Placings

- 3.2.1 The group placings shall be determined by the following criteria, taken in order:
- 3.2.1.1 The total number of points.
- 3.2.1.2 The net run rate over all completed matches.
- 3.2.1.3 The toss of a coin.

3.3 Awards

- 3.3.1 The John J. Mallen Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the competition.
- 3.3.2 The Harold Pope Trophy will be awarded to the Man of the Match in the Final.

4 Qualification and Registration of Players

- 4.1 No player who has played for a club in the competition is eligible to play for another club in the competition in the same season.
- 4.2 A player with a Premier League Club shall not be eligible if he has played the majority of his Saturday cricket in that League during the current season.
- 4.3 A player registered under Category 2 or Category 3 shall be eligible to play.
- 4.4 Clubs playing ineligible or unregistered player(s) in group matches will retain no points from the game and will incur a £25.00 fine for each ineligible or unregistered player. Their opponents will be awarded the maximum points available.
- 4.5 Clubs playing ineligible or unregistered players(s) in the semi-final or final will be expelled from the competition and will incur a £25.00 fine for each ineligible or unregistered player. The match will be awarded to their opponents.
- 4.6 In the event of both teams playing any ineligible or unregistered player(s), the matter will be referred to the LMC. Any fines levied shall stand in all circumstance.
- 4.7 The overall winner of the competition will need to consult the rules and regulations regarding Category 2, Category 3 and Category 3 (Exempt) players prior to playing in the Nottinghamshire Feeder League t20 Challenge Match against the winner of the South Nottinghamshire Cricket League t20 competition and if successful, the Nottinghamshire Premier League Finals Day and beyond. Further information can be found by consulting the ECB 'Non First Class Rules and Regulations' and the ECB 'National Club twenty20 Rules and Playing Conditions', both available from the ECB website.

5 Matches

- 5.1 All matches shall be played on the appointed date, as arranged and published by the LMC.
- 5.2 In exceptional circumstances, a match may be played on an artificial pitch. The umpires will have sole authority over this decision.
- 5.3 For group matches, cancellation of a match is not permitted unless agreed by the League secretary.
- 5.4 In the event of inclement weather where a match is not possible the match will be abandoned and declared 'No Result'.
- 5.5 Finals Day will be played on a date and venue(s) chosen by the LMC.
- 5.6 In the event of inclement weather on finals day, the LMC holds the right to change the scheduled fixtures and/or re-arrange the date where necessary, with mutual agreement with the clubs concerned.

6 Match Results

- 6.1 For all matches, the winner of each match shall be deemed the home side and will be fully responsible for the submission of both the result, full scorecard and BDCL Match Team Card to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website.
- 6.2 For Group matches and both semi-finals, all results, scorecards and BDCL Match Team Cards must be entered onto the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website on the day of the match.
 - For Group matches, when submitting the result to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website, should the number of scheduled overs have been reduced, this should be noted in the notes field on the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website.
 - This information is required for the calculation of Net Run Rate.
- 6.3 For the Final, the result, scorecard and BDCL Match Team Card must be entered onto the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket website on the day following the match.
- 6.4 Any problems relating to the submission of a result, scorecard or BDCL Match Team Card should be communicated to the League Secretary (preferably via email), in the first instance for investigation.
- 6.5 Non-compliance with any part of this rule will face a sanction as determined by the LMC.

7 Umpires

- 7.1 Neutral umpires, appointed by the Umpires Appointments Secretary will officiate in all matches.
- 7.2 Each appointed Umpire shall be paid match expenses of £20.00.

In the event of only one registered League Umpire taking charge of both bowling ends throughout the match, they shall be paid an additional £10.00.

7.3 On Finals Day, the Umpire's expenses shall be the responsibility of the LMC.

8 Playing Conditions

8.1 Hours of Play

8.1.1 Group matches will commence at the following times:

1st Match	11.00am
2nd Match	2.15pm
3rd Match	5.30pm

The scheduled hours of play will be (2 hours 45 minutes):

1st Match	11.00am-1.45pm
2nd Match	2.15pm-5.00pm
3rd Match	5.30pm-8.15pm

8.1.2 Matches on Finals Day will commence at the following times:

Semi-Finals	12.00pm
Final	4.00pm

The scheduled hours of play will be (2 hours 45 minutes):

Semi-Finals	12.00pm-2.45pm
Final	4.00pm-6.45pm

- 8.1.3 Teams have 1 hour 15 minutes to bowl 20 overs.
- 8.1.4 There shall be an interval of a maximum of 15 minutes between the innings.
- 8.1.5 The Umpires will have sole authority as to when intervals shall be taken.

