Foreword



When I was invited to be President of the Bassetlaw and District Cricket League for 2017, I was lost for words. Those who know me well will be aware that is something that does not happen very often! It is an honour and a privilege to hold this office. To be the 100th President and only the second lady to hold that office makes it even more of an honour. It is also an honour for Papplewick & Linby Cricket Club to have one of their many volunteers recognised in this way.

My love of cricket predates being married to a cricketer and having two cricketing sons. I grew up listening with my father to John Arlott and Brian Johnstone on the radio and I still love the traditional versions of the game but I know like all things cricket must change to survive. It is a fantastic game with all its intricacies, terminology and laws – what is LBW? Why 6 balls in an over? Why 11 players in a team? However, I hear you say, we can play with less than 11 – six-a-side tournaments for example; we can have more than 6 balls in an over – some midweek leagues play 8-ball overs. There is a version of indoor cricket that plays matches of 16 overs, 8 players (4 pairs) in a team with each pair batting for 4 overs known as a skin, with everyone bowling. As Michael said in his Foreword of 2016, we need to embrace change and start to shape our game to ensure it lives on. Michael started the process in discussions with both the League Management Committee and latterly with the clubs and at the AGM. To continue this, the BDCL League Management Committee will be undertaking a process of consultation with all clubs and more importantly with the players in 2017; I will be leading this initiative. Please keep your eyes open for emails, posters etc. informing you of what is happening. The proposals formulated from this consultation will be put to the vote at the 2017 AGM in November.

I hope that I will meet many of you during the 2017 season and get to spend time with you; not just watching our special game but hearing your thoughts about how to continue to move cricket forward so that anyone who wants to take part, whatever their age, skill or experience of cricket; has a style of game that suits their lifestyle and needs. You will find an email address for me in this handbook, just put BDCL consultation as the subject line, I will try to ensure all views, and thoughts are considered.

Finally, good luck to all teams for 2017, positive thoughts to keep the rain at bay.

Constitution, Rules & Playing Conditions

1 Constitution

1.1 Name

This combination shall be known as the Bassetlaw & District Cricket League.

1.2 Purpose

To foster and promote participation in the sport of Cricket within the Bassetlaw Community. To organise cricket clubs who wish to participate into an appropriate number of Divisions plus Cup Competitions and to manage these competitions and arrangements.

1.3 Affiliation

- (i) The League requires that all clubs playing in the Bassetlaw & District Cricket League are affiliated to the England and Wales Cricket Board through a primary affiliation to the County Cricket Board in which they reside. Clubs which reside outside of Nottinghamshire are able to secure a secondary affiliation to the NCB on a purely voluntary basis. The League Treasurer will act as an intermediary between clubs and the country boards, collecting all monies as required.
- (ii) The League requires that its member clubs shall ensure that members abide by the Laws of Cricket and playing and non-playing members abide by the Leagues Code of Conduct which incorporates the Spirit of Cricket.
- (iii) The League requires that all its member clubs shall adopt and implement the ECB 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children' and any future versions of the policy.
- (iv) The League requires that all its member clubs shall adopt and implement the ECB Cricket Equality Policy and any future versions of this policy.

1.4 Membership

- (i) Applications from clubs desiring admission to the League must be in writing and received by the League Secretary by the last day of March in the year preceding that in which they wish to take part.

Applications from existing clubs desiring admission of additional teams to the League must be in writing and received by the League Secretary by the last day of November in the year preceding that in which they wish to take part.

- (ii) Before a club is accepted into the League the LMC will need to be satisfied with its status, facilities, and ability to provide active Umpires as per Rule 6.4.

The LMC will decide to which Division of the League an applicant club will be admitted having considered the above criteria.

- (iii) Clubs wishing to resign from the League or any Division of the League shall give notice in writing to the League Secretary by the last day in November; otherwise they shall be fined the current year's subscription.
- (iv) The LMC reserves the right to ask any club to resign if, in its opinion, the general conduct or appointments of such a club do not satisfy the requirements of the League. Fourteen days' notice of a complaint must be given in writing to the Secretary of the club affected.
- (v) Any club ceasing to be a member of the League shall at once forfeit any rights to participate in the assets of the League.

1.5 Finance

- (i) The BDCL is a not for profit organisation and subject to these Rules, the LMC shall have the responsibility for the management of all its funds, property and affairs.
- (ii) The funds of the League shall be dealt with by and through an account with a bank in the name of the League. Cheques may be drawn on two signatures. The Chairman, League Secretary and Treasurer shall be authorised signatories.
- (iii) The financial year shall end on 30th September, after which the accounts shall be inspected by an Independent Examiner who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- (iv) The entrance fee for any newly admitted club shall be £30.00.
- (v) The subscription from each club shall be £35.00 per team per annum to be paid not later than 31st March in any year. Any club failing to comply with this rule shall be fined £5.00 for the first month, or part of the month, after this date, and £20.00 for every month, or part of a month, thereafter that the subscription remains unpaid.
- (vi) Any club promoted to a Premier League who has no other team within this League shall pay an affiliation fee of £10.00 per annum which will entitle them to all rights of membership other than a vote at the Annual General Meeting or an EGM, or representation on the LMC.
- (vii) If the income from subscriptions is insufficient to meet League expenses, a further levy may be made on each club.

- (viii) Honoraria, if any, to be paid to any individuals shall be agreed annually by the LMC.
- (ix) Any collection, raffle etc. will be the sole concern of the club staging the match.

1.6 Officers

- (i) The officers of the League shall consist of The President, Vice-President, Chairman, League Secretary, Treasurer, Fixture Secretary, League Statistician, League Welfare Officer, Player Registrar, Press/Advertising Officer and the Umpires Appointment Secretary, all of whom, with the exception of the President and Vice-President, shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- (ii) The President and Vice-President shall be elected by the LMC and during the year of office and for one year thereafter shall be entitled to serve on the LMC.
- (iii) Life Members and Life Vice-Presidents may be elected by the LMC in recognition of past services to the League, the former being entitled to attend meetings of the LMC.
- (iv) A Handbook Editor, an Independent Examiner and a Lead Sponsorship Officer shall be appointed by the LMC from its own elected members or by co-opting non-voting officers.

1.7 General Meetings

- (i) The Annual General Meeting shall be held in November each year.
- (ii) Nominations of officers and members of the LMC must be received by the League Secretary not later than 42 clear days previous to the date of the Annual General Meeting. If the number of nominations makes it necessary, the election of such officers and members shall be by ballot at the Annual General Meeting.
- (iii) Proposals for alterations to these rules to be considered at the Annual General Meeting must be received by the League Secretary not later than 42 clear days previous to the date of the Annual General Meeting. Proposals for such alterations may also be made by the LMC and the BDUA.
- (iv) Ten clear days' notice of the Annual General Meeting, which will include nominations of officers and members of the LMC and proposals for alterations to these rules, shall be forwarded to each club.
- (v) Not more than two representatives of each Member Club shall attend the Annual General Meeting, only one of whom shall be entitled to vote on all issues generally transacted at such a meeting.
- (vi) The President, or Immediate Past President, or if both these officers shall be absent, a deputy appointed by the meeting shall preside, and shall have a casting vote.

- (vii) If it is thought desirable that only certain Member Clubs should vote on a certain matter, this restriction shall only be permitted with the specific consent of the Annual General Meeting.
- (viii) Any club failing to be represented at the Annual General Meeting shall be fined £75.00.
- (ix) If after the election of the members of the LMC at the Annual General Meeting any alterations duly made under Rule 1.7(iii) at the same Annual General Meeting affect the constitution of the LMC, then these alterations will take effect from the date of the next Annual General Meeting unless an Extraordinary General Meeting is called under Rule 1.7(xi) to authorise an earlier implementation.
- (x) All competitions will be played under the rules approved by the Annual General Meeting.
- (xi) The rules applicable to the Annual General Meeting, with the exception of Rule 1.7(i), shall also apply to an Extraordinary General Meeting whenever such a meeting is convened.

1.8 League Management Committee

- (i) Subject to these Rules, the LMC shall have the responsibility for the management of the League, its funds, property and affairs.
- (ii) The League shall be governed by a LMC consisting of the officers named in Rules 1.6(i) and 1.6(iii) and thirteen representatives from all clubs in the League who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. One representative of the BDUA appointed by that Association and one representative of the NCB PL, appointed by their Management Committee, shall serve on this Committee.
- (iii) Not more than one representative from any one club shall serve on this Committee, with the exception of the officers named in Rules 1.6(i) and 1.6(iii).
- (iv) Nine members shall form a quorum.
- (v) At least four clear days' notice of such meetings shall be given.
- (vi) Members of this Committee shall not be allowed to vote on questions arising out of matters in which their clubs are concerned.
- (vii) Travelling expenses of members of this Committee, over and above those expected in the normal course of their duties, shall be paid by the League.
- (viii) Any member of the LMC failing to attend two consecutive meetings without reasonable cause shall forfeit his seat which shall be filled by the Committee at the next meeting. The member so appointed shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting.
- (ix) The LMC may appoint such sub-committees as they may from time to time consider necessary.

- (x) A Vice-Chairman shall be appointed by the LMC from amongst their numbers at the first Committee meeting after the Annual General Meeting.
- (xi) The Chairman, or in his absence the Vice-Chairman, or if both are absent, a deputy appointed by the LMC shall preside at all LMC Meetings and shall have a casting vote.
- (xii) The LMC will meet, unless otherwise communicated, on each second Tuesday of the month, except in December when no meeting shall take place.