8.2 Length of Innings

8.2.1 Each side shall bat for 20 overs unless all out earlier.

If the team batting first is dismissed in less than 20 overs, the team batting second shall be entitled to bat for 20 overs.

8.2.2 All sides are expected to have completed their 20 overs within 1 hour 15 minutes playing time.

This equates to a minimum of 16 overs per hour.

It is the responsibility of the Captain to ensure that his team bowl their allocated overs within the playing time.

- 8.2.3 If in the view of the Umpires bearing in mind the prevailing ground, weather and light conditions it is considered most unlikely that the full quota of overs will be bowled in any match, it is recommended that a pre-emptive decision is made to reduce overs in both innings equally. The level of the deduction will be made at the sole discretion of the Umpires.
- 8.2.4 Umpires shall make due time allowance for unavoidable stoppages caused by injury or other extenuating circumstances.
- 8.2.5 In reduced over matches the fielding side has a one over leeway in addition to any time that the Umpires may allow for stoppages.
- 8.2.6 If in the opinion of the Umpires, the team fielding first fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the first innings, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled. The batting side shall receive an additional six penalty runs for each over not started at that time. The bowlers end Umpire shall signal six runs to the scorers before the first ball of each late over is bowled. These shall be recorded as penalty runs.

The interval shall be reduced from the maximum of 15 minutes' duration in order to comply with the scheduled hours of play.

If in the opinion of the Umpires, the team fielding second fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the second innings, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled. The batting side shall receive an additional six penalty runs for each over not started at that time. The bowlers end Umpire shall signal six runs to the scorers before the first ball of each late over is bowled. These shall be recorded as penalty runs.

If the penalty runs added under this provision take the team batting second beyond the total required for victory, the game will be over at that point.

8.2.7 Umpires are instructed to apply a strict interpretation of time wasting by the batsman (5 run penalties) specifically; batsmen are expected to be ready for the start of a new over as soon as the bowler is ready.

8.3 In Delayed Start Matches

- 8.3.1 The number of overs shall be arranged so that both teams have the opportunity of batting for the same number of overs.
- 8.3.2 No match shall be reduced to less than 10 overs duration scheduled at 5 overs per team.

8.3.3 The calculation of the number of overs to be bowled and the time allowed is determined using the following table:

The calculation of the time allowance with which to bowl the allocated overs is based on one over for each 3% minutes, rounded up to the nearest minute where appropriate.

Competition Rules 8.2.5, 8.2.6 and 8.5.5 will apply.

8.4 In Interrupted Matches

8.4.1 In the event of an interruption during the 1st innings, the calculation of the number of overs to be bowled shall be based upon one over for every 3% minutes in the total time available for play up to the scheduled close of play.

The calculation of the adjusted number of overs and the time remaining is calculated using the following formulas:

Overs Remaining = [A] – Overs already bowled

Time Remaining = [B] – Time on field of play

Using the following table as guidance:

The calculation of the time allowance with which to bowl the allocated overs is based on one over for each 3% minutes, rounded down to the nearest minute where appropriate.

Competition Rules 8.2.5, 8.2.6 and 8.5.5 will apply.

If the side batting first has received more overs than that now allocated then the innings is immediately closed, the side batting second will receive the revised number of overs and the total to win is re-calculated based on the average run rate of the 1st innings (ignoring any fractions) and plus 1 run.

The time taken for the interval will be reduced to a maximum of 10 minutes. The exact interval time shall be notified to both team captains by the umpires.

8.4.2 In the 2nd innings of the match, overs shall be reduced at a rate of one over for every full 3% minutes lost, unless the 1st innings has finished early or the 2nd innings started early, in which case no overs are lost until the time that has been gained is subsequently lost.

8.4.3 Should an interruption have occurred during an over, on return to the field the part over shall count as a full over for the purposes of any re-calculation.

The calculation of the adjusted number of overs and the time remaining is calculated using the following formulas:

Overs Remaining = [A] – Overs already bowled Time Remaining = [B] – Time on field of play

Competition Rules 8.2.4, 8.2.5 and 8.2.6 will apply.

8.5 The Result

8.5.1 A result can be achieved only if both teams have had the opportunity of batting for at least 5 overs, unless one team has been all out in less than 5 overs or unless the team batting second scores enough runs to win in less than 5 overs.