1.9 Trophies

- (i) Each winning club shall be responsible for the insurance of the trophy it holds during the ensuing twelve months. Clubs will be advised of the value of each trophy for insurance purposes.
- (ii) Each trophy must be returned in clean condition to the Appointed League Engraver not later than 15th February in each year. Failure to observe this rule will render the club concerned liable to a fine of £25.00.

1.10 Return of Circulated Documents

Documents distributed by the League Secretary or other LMC members by e-mail and/or post should be returned by the timescales provided.

Failure by a club to return a circulated document related to the administration of the League by the due date shall render that club liable to a £5.00 fine.

1.11 Winding-up

- (i) The members may vote to wind up the League at a properly convened Annual General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting. Three quarters of all member clubs shall form a quorum.
- (ii) The LMC will be responsible for the orderly winding up of the League's affairs.
- (iii) After settling all liabilities of the League, the LMC shall dispose of the net assets remaining to one or more of the following:
 - a) To another League with similar sports purposes which is a charity.
 - b) Equally to clubs within the League with similar sports purposes which is a registered CASC.
 - c) To the League's national governing body for use by them for related community sports.

2 League Competition

2.1 Constitution of Divisions

- (i) The constitution of the Championship and the other Divisions of the League shall be determined by the LMC.
- (ii) The teams in membership shall be organised into an appropriate number of Divisions, with the top Division named the 'Championship'.
- (iii) There will normally be a maximum of 12 teams in each division.
- (iv) No club shall have more than one team in any Division, except the lowest.
- (v) Two teams from the same club shall not exchange Division.

2.2 Trophies

The following trophies shall be awarded to the Champions of the respective Divisions at the end of each season, where applicable:

2.3 Promotion and Relegation

- (i) At the end of each season the top two teams in all Divisions below the Championship shall be promoted. The winner of the Championship shall be promoted to the NPL

Promotion from the Championship to the NPL will be dependent on the criteria laid out by the NPL (please refer to the NPL Rules and Regulations found at www.nottspremierleague.co.uk). Should the winner of the Championship not meet this criteria, then promotion may pass to the runners up.

Promotion from Division 1 to the Championship is dependent on the criteria laid out in Rule 3.14. Should the criteria not be met by either the winner or runners up, the number of teams relegated from the Championship shall be reduced.

- (ii) In order to keep the number of teams in each Division as per Rule 2.1(iii), relegations will be made of the teams finishing at the bottom of each Division, up to a maximum of three.
- (iii) In the event of two or more teams finishing the season on the same number of points, the matter shall be resolved by the following criteria, taken in order:
 - a) The number of matches won.

- b) The number of points achieved from winning draws.
 - c) The net run rate over all completed matches.
 - d) The toss of a coin.
- (iv) A team shall forfeit promotion in favour of the next eligible team if such promotion would result in a contravention of Rule 2.1(iv).
 - (v) Should the relegation of a team result in a contravention of Rule 2.1(iv), the team in the lower Division that season shall be demoted, irrespective of its finishing position, instead of the team in the highest relegation position.

2.4 Fixtures

- (i) Fixtures will be played on dates arranged by the Fixture Secretary.
- (ii) A club's league fixtures will take precedence over any other match.
- (iii) The Fixture Secretary will publish all League Fixtures to all clubs by the end of December each year of the close season. Clubs will be allowed up to three amendments (arranged between them) and returned on a pro forma to the Fixture Secretary within 14 days. Where clubs cannot agree upon a desired amendment, a submission should be made to the LMC, whose decision shall be final. Clubs with a 3rd XI may be allowed additional flexibility with the consent of the Fixture Secretary.

Final fixtures will be made available to Clubs via email and published via the BDCL website and the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket website.

- (iv) Fixtures shall be made for each Saturday between late April and mid-September, including one Bank Holiday. Other Bank Holidays during the season shall be used as required.

In exceptional circumstances, the Fixture Secretary may arrange fixtures to be played on Sundays.

- (v) Where, for any reason, there are more than twelve teams in a Division, the clubs in that Division shall be balloted to ascertain whether each team should play each other twice, both home and away, or should fulfil a reduced programme of fixtures arranged by the Fixture Secretary. Should a ballot be tied, the LMC shall decide on the number of fixtures to be arranged.
- (vi) Any request for a change of fixture must be submitted in writing to the Fixture Secretary not less than ten days before the date of the proposed change. Such changes must have the sanction of the LMC who will only allow them in exceptional circumstances.
- (vii) The League Secretary will notify clubs of dates on which a Representative XI may be required. No player selected to play for the League in a representative match will be allowed to play in any competition within the League's jurisdiction on the day of that match without the express permission of the LMC.

- (viii) Special arrangements will be made by the LMC if two teams from the same club are in the lowest Division.

2.5 Cancellation of Matches

- (i) A cancellation due to adverse playing conditions may be made by the home club **ONLY WITH THE VERBAL AGREEMENT OF THE AWAY CLUB** (email and text messages should not be used).

If the away team do not agree to the cancellation and wish to travel, both teams **MUST** regard the game as being 'on and to be played' and the umpires will then make their usual decisions at the start of the game as to whether play should begin in keeping with League Rules and the Laws of the game. If no umpires are present, Rule 2.5(v) applies.

- (ii) No such cancellation shall be made before 10.00am on the day on which the match is to be played.

Failure by the home club to contact the away club to seek agreement that the game is cancelled due to adverse playing conditions, and the away team arrive at the ground believing the game is to be played, then the sanctions stated at Rule 2.5(vi) shall apply, although no points shall be deducted from the Divisional total of the home team.

- (iii) All such cancellations must be agreed by the two clubs and the appointed Umpires informed not later than two hours before the scheduled start time.
- (iv) Unless a match is cancelled under this rule, the visiting team shall be responsible for the payment of the teas provided for it by the home club.
- (v) If the away team has travelled, the appointed Umpires shall assess the ground conditions and allow play to commence unless it is deemed dangerous. The Umpires shall be the sole authority in such matters. Should there be no appointed Umpires the Captains shall have sole authority. If the Captains disagree, the match shall be cancelled and the League Secretary notified.
- (vi) Any club failing to fulfil a League engagement will be fined £10.00 and will have ten points deducted from the total of the team concerned. The game shall be counted as a win, with full bonus points, for their opponents.
- (vii) The LMC shall decide whether the non-offending club is entitled to claim the fine of part thereof.
- (viii) If in the opinion of the LMC, undue advantage is taken of this rule by any club, it shall deal with it according to its discretion.
- (ix) Any team which, having arrived at the ground along with the opposition and the officials, that either refuses to play or concedes the game, shall be referred to the LMC. The minimum sanction will be that as under Rule 2.5(vi).

2.6 Method of Scoring

- (i) A maximum of 20 points to be available to each team in all completed matches divided up as follows:
- 12 points for a win, 0 for a defeat.
 - 10 points for a draw for the side batting first and 2 points for the side batting second.
 - 6 points to each side when the scores are equal, irrespective of the number of wickets lost.
 - 1 bonus point to the batting side on reaching each of the following scores: 140 runs, 160 runs, 180 runs, 200 runs (Championship), 120 runs, 140 runs, 160 runs, 180 runs (Division 1-7).
 - 1 bonus point to the fielding side at the fall of each of the following wickets: 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th.
Maximum bonus points shall be awarded to the fielding side when the batting side is all out, irrespective of the number of wickets to have fallen.
 - The side winning the match shall be awarded full bonus points, irrespective of their innings total, if their opponents' innings has been closed by either dismissal or declaration.
- (ii)
 - Six points to each side when a match is cancelled, or is not completed due to ground, whether or light conditions, or unforeseen circumstances.
 - Bonus points will be awarded in all incomplete matches.

(iii) *In all Championship games, each team shall provide a competent scorer which will be recorded on the team sheet handed to the Umpire before the game.*

Failure to comply with this rule will result in a 1-point deduction for each game without a scorer.

2.7 Notification of Results

It is the responsibility of both Captains to ensure that the home team has all the information required in order to comply with this rule.

- (i) All results must be entered on to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website by 10.00am on the day following the match.
For games played on any other day, the home club shall enter the result on to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website by 11.00pm on the day of the match.
- (ii) All scorecards must be entered on to the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website within 48 hours of the completion of the match. Scorecards are to be fully entered with no errors (as shown with red text), to include all participating players and the names of players involved with catches, stumping's and run outs. The Captain and wicket-keeper must also be listed correctly.

Any problems relating to the submission of a result or scorecard should be communicated to the League Secretary (preferably via email), in the first instance for investigation.

- (iii) The home side has the full responsibility for the submission and correctness of the result and scorecard.
- (iv) Details on completing Online Scorecards can be found under Rule 8.7.
- (v) Non-compliance with any part of this rule will face a sanction as determined by the LMC.

3 Playing Conditions

Players and Officials are not permitted to smoke on the field of play whilst a match is in progress.

3.1 Laws and Regulations

- (i) All matches shall be played under MCC Laws except where otherwise stated.
MCC experimental laws will be implemented by the league in the same season that they are applicable.
- (ii) ECB recommendations and directives with respect to young players a) Fast Bowling, b) Wearing of Helmets and c) Fielding, shall be implemented in full. Any player under the age of 18 shall be bound by the ECB Directives (the full directives can be found under Appendices 1-4).
Age Groups are based on the age of the player at midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season.
- (iii) Umpires (or Captains where no Umpires' are present) and any individual taking responsibility for players are requested to ensure that Rules 3.1.1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3 and 3.1.4 are strictly adhered to in all circumstances.

3.1.1 ECB FAST BOWLING DIRECTIVES

The ECB Fast Bowling Directives are as follows and apply for the full season:

Having completed a spell, the bowler cannot bowl again, from either end, until the equivalent number of overs to the length of their spell having been bowled from the same end.