All matches in which a match has begun but both teams have not had the opportunity of batting for a minimum of 5 overs (subject to the provisions of this clause) shall be decided by a bowl out (should prevailing ground, weather and light conditions allow).

Should a bowl out not be possible, and it is not possible to rearrange as per Rule 5.6, the match shall be decided by the toss of a coin between the two Captains.

- 8.5.2 When both sides have had the opportunity of batting for the same agreed number of overs, the team scoring the higher number of runs shall be the winner.
 - If the scores are equal, the result shall be determined by the following criteria, taken in order:
- 8.5.2.1 A bowl out (should prevailing ground, weather and light conditions allow).
- 8.5.2.2 The toss of a coin.
- 8.5.3 If the team batting second has not had the opportunity to complete the agreed number of overs, and has neither been all out, not has passed its opponent's score, the result shall be determined by the following criteria, taken in order:
- 8.5.3.1 A bowl out (should prevailing ground, weather and light conditions allow).
- 8.5.3.2 The toss of a coin.
- 8.5.4 If no match is possible, the result shall be determined by the following criteria, taken in order:
- 8.5.4.1 A bowl out (should prevailing ground, weather and light conditions allow).
- 8.5.4.2 The toss of a coin.
- 8.5.5 On Finals Day, in the event of no result being obtained and where there is no reserve date on which to play the game (in accordance with Competition Rule 5.6), the result shall be made by the following criteria, taken in order:
- 8.5.5.1 A bowl out (should prevailing ground, weather and light conditions allow).
- 8.5.5.2 The toss of a coin, when both Captains are present.
- 8.5.5.3 The toss of a coin, by the League Secretary (should both Captains not be present).

8.6 Overs per Bowler

8.6.1 No bowler shall bowl more than one-fifth of the scheduled number of overs for the innings, therefore each bowler can bowl a maximum of 4 overs.

For matches that are delayed and there is a reduction in the scheduled number of overs, the maximum number of overs per bowler is shown in the following table:

If an interruption occurs mid-over and on resumption the bowler has exceeded the new maximum allocation, they will be allowed to finish the incomplete over.

8.6.2 The ECB Fast Bowling Directives provision requiring an equivalent number of overs from the same end to have elapsed before a subsequent spell can commence shall not apply (e.g. the 4 overs may be bowled at any time in the innings irrespective of the number of spells bowled).

8.7 Restrictions on the Placement of Fielders

- 8.7.1 A fielding circle shall be marked on the field of play by white plastic or rubber disks.
- 8.7.2 The fielding circle shall consist of two semi-circles which shall have as their centre the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The ends of which shall be joined by a straight parallel line.
- 8.7.3 The radius of each semi-circle shall be 30 yards (27.4 metres).
- 8.7.4 The first 6 overs of each innings will constitute a 'Power Play' whereby only two fielders are permitted to be outside the field restriction markings at the instant of delivery.

For the duration of the innings only five fielders are permitted to be outside the field restriction markings at the instant of delivery.

In the event of an infringement of the above fielding restriction, the Umpire at the striker's end shall call and signal 'No Ball'.

8.7.5 In circumstances when the number of overs of the batting team is reduced, the number of Fielding Restriction Overs shall be reduced in accordance with the table below. For the sake of clarity, it should be noted that the table shall apply to both the 1st and 2nd innings of the match.

8.8 Law 22 - Wide Ball - Judging a Wide

8.8.1 Any ball, not being a No Ball, that passes the striker's leg stump, irrespective of where that ball pitched, will be called and signalled a wide. It will not be a wide if the ball makes contact with the striker, his person or equipment, or the bat in hand before it passes the line of the stumps, or the ball passes between the striker and the leg stump.

In addition, any ball that passes outside the off-side wide-line, will be called and signalled a wide. The off-side wide-line will be marked at 35 inches (89 cm) on each side of the imaginary Centre-line [17 inches (43.2 cm)] inside each Return crease.

8.8.2 The overall winner of the competition will need to consult the rules and regulations regarding Law 22 prior to playing in the Nottinghamshire Feeder League t20 Challenge Match against the winner of the South Nottinghamshire Cricket League t20 competition and if successful, the Nottinghamshire Premier League Finals Day and beyond. Further information can be found by consulting the ECB 'Non First Class Rules and Regulations' and the ECB 'National Club twenty20 Rules and Playing Conditions', both available from the ECB website.

8.9 Match Balls

8.9.1 Each club will be provided with one pink ball for use during the match.

Each club must provide used spare pink or red balls, which comply with League Rule 3.7.1 ('All Divisions'), to the umpires in sufficient quantity to minimise time lost during the innings.