For the purpose of these Directives a fast bowler is defined as a bowler to whom a wicket keeper in the same age group would in **normal circumstances** stand back to take the ball.

3.1.2 JUNIOR FIELDING RESTRICTIONS

- (i) No young player in the Under 15 age group or younger shall be allowed to field closer than 8 yards (7.3 metres) from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side, until the batsman has played at the ball. A fielder shall be allowed to move into the restricted area to make a catch or field the ball provided that they were outside the area when the stroke was made.
- (ii) For players in the Under 13 age group the distance is 11 yards (10 metres).
- (iii) These minimum distances apply even if the player is wearing a helmet.
- (iv) Should a young player in these age groups come within the restricted distance the Umpire (or Captains where no Umpires' are present) must stop the game immediately and instruct the fielder to move back.
- (v) In addition any young player in the Under 16 to Under 18 age groups, who has not reached the age of 18, must wear a helmet when fielding within 6 yards (5.5 metres) of the bat, except behind the wicket on the off side. Players should wear appropriate protective equipment whenever they are fielding in a position where they feel at risk.

3.1.3 ECB SAFETY MEASURES FOR HELMETS WITHIN RECREATIONAL CRICKET

The ECB has recently announced new helmet safety measures, which are being introduced with a view to reducing the risk of head and facial injuries within the game. The purpose of this brief note is to assist Leagues and Clubs at the recreational level to understand the key elements of these changes and what they mean.

(i) **Players over the age of 18**

The ECB strongly recommends that all adult recreational cricketers should wear helmets for certain activities, preferably which meet the most recent British Safety Standard (see below). This recommendation applies to batting against all types of bowling, wicket-keepers standing up to the wicket (who may as an alternative wear face protectors) and fielders fielding closer than eight yards from the batsman's middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side.

(ii) **Players under the age of 18**

The position in relation to U18's currently remains unchanged, and is governed by the 'ECB Guidance on the Wearing of Cricket Helmets by Young Players' (www.ecb.co.uk/youngplayershelmetguidance). In essence, batsmen and wicket-keepers standing up to the stumps must wear head protection when playing or practising. That Guidance should be referred to in full for the position in relation to U18's.

(iii) **British Safety Standard**

The latest British Safety Standard is **BS7928:2013** (for both adults and juniors). The full list of helmets meeting this standard is available at www.ecb.co.uk/helmets. For wicket-keeping face protectors the relevant British Safety Standard is BS7929-2:2009 (again, for both adults and juniors).

The ECB understands that there is currently no specific women's helmet and as a consequence no specific standard for women's cricket helmets. As the size of the standard women's cricket ball is between the standard men and junior balls, it is recommended that women use helmets that have been tested against both the men's and junior sized ball, or at least against the junior sized ball (as that could potentially get through the gap above the face guard on a men's helmet).

(iv) **What do Leagues and Clubs need to do**

Whilst it is strongly recommended that all adult recreational cricketers wear helmets in the on-field circumstances detailed above, it is not mandatory for them to do so. For the avoidance of doubt, Leagues or Clubs do not need to go above and beyond the ECB's recommendation by forcing their cricketers to wear helmets.

However, Leagues and Clubs in recreational cricket should ensure that their cricketers are made aware of the ECB's above recommendation in relation to helmets, including the need to check that any newly purchased helmets meet the latest British Safety Standard. The ECB recommends that Leagues and Clubs bring the link above (i.e. www.ecb.co.uk/helmets) to the attention of their cricketers and encourage all cricketers to carefully consider their own health and safety regarding helmet use.

Leagues and Clubs should always ensure that they have adequate public liability insurance.

3.1.4 TEAM SHEETS

Each side must provide the Umpires with a team sheet before the start of the match identifying any player in the U13, U15 or U19 age groups. This requirement also covers any young player taking the field as a substitute fielder. It is recommended that the ECB Team Sheet card as provided to clubs is used whenever possible.

3.2 Rolling and Covering of Pitches

(i) In addition to Law 10 the following will apply:

No rolling shall take place after the toss, except between innings, unless it is with the consent of both Captains.

Any infringement of this rule will be reported by the Umpires to the LMC who will deal with the matter at their discretion.

- (ii) In addition to Law 11 the following will apply:

When covers are available, in the event of rain preventing play, the whole of the pitch shall be covered on the Umpires' instructions.

3.3 Hours of Play – General Information

- (i) *For the Championship, matches shall commence at 1.00pm in April to August and at 12.30pm in September.* For all other Divisions, matches shall commence at 1.30pm in April to August and at 1.00pm in September.

Clubs may, if they so desire, start earlier if they mutually agree; the Umpires' Appointments Secretary must be informed.

- (ii) There shall be an interval of 10 minutes between the innings plus 20 minutes for tea.
- (iii) All sides are expected to be in position to bowl the first ball of the last of their allocated number of overs within 3 hours (*Championship*) or 2 hours 45 minutes (Division 1-7).

This equates to a minimum of 16.67 overs (*Championship*) or 16.73 overs (Division 1-7); teams should therefore aim for a minimum of 17 overs per hour.

It is the responsibility of the Captain to ensure that his team bowl their allocated overs within the playing time.

- (iv) A variation in time of 3½ minutes per over shall be made if more or less than the allocated number of overs are scheduled to be bowled (rounded up to the nearest minute where necessary).
- (v) No match shall start later than 3 hours after the scheduled start time.
- (vi) Umpires shall make due time allowance for all drinks intervals per innings, if taken, and for unavoidable stoppages caused by injury or other unforeseen circumstances.
- (vii) The Umpires shall have sole authority as to when intervals shall be taken.
- (viii) If in the opinion of the Umpires, either fielding team fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the innings, play shall continue, subject to the prevailing ground, weather or light conditions, until the required number of overs has been bowled, or a result has been achieved.

The Umpires shall record and report all overs started by the fielding side after the time allowed, and a team shall subsequently forfeit 1 league table point for each 'late' over.

Any intervals due shall be of the full duration.

- (ix) The Umpires shall inform the fielding team Captain when taking the field for the first time and on every subsequent occasion if play is interrupted by the

prevailing ground, weather or light conditions, of the scheduled cessation time for that innings.

The Umpires shall also inform the fielding team Captain after one hour's play, the time remaining at the end of the drinks interval, and when one hour of play remains.

The Umpire at the bowler's end will inform the fielding Captain, the batsman and his fellow Umpire of any time allowances as and when they arise (this matter will not be subject to retrospective negotiation).

3.4 Matches not Interrupted or Delayed by Weather, Light or Other Unforeseen Circumstances

- (i) Each side shall bat for *50 overs (Championship)* or 46 overs (Division 1-7) unless all out earlier.
- (ii) If the side batting first should be dismissed or declare its innings closed before the end of its allocated number of overs, the side batting second shall have the balance of the allocated number of overs not occupied by the side batting first added to its allocated number of overs.

An over which has been commenced at the time of dismissal or declaration shall be deemed to be complete.

3.5 Matches Delayed at the Start or Interrupted by Weather, Light or Unforeseen Circumstances

- (i) The number of overs shall be arranged so that both teams have the opportunity of batting for the same number of overs. No match shall be reduced to less than *80 overs (Championship)* or 72 overs (Division 1-7) scheduled at *40 overs (Championship)* or 36 overs (Division 1-7).

If the side batting first should be dismissed or declare its innings closed before the end of its allocated number of overs, Rule 3.4(ii) shall apply.

If the team fielding fails to bowl the required number of overs within the re-calculated time allowance, the provisions in Rule 3.3(viii) shall apply.

The calculations are shown as follows (*Championship/Division 1-7*):

The calculation of the time allowance with which to bowl the allocated overs is based on one over for each 3½ minutes, rounded up to the nearest minute where appropriate.

- (ii) If, after 1 hour has elapsed, or after the game has started, interference by weather, light or unforeseen circumstances amounts to more than 30 minutes, a time limit shall be applied from the time 5½ hours (*Championship*) or 5 hours (*Division 1-7*) after the scheduled start of play.

A match which is delayed for more than 1 hour after the scheduled start of play, but is able to start before 1 hour and 30 minutes after the scheduled start of play (1 hour and 50 minutes should an early tea be taken), will remain a reduced overs game scheduled at 40 overs (*Championship*) or 36 overs (*Division 1-7*) per team. The additional time lost (up to 30 minutes) will form part of the 30 minutes allowable before a time limit shall apply.

Should the interruption occur during the first innings, on resumption the batting side will be entitled to bat for the maximum allotted overs as scheduled at the start of play

- (iii) When a time limit has been applied there shall, unless further interference occurs or the match is completed, be one hour's play or a minimum of 17 overs bowled.
- (iv) If further interference occurs by weather, light or unforeseen circumstances when a time limit has been applied, or if time is lost during the last hour of play causes a time limit to be applied, the number of overs to be bowled on any resumption of play shall be reduced, from the total of 17, by one over for each full 3½ minutes which have elapsed after the scheduled commencement of the last hour.

During the last hour, the number of overs bowled prior to any interruption is not taken into consideration when working out the number of overs remaining. The calculation of the number of overs remaining is determined using the following table:

During the last hour, on resumption of play, any part overs count as a whole over. For example, if there are 8 minutes of playing time remaining and the bowler has 3 balls remaining of their current over. The minimum number of overs to be bowled will be 2.3 (and not 3).

3.6 Overs per Bowler

- (i) No bowler shall bowl more than 30% of the scheduled number of overs for the innings, as at the start of the game and rounded down to the nearest over, therefore each bowler can bowl a maximum of *15 overs (Championship)*, or *13 overs (Division 1-7)*.

- (ii) When a team has closed its innings by declaration, the scheduled overs for the second innings shall be revised to be the total available.

For matches that are delayed and there is a reduction in the scheduled number of overs, or the scheduled number of overs is increased due to a declaration in the first innings, the maximum number of overs per bowler is shown as follows:

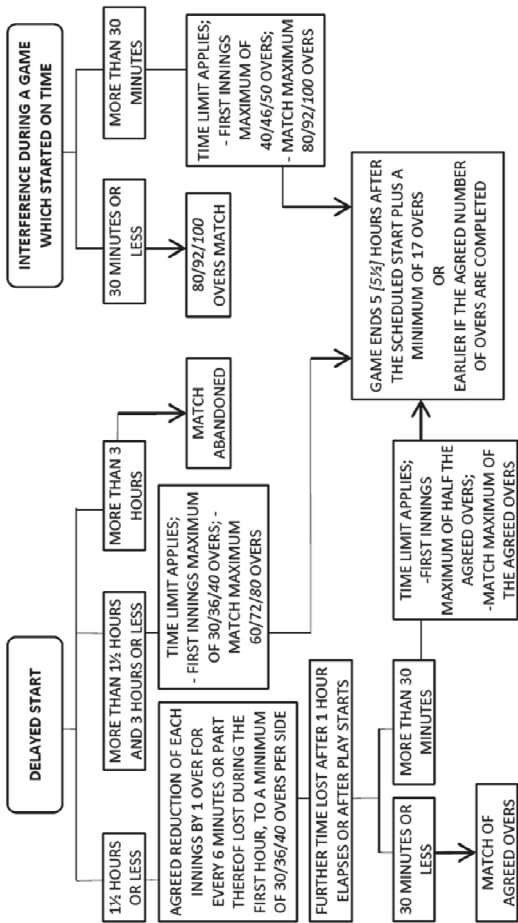

Overs greater than 50 (*Championship*) or 46 (Division 1-7) are for declarations only and **NOT** dismissals.

- (ii) In the event of a bowler being unable to complete an over for any reason, the over in progress shall be completed by any other player except the player who bowled the previous over or any player where this would contravene the ECB Fast Bowling Directives (please refer to Rule 3.1.1 and Appendix 1). Any such parts of an over shall count as a full over towards each bowler's allocation.
- (iii) The Captain of the fielding side, in consultation with the Umpire(s) and/or scorers, shall be responsible for ensuring that no bowler exceeds the quota of overs laid down by Rule 3.6(i) or the ECB Fast Bowling Directives (please refer to Rule 3.1.1 and Appendix 1).

3.7 Scoreboard

- (i) It shall be the responsibility of the batting side to ascertain the details of the score, wickets and overs from the scorers and to see that the scoreboard is brought up to date with this information at least at the end of every over – assuming that no official means of updating the scoreboard is in place.
- (ii) The passage of overs shall be indicated by a reducing number on the scoreboard.
- (iii) The scoreboard must be unobstructed at all times.

3.8 Ball

- (i) All balls will be stamped as a BDCL ball and must be purchased through League arrangements as communicated. Each club shall provide its own balls for use when fielding.

In the Championship, the match ball shall be new. In all other Divisions, the match ball may not be new, but in all Divisions, the spare ball must not be new.

In the Championship, the match ball must be:

a) *Reader Sovereign*

In all other Divisions, the match balls must be one of the following:

a) Reader Sovereign

b) Reader County Match

c) Reader League Special

- (ii) The balls (match and spare) to be used must be submitted to, and approved by the Umpires and Captains before the toss of the coin when indication shall be given as to which is the first ball.

3.9 Replacement Ball

If and when the spare or any subsequent ball(s) are brought into play, they shall be brought into play in their present condition.

3.10 Late Start

- (i) In the event of a late start, notwithstanding Rule 3.5, the Umpires must intimate to the Captain(s) of the offending team(s) that a complaint will be made to the League Secretary. In the event of no umpires being present, the Captain(s) should make the complaint.

The LMC shall have the power to impose a fine not exceeding £20.00 on the offending club(s), with a deduction of 1 point for each over lost up to a maximum of 5 points.

- (ii) A minimum of 7 players per side must be present before a game can start. If 7 players are not present within one hour after the scheduled start, the game

shall be called off and the Umpire(s) shall report the fact to the LMC. In the event of no umpires being present, the Captain(s) should make the report.

3.11 Wearing Apparel

No players shall be allowed to play unless they are wearing recognised white cricket apparel.

3.12 Boundaries

- (i) The boundaries on all grounds must have a boundary line clearly defined.

Attention is drawn to the possible risk of injury to a fielder by the use of metal or wooden stakes to define a boundary.

- (ii) No part of any sightscreen should be within the field of play. A rope should be placed on the ground around a sightscreen where an obstruction prevents the sightscreen being positioned outside the normal boundary line.

- (iii) Where the frequent movement of a sightscreen is required the batting side should provide the necessary persons to achieve this with the minimum of delay.

- (iv) Boundary hits shall count as four runs, except for a ball hit full pitch on to, or clear of, the boundary line shall count six runs, unless otherwise mutually agreed by the Captains before the commencement of play.

3.13 Ground Criteria

- (i) For entry to the Championship, the following ten requirements must be in place by the last day of September in the year/season in which the right to promotion to the Championship has been earned:

- a) The outfield shall be flat with the grass cut short. The minimum distance to all boundaries should be 35 yards (32 metres).
- b) There should be sightscreens at each end of effective height and width. They should be clean and white (or eggshell blue).
- c) Boundaries to be clearly defined with a continuous rope or white line.
- d) A competent scorer should be available for all matches. The scoring accommodation should be separate, with a manual or electronic system accessible to the scorers.
- e) Ground equipment and requirements should consist of light and heavy rollers; wheel-on or sheet covers; correct marking of pitches; re-marking of lines between innings; sawdust available.
- f) Dressing rooms should be adjacent to the playing area, lockable, clean and decorated, of suitable size (100 ft². (9.3m²) minimum), with sufficient seating to accommodate both teams. Wash hand-basins and mirrors should also be available.

- g) Ladies' and Gents' toilets should be available. They should be clean, convenient and contain hand-basins and towels.
 - h) Club facilities should comply with current Health and Food regulations in order to prepare satisfactory teas at a reasonable cost.
 - i) A first-aid kit and access to a telephone should be available.
- (ii) Should the ten requirements as stated above not be fulfilled by the date stated, promotion to the Championship will not be accepted by the LMC.

3.14 **Playing Conditions - Championship**

- (i) *Any ball, not being a No Ball, that passes the striker's leg stump, irrespective of where that ball pitched, will be called and signalled a wide. It will not be a wide if the ball makes contact with the striker, his person or equipment, or the bat in hand before it passes the line of the stumps, or the ball passes between the striker and the leg stump.*
- (ii) a) *A fielding circle shall be marked on the field of play by white plastic or rubber disks.*
- b) *The fielding circle shall consist of two semi-circles which shall have as their centre the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The ends of which shall be joined by a straight parallel line.*
- c) *The radius of each semi-circle shall be 30 yards (27.4 metres).*
- d) *For the duration of the innings, only five fielders are permitted to be outside the field restriction markings at the instant of delivery.*
- e) *In the event of an infringement of the above fielding restriction, the Umpire at the striker's end shall call and signal 'No Ball'.*

3.15 **Child Protection**

- (i) All clubs must recognise that they have a duty of care towards all young players who are representing the club. This duty of care also extends to Leagues that allow the participation of young players in adult teams and the BDCL has adopted the ECB's 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children' Policy as part of its commitment to ensuring that the game provides a safe, friendly and enjoyable experience for children.

The Policy provides the sport with the tools to ensure that the whole game takes up the challenge of continuously improving the participation conditions for children.

Safeguarding and Child Protection is applicable to all and this must be adhered to.

Safeguarding and Child Protection will not be implemented overnight. It is a long-term process. It is the responsibility of the whole club to implement the appropriate Safeguarding policies and procedures.

- (ii) The duty of care should be interpreted in two ways:
- Not to place a young player in a position that involves an unreasonable risk to that young player, taking account of the circumstances of the match and the relative skill of the player.
 - Not to create a situation that places members of the opposing side in a position whereby they cannot play cricket as they would normally do against adult players.
- (iii) **Every club MUST:**
- Nominate a Club Welfare Officer who will advise and ensure that Safeguarding is being adhered to in the club.
 - Ensure the following club personnel undertake a Vetting Check (DBS):
 - Coach/Coaches
 - Scorer(s)
 - Colts/Junior Managers
 - Age Group Managers
 - Open Age Group Team Captains (where players under 18 are regularly in the side)
 - Junior Supervisors
 - First Aiders
 - Physiotherapists
 - Medical Support
 - Umpires (League Umpires are managed by the BDUAs)
 - Ensure that all other club personnel not listed above undertake a Vetting Check if they are to have regular/unsupervised or sole access to children.
- (iv) **Every Club Welfare Officer MUST:**
- Attend a 'Safeguarding and Protecting Children' workshop accredited by Sportscoach UK.
 - Attend the ECB 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children' Workshop advising of the role, requirements and responsibilities of child safeguarding in clubs.
 - Undertake a Vetting Check
- (v) Further details can be obtained from:
- The League Welfare Officer
 - The NCB County Welfare Officer
 - The ECB Website

3.16 Net Run-Rate

A team's net run rate is calculated by deducting from the average runs per over scored by that team throughout the competition, the average runs per over scored against that team throughout the competition.