8.10 Timed out

The incoming batsman must be in position to take ground, or for his partner to be ready to receive the next ball, within 1 minute 30 seconds of the fall of the previous wicket. Any infringement of this rule shall result in the incoming batsman being declared out by the Umpires.

8.11 Free Hit after a no ball

- 8.11.1 The delivery following a no ball shall be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it.
- 8.11.2 If the delivery for a free hit is not a legitimate delivery (any kind of no ball or wide), then the next delivery shall become a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it.
- 8.11.3 For any free hit, the striker can be dismissed only under the circumstances that apply for a no ball, even if the delivery for the free hit is called wide ball.
- 8.11.4 Field changes are permitted for free hit deliveries provided all effective fielding restrictions are adhered to.
- 8.11.5 The umpires shall signal free hit by (after the normal no ball signal) extending one arm straight upwards and moving it in a circular motion.

8.12 Average Run Rate

8.12.1 A team's average run rate (ARR) is calculated by dividing the number of runs scored in its innings by the number of legitimate balls received during the innings.

Example 1: 1st innings score = 135; scheduled overs = 20; actual overs = 20

 $ARR = 135 / (20 \times 6) = 1.125$

Example 2: 1st innings score = 167; scheduled overs = 20; actual overs = 20

ARR = $167 / (20 \times 6) = 1.39 (2 \text{ decimal places})$

Example 3: 1st innings score = 142; scheduled overs = 20; actual overs 14.2

Innings closed due to weather

ARR = $142 / ((14 \times 6) + 2) = 1.65 (2 \text{ decimal places})$

8.12.2 In the case of the team batting first being dismissed in less than the number of overs allocated for their innings, the calculation will be based on the number of balls that the team was scheduled to receive and not on the number actually received.

Example 1: 1st innings score = 142; scheduled overs = 20; actual overs 14.2

 $ARR = 142 / (20 \times 6) = 1.39 (2 decimal places)$

- 8.12.3 In the case of the batting team being unable to receive their allocated overs, the calculation of their average run rate will be based on the actual number of legitimate deliveries by them during the innings.
- 8.12.4 The average run rate can be calculated to any number of decimal positions and a tie can only be achieved if the average run rates are identical.
- 8.12.5 To re-calculate the required number of runs for the team batting second, where the scheduled number of overs to be received is reduced, the revised number of scheduled overs is multiplied by the ARR (complete and neither

rounded or set to any number of decimal places) and then multiplied by 6. The team batting second will be required to obtain a score greater than this total in order to win.

Should the scores be level, then the match is tied and Rule 8.5.2 applies.

Example 1: 1st innings ARR = 1.125

Revised scheduled overs = 16

Revised target score = $16 \times 1.125 \times 6 = 108$

No. runs required to win = 109 (tie is possible)

Example 2: 1st innings ARR = 1.39

Revised scheduled overs = 12

Revised target score = $12 \times 1.39 \times 6 = 100.2$

No. of runs required to win = 101 (tie is not possible)

Example 3: 1st innings ARR = 1.65

Revised scheduled overs = 6

Revised target score = $6 \times 1.65 \times 6 = 59.44$

No. of runs required to win = 60 (tie is not possible)

8.14 Bowl Outs

- 8.14.1 In the event of no result being obtained by other methods and where there is no reserve date on which to play the game, a bowl out (outdoors or indoors) will take place to achieve a result.
- 8.14.2 Five players from each side will bowl two overarm deliveries each at a wicket (conforming to Law 8) from a wicket pitched at a distance of 22 yards with, if practicable, bowling, popping and return creases marked (conforming to Law 7). The side, which bowls down the wicket (as defined in Law 29.1.1) the most times, shall be the winner. If the scores are equal, the same players will bowl one ball alternately to achieve a result on a 'sudden death' basis.
- 8.14.3 The following shall also apply in respect of bowl-outs:
- 8.14.3.1 The same suitably acceptable ball (not a new one) will be used by both teams. If the ball becomes wet, it may be changed subject to the Umpires' approval.
- 8.14.3.2 If a bowler bowls a No ball it will count as one of the two deliveries but will not count towards the score of the team.
- 8.14.3.3 The five cricketers nominated to take part in the bowl-out must be chosen from the eleven cricketers selected to play in the match.
- 8.14.3.4 If required, each side will appoint a wicket-keeper to stand behind the wicket but out of reach of the stumps.