In the event of a team being all out in less than its full quota of overs, the calculation of its net run rate shall be based on the full quota of overs to which it would have been entitled and not on the number of overs in which the team was dismissed.

Only those matches where results are achieved will count for the purpose of net run rate calculations.

3.17 Average Run-Rate

This calculation is only required for the team batting first and the calculation will be based in the number of overs that the team was scheduled to receive and not on the number actually received.

Therefore, the team batting first's average run rate is calculated by dividing the number of runs scored in its innings by the number of scheduled overs.

4.2 Qualifications

(i) Trophies shall be awarded to players who fulfil the following qualifications:

- Batting – a minimum of 50% of the scheduled number of innings for the season and 400 runs.
- Bowling – a minimum of 35 wickets.

For average purposes, no record shall be allowed to count after the winning hit has been made; stumps shall be drawn immediately the winning hit is made.

Should no players fulfil the above qualifications, then the award shall be awarded to the player with the highest number of runs or the most number of wickets.

(ii) The previous season's League Averages will be presented in the current League Handbook where the following criteria are met:

- Batting -

Championship and Division 1	a minimum of 300 runs
Divisions 2 & 3	a minimum of 250 runs
Divisions 4 and above	a minimum of 200 runs

For all Divisions, a minimum average of 20 is required

- Bowling - All Divisions a minimum of 20 wickets

4.3 Timescales and Criteria

Where any club has outstanding issues with relation to any part of Rule 2.7, players from those clubs may not be considered.

5 Qualification and Registration of Players

5.1 Registration

- (i) All players shall be registered under a defined category by their details being entered on the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket website and accepted by the Player Registrar.

It is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that players' registrations are in the correct category and have been received by the Player Registrar, along with relevant documentation (where applicable), within the necessary time-scales, with the exception of Category 3 (Exempt) players as indicated under Rule 5.2(iv) [final paragraph].

No registration will be accepted whilst a player remains registered with any other club and/or there are any outstanding financial or disciplinary issues.

The BDCL complies fully with the ECB policy outlined in the Non-First Class Rules and Regulations regarding Player Discipline (i.e. any player banned from playing Cricket played under the auspices of ECB, will be banned from the BDCL until such ban is served). This is also compliant with NCB Policy.

The LMC has the discretion to reject any registration.

- (ii) Any player playing Saturday cricket for a club outside the BDCL is not eligible to play on an occasional basis and must satisfy the requirements of this rule.

No player may be registered who plays Saturday cricket for any other club, except a Registered Cricketer with the ECB playing for a First-Class County or a player registered with the NCCC Academy, for whom a dual registration shall apply.

A player playing for a First-Class County or the NCCC Academy can only play for one Saturday recreational club.

Any NCCC Academy Category 1 player may receive payment or hold a NCCC Academy Summer Contract/Head of Agreement/Service Agreement.

No player shall be registered concurrently with more than one club in the League.

- (iii) Any club wishing to register an overseas player should ensure that it is aware of, and abides by, the Managed Migration Policy adopted by the ECB in conjunction with the UK Border Agency. The accountability for clubs who wish to become involved in this process should be thoroughly understood and complied with.

Clubs should not employ anyone who does not have the legal right to be in the country, or have the legal right to be employed by them and, in case of action

being taken it is the Chairman and Club Committee who will be held accountable.

The decision of the LMC on any question of qualification shall be full and binding on both the player and the applicant club and in arriving at that decision the following matters together with any other relevant information shall be taken into consideration:

- a) The nationality of the player.
- b) Whether the player has a home in the UK.
- c) Whether the player has or has had permanent full-time employment in the UK.
- d) The length of any working contract outside the UK.

Clubs will be asked to forward a copy of a player's passport to the Player Registrar and/or such other documentary evidence that the LMC and/or Player Registrar may reasonably require to enable them to make their decision on the question of qualification.

- (iv) Only players in Category 2 or Category 3 may be remunerated.

The registration of a Category 2 or Category 3 player may be cancelled with the prior agreement of the LMC. A replacement may then be registered and be eligible to play in accordance with the timescales as advised in 5.5(i) b). below.

The names of players registered in Category 2, Category 3, Category 3 (Exempt) and players registered under Category 1 whom are either registered with a First-Class County or the NCCC Academy and overseas players now eligible to play for England due to either residence and/or citizenship will be made publicly available via the BDCL website.

- (v) Any Junior Player in Year 8 at School (Under 13 at Midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season) is eligible to play in the BDCL providing explicit written consent from a parent or guardian is obtained before participating in Open Age Cricket. The form submitted must follow the template as supplied by the NCB, which is available via the BDCL website.

Copies of the completed forms are to be submitted to the Player Registrar prior to the registration being submitted.

Therefore, anyone born between 1st September 2003 and 31st August 2004 inclusive is NOT eligible to play in this League UNTIL explicit written consent has been received by the Player Registrar.

Any such breach will result in the player(s) being deemed as unregistered and the sanction advised under Rule 5.6(iii) will apply.

- (vi) Any Junior Player in Year 7 or below (Under 12 at Midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season), under a directive provided by the NCB, **cannot** play in open age cricket under any circumstances, unless they are listed on the NCB 'Approved List'. This also extends to include players not listed on team sheets but who take to the field of play under **any** guise.

Therefore, anyone born after 31st August 2004 is NOT eligible to play in this League, unless they have been approved by the NCB.

Any such breach **will** result in the player(s) being deemed as ineligible. The sanction will be determined by the LMC.

- (vii) Registration data will be held electronically by the Player Registrar and made available to the ECB and other Leagues as required.

A registration will carry over from season to season and shall be effective until cancelled by the club.

- (viii) All registrations are time stamped on receipt and acceptance. No unregistered player will be eligible to play. The sanctions for non-compliance shall apply.

All registrations are accepted or rejected on receipt. The submitted time shall apply on acceptance where there are no issues surrounding the registration.

5.2 Categories

(i) Category 1 – Club Player

- a) A player who is an EEA national; **AND**

They have not, within the 12 months leading up to April 1st immediately before the season in question either (1) played cricket for any Full Member Country outside the EEA at U17 level or above; or (2) played First-Class Cricket in any such Full Member Country except as an overseas cricketer under local rules similar to ECB Regulation 3 (Unqualified Cricketers) of the ECB Regulations Governing the Qualification and Registration of Cricketers, or in any other circumstances approved by the ECB; **AND**

They make, whenever requested by the ECB, a declaration in the form set out in Annex A to the ECB Regulations Governing the Qualification and Registration of Cricketers.

- b) A player registered with the ECB by a First-Class County Cricket Club, who played for two consecutive seasons immediately prior to their First-Class registration.

They will be re-classified as Category 2 if they play cricket for another recreational club.

- c) A player playing for a County Colts/Academy will remain a Category 1 player if they return directly to their club side.

- d) A Category 1 player subsequently engaged as a Club Professional by their club, or by any other club following a transfer, shall be re-registered under Category 2.
- e) A Category 1 player, who becomes a registered cricketer with the ECB after the start of the season, but remains with their original club, shall retain their Category 1 status for the remainder of the season.
- f) All other players except those in Category 2, Category 3 or Category 3 (Exempt), subject to acceptance by the Player Registrar.

(ii) **Category 2 – Club Professional**

- a) Club Professional; a player, or a player whose family receives remuneration, financial inducement, or benefit in any form from a club, its sponsors, its other players, or any third party acting on the club's behalf. To include:
 - Inflated payments for coaching, work on the club's ground or behind the club's bar or any other remuneration where the payments do not represent a fair or proper reward for the hours spent by the player on behalf of the club.
 - The provision of equipment without charge or at discounted value.
 - Payment of travelling expenses to matches.
 - Any other benefits in kind enjoyed by the player or their family where the cost is borne by the club, its sponsors, its other players or any third party on the club's behalf and not by the player himself.
- b) County Professional; a player with a First-Class County Cricket Club who is a registered cricketer with the ECB and does not qualify under Category 1.
- c) Ex-County Professional; a player who, although not currently registered with the ECB by a First-Class County Cricket Club, has been so registered in either of the previous two years.
- d) A player engaged by a County Club on a 'Summer Contract'.

(iii) **Category 3 – Overseas Player**

Any players who meet the following criteria shall **NOT** be deemed to be an Overseas Player:

- a) They are an EEA national whom meets the criteria for a Category 1 Player.
- b) They have been resident in England or Wales for the immediately preceding seven consecutive years (for which purposes 'year' shall mean a year ending 1st April and in each 'year' they have spent a minimum of 210 days per year within England or Wales).

(iv) Category 3 (Exempt) – Overseas Player (Exempt)

A Category 3 player will qualify under Category 3 (Exempt) if they fulfil **ALL** of the following conditions:

- They have been resident in this country for a period of eighteen months before the date of their request for registration.
- They have not been out of this country for longer than 35 days consecutively or 70 days in total during the previous two years.
- Any remuneration they receive from playing cricket is not their main source of income.

Clubs are unable to assign any player to this category. Only the Player Registrar can perform this task and only after receipt and acceptance of all requested documentation.

5.3 Eligibility

- (i) Each BDCL club will be allowed to register one Category 2 or Category 3 Player. Any such player shall be eligible to play for a club's First Eleven, providing that that team plays in Division 4 or above.

Therefore, NO Category 2 or Category 3 players will be permitted to play for the following clubs:

- Cuckney
- Farnsfield
- Mansfield Hosiery Mills
- Welbeck
- West Indian Cavaliers

- (ii) A Category 3 (Exempt) player may be employed by a club as a Category 2 Player. They will be listed on the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Website as a Category 3 (Exempt) player but identified by the Player Registrar as a Category 2. Rule 5.3(i) shall apply.

A Category 3 (Exempt) registered player will become a Category 1 registered player once the residential rules have been satisfied as determined using current ECB regulations.

- (iii) A player who would ordinarily be registered within Category 3, but whose exceptional circumstances, in the opinion of the LMC, merits inclusion within the spirit of this rule, will be permitted to play on a purely recreational basis in Divisions 4 or below, or a club's second XI should they play in a higher division (and the club does not have any additional teams), providing that they do not contravene the second paragraph of Rule 5.2(i) a) above.

- (iv) On all dates, no player shall be eligible for a team more than one lower than that for which most, or equal most, appearances have been made during the current season.

Additionally, in a fixture played after the third Saturday in August, on a Bank Holiday Monday, on a Sunday, or any other date that a more senior team has no fixture, or a fixture cancelled, a player who has only appeared at a higher level than the match being played, shall not be eligible to play.

The 1st part of the rule applies all season and restricts players from dropping down by more than one team (i.e. 1st to 3rd, 2nd to 4th etc.). Players have to move down 1 team at a time (i.e. 1st to 2nd to 3rd etc.).

The second part of the rule adds extra restrictions after the 3rd Saturday in August, non-Saturday fixtures, when a higher team has no scheduled fixture and when a higher team has a fixture cancelled. This part of the rule restricts teams from artificially inflating lower teams when players from higher teams are, or become available.

This part of the rule states that any player that has only played for a higher team is not eligible to play for a lower team. For example, players that have only played for a club's 1st XI would not be eligible to play for any of the club's other teams. The same applies to players that have only appeared for both a club's 1st/2nd XI as they would be ineligible for a club's 3rd XI.

Under this part of the rule, where a player has played for a club's 1st and 2nd XI they are eligible to continue to play for both the 1st and 2nd XI. Where a player has played for all a club's teams, the player would be eligible to play for any team, so as long as they do not go from 1st to 3rd team (would have to go 1st to 2nd to 3rd).

Any such breach will result in the player(s) being deemed as ineligible. The sanction will be determined by the LMC.

5.4 Movement

- (i) Category 2 and Category 3 players may not play for more than one BDCL club in a season.
- (ii) No player may play for a club if they have already played Saturday cricket for, or are registered with, another Saturday club, either inside or outside the BDCL, unless application is made to the Player Registrar via the BDCL ECB Play-Cricket Registration System for a transfer.

The application must be accompanied by written evidence from the player's previous club that there are no outstanding financial issues and/or any disciplinary matters.

Players will be transferred by the Player Registrar on receipt of such written confirmation. Neither club needs to remove or submit a registration.

- (iii) A transfer from a club within the BDCL must not be unreasonably withheld or the request will be dealt with by the LMC.

A club approached by, or seeking to approach, a member of another club to move or transfer, must notify the player's present club prior to entering into any negotiations with the player concerned. Failure by a club to comply with either will result in a ban on registering any new players other than graduates from its own youth system, the length of ban to be decided by the LMC.

It is to be expected that such transfers are completed within 7 days out of season and 24 hours in season.

- (iv) No player who has played Saturday cricket for another club, either inside or outside the BDCL, is permitted to play for a club in the BDCL after the third Saturday in August unless a transfer is registered on or before the third Saturday in July.

This rule does not apply if the club that the player is registered to has fully withdrawn from the BDCL during the course of the season.

This rule does not apply to any player in Year 12 or below (Under 17 at Midnight on 31 August in the year preceding the current season).

Therefore, this rule does not apply to anyone born after 31st August 1999.

Any such breach **will** result in the player(s) being deemed as ineligible and the sanction as advised under Rule 5.6(ii) will apply.

- (v) If any player leaves a club who is not transferring to another club, and has no outstanding financial issues or disciplinary matters, his registration should be cancelled by the club without any unnecessary delay.

If any player leaves a club and has outstanding financial issues or disciplinary matters, his registration should remain until such time that those issues are resolved.

5.5 Timescales

- (i) Clubs will need to ensure that all new players are registered within the following timescales:

- a) Category 1 Players, who are to be registered to play for clubs in Division 1 and below, and all Cup Competitions, are to have their registrations submitted and accepted prior to the first match they play.

In exceptional circumstances, and at short notice, a player may be registered to play by contacting the BDCL Help Desk **BEFORE** the start of the match, providing the basic details for the player (full name, address and date of birth). The player must then have their registration submitted and accepted prior to the scorecard being submitted.

- b) All other players, who are to be registered to play for eligible clubs, are to have their registrations submitted by midnight, on the Thursday prior to the match in which they will first play.
 - c) Any player in the U12 age group and below will not be registered within this League, unless compliant with Rule 5.1(iv).
- (ii) It is recommended, in order to reduce the possibility of sanctions that **ALL** player registrations are submitted (with accompanying documentation where stipulated) and those registrations have been accepted, before any player participates in any match.

It is also recommended that no player born outside of the UK plays until their registration has been accepted by the Player Registrar, unless the club are in possession of documentation which shows the player's entitlement to them being registered under Category 1, and this documentation is sent to the Player Registrar no later than midnight on the day of the match.

Clubs should be aware that it may not be possible to contact the Player Registrar with any queries relating to player registration after 3 hours before the scheduled start time. If any club is unsure about the status of any player or has any queries, the player should not play.

- (iii) Using the registration timescales stipulated in Rule 5.5(i) a), clubs are to be aware that there is no guarantee that a registration will be accepted. It is imperative that the club is aware of the player's past registration history, and whether they may have any outstanding financial issues or disciplinary matters which would delay or deny a player's registration.

When a late registration is submitted and subsequently rejected, this **will** result in the player(s) being deemed as unregistered and the sanction advised under Rule 5.6(iii) will apply.

- (iv) Using the registration timescales stipulated in Rule 5.5(i) b), clubs are to ensure that the player does not play until their registration is confirmed by the Player Registrar.

5.6 Sanctions and Appeals

- (i) Clubs found to be in serious breach of regulations in respect with Player Registration will be dealt with at the discretion of the LMC.
- (ii) Clubs playing ineligible player(s) will retain no points from the game and will incur a £10.00 fine for each ineligible player. Their opponents will be awarded the maximum points available.

In the event of both teams playing ineligible player(s), their own penalties will apply. Neither team will benefit from the award of any additional points as a result of its opponents' misdemeanour.

Further point deductions may be imposed and financial penalties levied at the discretion of the LMC.

- (iii) Clubs playing unregistered player(s) will face a sanction as determined by the LMC.
- (iv) Both players and clubs may appeal against registration decisions. Such appeals must be submitted in writing to the League Secretary within four days of the registration decision. The onus will be placed on the club to clarify the registration position of any of its players prior to their inclusion in a match.

5.7 Spirit of the Rule

The reputation of the club is enhanced if it:

- (i) Is open about any approach to a player of another club, or any approach by a player of another club.
- (ii) Does not offer hidden incentives to players.
- (iii) Acts within the spirit, as well as the letter, of this rule.

6 Umpires

The use of light meters is not permitted.

6.1 Umpires' Panel

The BDUA, of which each League Umpire shall be a member, shall maintain a panel of Umpires to which any competent person, whether associated with a member club or not, may be appointed.

6.2 Match Appointments

- (i) Neutral Umpires shall officiate in all matches.
- (ii) The BDUA shall appoint Umpires from their panel to officiate in all BDCL matches. The appointments will be made by the Umpires' Appointments Secretary.

Appointments will be made prior to the season start, and details of appointments are shown against the fixtures listed in the handbook (pages 99-126). A copy will also be sent to Umpires individually, and to all clubs, via email.

All appointments listed are subject to change at the discretion of the Umpires' Appointments Secretary.

- (iii) Should any Umpire be unable to accept his appointment he must immediately notify the clubs and the Umpires' Appointments Secretary who shall appoint a substitute. Except in extreme and unavoidable circumstances, the Umpires' Appointments Secretary must be informed by 10.00am on the day of the match at the very latest.
- (iv) In the event of an Umpire failing to keep his appointment, the home Club Secretary must at once inform the Umpires' Appointment Secretary.

- (v) In the event of the appointed Umpire(s) failing to attend the match, or their being no Umpires appointed, the Captain of the batting side shall use his best endeavours to appoint substitute Umpires who are senior players. In the event that this is not possible, then the Captain shall use best endeavours to ensure that juniors stand as Umpire at the striker's end only.
- (vi) If no Umpire (or substitute) is available, Captains take full responsibility and sole authority for the conduct of the game. In deciding whether a game should start, be stopped or re-started due to unsatisfactory conditions of the ground, weather or light, every attempt should be made to reach an agreement. Bearing in mind that the safety of players is paramount, should an accident occur which is due to unsatisfactory conditions, then the Captain could be held liable. When in doubt, or if the Captains disagree, then play should not take place. Captains are encouraged to report incidents where the actions of players in terms of their behaviour, language and/or conduct is such, that it is felt that the relevant players should be reported to the LMC under its Code of Conduct.

6.3 Payment of Umpires

- (i) Each appointed Umpire shall, not later than the end of the interval, be paid match expenses of £40.00, the cost to be shared by both clubs concerned.
Should there be no play in the game following the arrival of both teams and the Umpires at the ground, the match expenses of the Umpires shall be £15.00 each, shared by the clubs concerned.
- (ii) Any such expenses shall be paid by the away club if, due to the condition of the ground, no play is possible, and that club has insisted on travelling against the advice of the home club.
- (iii) In the event of a match being cancelled in accordance with Rule 2.5, but the appointed Umpires, not having being told of the cancellation, arrive at the ground in time for the scheduled start time, they shall be paid full match expenses by the home club.
- (iv) In the event of only one registered League Umpire being appointed, or turning up for a match, and that Umpire takes the bowling end throughout the match, they shall be paid full match expenses plus £10.00.
- (v) There shall be an annual review of the Umpires expenses, carried out by a group constituted by members of the LMC and the BDUA, the findings of which shall be binding.

6.4 Provision of Umpires

Any club wishing to join the League shall provide one Umpire for each team it wishes to enter into the League. All such Umpires should be acceptable to the BDUA and should not be drawn from the existing pool of Umpires.

The LMC appeals to all existing clubs to make every effort to provide at least one Umpire for each team entered in the League.

6.5 Assessment of Umpires

- (i) Umpires in **ALL** Championship and Division 1 matches shall be confidentially assessed by Captains on their performance in every match, by completing the 'Umpires Assessment Form' available via the BDCL website.

All reports submitted are to be received within five days of the match.

A sanction of a 1-point reduction from any team's Divisional total in the relevant season shall be imposed for each match where there is non-compliance with this rule.

- (ii) Umpires in all other Divisions may be confidentially assessed by Captains of all teams on their performance, by completing the 'Umpires Assessment Form' available via the BDCL website.

6.6 Ground Assessment

Ground conditions, and especially pitches, shall be confidentially assessed by the umpires in consultation who shall submit a report to the League Secretary at their discretion.

7 Extraordinary Matters

7.1 Objection

Any club, having any objection to the conduct of any Umpire, player or team, or any Umpire having any objection to the conduct of any player or team in a League match, must state such objections in writing to the League Secretary who, in matters concerning Umpires, will forward a copy to the Secretary of the BDU. If the objection is sustained, such Umpire, player or team shall be dealt with at the discretion of the LMC.

The standard of proof required at all Disciplinary Hearings will be achieved by considering the '**Balance of Probability**'.

7.2 Protest

- (i) Any protest shall be lodged with the League Secretary in writing within 4 days following the match.
- (ii) A copy of such protest shall be sent to the club against whom the protest is made and confirmation that this has taken place must be lodged with the League Secretary.
- (iii) Each protest is to be accompanied by a fee of £5.00 which shall be forfeited if in the opinion of the LMC there be no reasonable grounds for such protest, but which shall be refunded if such protest is sustained.
- (iv) The club sustaining the protest may have the contested points added to its total points gained.

- (v) Clubs when making a protest shall state under which rule the protest is made.

7.3 Disputes

- (i) Any disputes having reference to the Laws of Cricket shall be referred to the MCC for settlement and their decision shall be final, but in all other matters the decision of the LMC shall be final and binding on all parties concerned.
- (ii) If any question shall arise in connection with the League competition or any cup, tournament, or any other competition organised by the LMC, whether or not the same is dealt with elsewhere, either in these rules or in the rules of any cup, tournament or other competition, the LMC shall have full power to inflict such penalties on both clubs and players as they shall think fit and their decision shall be final and by way of example, and not by definition, such penalties may be either a fine, deduction of points, suspension or expulsion from the League or any combination of them, and the amount of any fine, the number of points deducted or period of any suspension shall be at the absolute discretion of the LMC, whose decision shall be final PROVIDED THAT before any such penalty is imposed:
- a) The player and/or the Secretary of the club against whom any complaint has been made shall be notified in writing of the complaint and shall be advised that in the event of the complaint being substantiated the Disciplinary Sub-Committee may act in reliance of its powers as contained in this rule.
 - b) Shall be notified of the date, place and time when the Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall consider the complaint and shall be entitled to attend and listen to all evidence given in support of the complaint, to question any person giving any such evidence, to call evidence on their own behalf, and to address the Disciplinary Sub-Committee and comment on all points raised.

7.4 Discipline

7.4.1 CODE OF CONDUCT AND SPIRIT OF CRICKET

- (i) **Code of Conduct**
- a) The League is committed to maintaining the highest standards of behaviour and conduct. This Code of Conduct incorporates the Spirit of Cricket, as set out below.
 - b) The Captains are responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within the Spirit of Cricket as well as within the Laws.
 - c) Players and team officials must at all times accept the Umpire's decision. Players must not show dissent at the Umpire's decision or react in a provocative or disapproving manner towards another player or spectator.

- d) Players and team officials shall not intimidate, assault or attempt to intimidate or assault an Umpire, another player or spectator.
 - e) Players and team officials shall not use crude and/or abusive language (known as ‘sledging’) nor make offensive gestures or hand signals nor deliberately distract an opponent.
 - f) Players and team officials shall not make abusive comments nor indulge in abusive actions against fellow players, officials, members or supporters because of their perceived membership in a certain social group. Examples of such groups include but are not limited to: racial group, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity or gender identity. Clubs must operate an active open door membership policy whilst respecting player qualification regulations and welcome players/members irrespective of their social group.
 - g) Players and team officials shall not use or in any way be concerned in the use or distribution of illegal drugs.
 - h) Clubs must take adequate steps to ensure the good behaviour of their members and supporters towards players and Umpires.
- (ii) **Spirit of Cricket**

Cricket is a game that owes much of its unique appeal to the fact that it should be played not only within its Laws but also within the Spirit of the Game. Any action which is seen to abuse this spirit causes injury to the game itself. The major responsibility for ensuring the spirit of fair play rests with the Captains.

- a) There are two Laws which place the responsibility for the team’s conduct firmly on the Captain.

Responsibility of Captains

The Captains are responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within the Spirit of the Game as well as within the Laws.

Player’s conduct

In the event of a player failing to comply with instructions by an Umpire, or criticising by word or action the decisions of an Umpire, or showing dissent, or generally behaving in a manner which might bring the game into disrepute, the Umpire concerned shall in the first place report the matter to the other Umpire and to the player’s Captain, and instruct the latter to take action.

- b) **Fair and Unfair Play**

According to the Laws the Umpires are the sole judges of fair and unfair play. The Umpires may intervene at any time and it is the responsibility of the Captain to take action where required.

c) **The Umpires are authorised to intervene in cases of:**

- Time wasting
- Damaging the pitch
- Dangerous and unfair bowling
- Tampering with the ball
- Any other action that they consider to be unfair

d) **The Spirit of the Game involves RESPECT for:**

- Your opponents
- Your own team Captain and team
- The role of the Umpires
- The game and its traditional values

e) **It is against the Spirit of the Game:**

- To dispute an Umpire's decision by word, action or gesture
- To direct abusive language towards an opponent or Umpire
- To indulge in cheating or any sharp practice, for instance:
 - To appeal knowing that the batsman is not out
 - To advance towards an Umpire in an aggressive manner when appealing
 - To seek to distract an opponent either verbally or by harassment with persistent clapping or unnecessary noise under the guise of enthusiasm and motivation of one's own side

f) **Violence**

There is no place for any act of violence on the field of play.

g) **Players**

Captains and Umpires together set the tone for the conduct of a cricket match. Every player is expected to make an important contribution to this.

- (iii) Failure to comply with the provisions of Paragraph 1 may lead to disciplinary action, irrespective of an alleged breach being related to a match not under the jurisdiction of the League.

7.4.2 PROCEDURE

- (i) Any alleged breach of Paragraph 1, may be dealt with by the Umpires in one of the following ways:
- a) The breach is deemed of a minor nature. Verbal advice/caution should be given to the player and/or the Captain in the appropriate way (no written report is required).
 - b) Where the breach is more serious, a written report containing the facts and documenting the incident should be produced (only on the Umpire

Disciplinary Report Form) and be sent to the League Secretary within a time limit of 7 days from the date of the alleged incident. Both the player and the Captain should be informed of this process.

- (ii) Any complaint so initiated or report received by the League Secretary, must be referred to the Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee, who will consider the complaint and the evidence as soon as practicable and make a decision on one of the following three options:
- a) No further action will be taken.
 - b) From the evidence contained in the report, the matter is suitable to be dealt with via the League's Accumulated Offence Process. Therefore, notification to a player and the club, of three Accumulated Offences with the same current season, will result in a ban from all forms of cricket for three weeks (a week is Saturday to Friday inclusive). Accumulated Offences gained or reported, during the last two games in any one season which cannot count as one of the three in the same current season, will be carried into the following season as active sanctions or breaches.

The Accumulated Offence process will be given due consideration in the following circumstances:

- Pointing, gesturing or any disparaging remarks at a batsman in an inappropriate manner by a bowler or other member of the fielding team, upon the batsman's dismissal.
- Inappropriate sledging or disparaging remarks towards a player which is personal, offensive or disrespectful.
- Displaying inappropriate dissent towards an Umpire by words, actions or conduct on or off the field of play.
- Unruly behaviour, or any unfair play, likely to bring the game into disrepute.

Accumulated Offences will not be considered, where the victim of the incident is a young person who, due to age, is a player who is competing under the 'YOUNG PLAYER REGULATIONS' and the relevant safeguarding regulations.

- c) From the evidence contained within the report, the matter is more serious and warrants a full Disciplinary Hearing of the League Disciplinary Sub-Committee, which shall be convened and arranged by the League Secretary on behalf of the Chairman.

The decision of the Chairman of the League Disciplinary Sub-Committee to proceed as to which of the above three options will be implemented, shall be final and binding.

7.4.3 DISCIPLINARY HEARING

- (i) The Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall convene a hearing as soon as practicable and in any event within 21 days of the decision to refer. Any adjournments may be granted at the discretion of the Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.
- (ii) In any case which is referred for a Disciplinary Hearing, at least seven days' notice in writing of the hearing and of the offence(s) alleged shall be given to the player, or in the case of a club, its Secretary.
- (iii) The player and Captain shall be required to attend the hearing (in the case of a club by its Secretary or other official). In addition, the player can be supported by a club colleague and to call witnesses.
- (iv) The hearing shall be conducted by the Disciplinary Sub-Committee of the League which shall consist of not less than three persons.

7.4.4 PENALTIES

- (i) If at the hearing of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee finds the alleged offence proved it shall have the power to impose one or more of the following penalties:

In the case of a player:

- a) To require the player to submit appropriate letter(s) of apology within a specified time.
- b) To record or reprimand and to give a warning as to the future conduct in the case of a first offence.
- c) To impose a fine not exceeding £50.00.
- d) To suspend the player for one or more matches, or for a stated period of time.
- e) To deduct League points from the player's team.
- f) To expel the player from the League

In the case of a club:

- a) To require the club to submit appropriate letter(s) of apology within a specified time.
- b) To record a reprimand and to give a warning as to future conduct in the case of a first offence.
- c) To impose a fine not exceeding £200.00.
- d) To deduct League points from the club's team(s).
- e) To relegate the club from any competition of the League.
- f) To expel the club from the League.

- (ii) To prove clear indications to all those who fall within the scope of this procedure, the following corrective actions and penalties will be applied to any complaint of misconduct proven after investigation and hearing:
- a) **Actions likely to receive at least a reprimand and/or deduction of match points:**
- Deliberate time wasting
 - Damaging the pitch
 - Intimidatory bowling
 - Deliberate tampering with the match ball to gain an advantage
 - Ridiculous appeals from fielders
 - Distracting an opponent
 - Aggressive appealing by a bowler towards an Umpire
 - Failure of the Captain to take appropriate action to control player conduct/behaviour
- b) **Actions likely to receive at least a ban from all cricket of 3 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points:**
- Continuance of a reprimandable offence
 - 'Sledging' or disparaging remarks towards a player
 - Disparaging remarks about an Umpire
 - Showing dissent towards an Umpire by gesture
 - Disparaging remarks made by a Captain towards an Umpire or other player
 - Unruly behaviour off the field of play including foul or abusive language
 - Any action that could be constructed as unfair play or bringing the game into disrepute
- c) **Actions likely to receive at least a ban from all cricket of 6 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points:**
- Continuance of a reprimandable offence or Category 2 offence
 - Showing physical dissent without genuine reason as accepted as part of the game
 - Showing verbal dissent or persistent and unreasonable questioning of an Umpire's decision
 - Using foul or abusive language, or gestures, directed at an Umpire
 - Aggressive behaviour on or off the field of play including foul and abusive language
- d) **Actions likely to receive at least a ban from all cricket of 10 weeks and/or a fine and/or a deduction of match points:**
- Continuance of a reprimandable offence or Category 2 or 3 offences

- Violence, fighting or aggressive actions, on or off the field of play with other players or spectators
- Violence or aggressive intimidation towards an Umpire
- Verbal abuse, foul language or actions likely to be so obvious that they are not restricted to those participating in the game
- Any form of abusive action or comment due to an individual's perceived membership within a certain social group

The above, detailed in categories 7.4.4(ii) a) to d) are not exhaustive.

In addition, where a Club, individual or their representative and witnesses behave inappropriately or fail to respect the formality at any level of hearing, the Disciplinary and Appeals Sub-Committees reserve the right to impose further corrective actions or penalties as they see fit.

Points deductions resulting from disciplinary proceedings, will be applied to the team, the match and the season in which the offence took place.

- (iii) Decisions of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee (a finding that a complaint is proved or not proved or a decision or penalty) shall be by majority vote; where necessary the Panel Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- (iv) Where any player has been found guilty of disciplinary offences in the same season on two or more occasions, both the player and his/her club shall be fined a sum not exceeding £50 by the LMC. An additional ban from playing of a further 2 weeks shall be imposed upon that player at each separate subsequent disciplinary hearing, in addition to any penalties imposed by the Disciplinary Sub-Committee on each occasion.

A ban from ALL CRICKET shall remain in place, until both fines (club and player) have been satisfactorily paid to the League Treasurer.

7.4.5 APPEALS PROCEDURE

- (i) A player or club found guilty of a Disciplinary offence will have the right of appeal to the Appeals Sub-Committee. Notice of Appeal stating whether the appeal is against the finding, or is against the penalties imposed, and setting out the grounds must be given in writing to the League Secretary within seven days of the decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee, together with a deposit of £50.00.
- (ii) If Notice of Appeal is given the penalty shall not take effect pending the hearing of the Appeal.
- (iii) The Appeal shall be by way of re-hearing before a different Committee. The composition of the Committee shall be at the discretion of the Chairman and shall consist of not less than three persons. The player or club shall have the same rights of attendance and representation, and to call witnesses as they had before the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.

- (iv) The Appeals Sub-Committee may confirm, vary or reverse the decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee and it shall have the power to increase the penalty. Decisions of the Appeals Sub-Committee shall be by majority vote, where necessary, the Chairman having a casting vote.
- (v) The Appeals Sub-Committee shall have the power, where they consider an appeal to be without merit, to order the deposit to be forfeited to the League.
- (vi) The decision of the Appeals Sub-Committee or, if no appeal, of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee, shall be final and binding.

7.4.6 FINES

Any decision by the LMC ordering any club to pay Umpires' fees or expenses, or any other monies must be carried out by the club concerned within 21 days from the date the club received notification from the League Secretary, failing which a fine of £5.00 will be charged.

7.4.7 UNFORESEEN MATTERS

Any matters which may arise which are not provided for under these rules (except those relating to the laws of the game) shall be dealt with by the LMC whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties concerned.

8 Instructions to Clubs

8.1 The Pitch

- (i) The pitch must be properly prepared before the toss for innings and shall not be changed during the match unless it becomes unfit for play, and then only with the consent of both Captains.
- (ii) No match may be played on an artificial pitch.
- (iii) The wickets should be pitched so that the centre of each stump is in line with the back edge of the bowling crease.
- (iv) Dots should be placed on either side of the pitch, in line with the return creases and 5ft (1.52m), in front of the popping creases, to indicate the start of the danger area of the bowler's follow through.
- (v) Marks should be placed on the bowling crease, 1ft (0.3m) either side of the middle stump, to indicate, in conjunction with Rule 8.1(iv), the restricted area.
- (vi) Prior to the toss of the coin the Captain of the home team should indicate to his opposite number the roller(s) available for use between innings.
- (vii) Between innings the ends of the pitch must be swept and the creases re-marked as required.

8.2 The Square

- (i) Adequate repair of bowler's foot holes on used pitches should be carried out during the preparation of the ground.

- (ii) There must be no practice on the pitch or the area immediately adjacent to the pitch, at any time on the day of the match.
- (iii) Practice on the square, other than the pitch or the area immediately adjacent to the pitch, must not continue later than 15 minutes before the scheduled time for play to start, or any rescheduled time for play to start.

8.3 Hospitality

- (i) Changing facilities, preferably separate from the players' dressing rooms, should be available for the Umpires and should be secure, clean and tidy.

Clean white coats should be available.

- (ii) Each club must have adequate sanitary accommodation on the ground and a complete first-aid kit available in the pavilion.
- (iii) The home club should provide twelve teas for the visitors who should pay for eleven, the twelfth being a complimentary tea for the scorer, and a complimentary tea for each Umpire.

The LMC requests that the charge levied on the visiting team should not exceed £33.00.

8.4 Personnel

- (i) If, at the toss of the coin, a player or players have not arrived at the ground the Captain should inform his opposite numbers and the Umpires giving the name of any missing player, who may not therefore be changed without the consent of the opposing Captain.
- (ii) An incoming batsman should pass an outgoing batsman on the field of play.
- (iii) In the case of illness or injury during the game a substitute, or a runner, is allowed of right; and at the discretion of the Umpires for other wholly acceptable reasons.

It is a sporting gesture for the batting side to offer a substitute to the fielding side when the latter has nobody available.

8.5 Insurance

Each club is strongly recommended to ensure that it has Public Liability, including employer's Liability, Insurance cover for a minimum of £2,000,000.

Clubmark Accredited Clubs, or those wishing to gain Clubmark Accreditation, will need to possess the minimum amount as specified by the ECB.

8.6 Scorers

- (i) In all games, each team shall provide their own competent, non-playing scorer. If a team fails to provide a scorer, the scoring duties shall be provided by the players, when available. In instances where no player is available to score due

to fielding duties, the Captain is to ensure that the scorer is aware of all Players names where necessary.

It is the responsibility of both teams to ensure that all the information required is provided in order to comply with Rule 2.7.

- (ii) The scorers must accept the umpire's signals and instructions and, though it is no part of their duty to dictate to the umpires, mutual consultation to clear up doubtful points is, at all times, permissible and welcome.
- (iii) The scorers must give the bowler's name if the batsman is out bowled, caught, stumped, leg before wicket or hit wicket.

The scorers must give the fielder's name if the batsman is out caught, stumped or run out.

- (iv) If a batsman is caught, no run is scored, even though the batsman might have crossed but, if a batsman is run out attempting a second or subsequent run, the completed run(s) count.
- (v) The one run penalty for a no-ball or wide is in addition to any other runs scored. All runs scored off no-balls and wides, including the penalty run itself, are to be debited against the bowler. If, from a no-ball, the batsman plays the ball with his bat, runs which result will be credited to him, except for the one penalty run which will be a no-ball extra. If the batsman does not play the ball with his bat all runs will be no-ball extras.

NO-BALL

- e.g. ○ = one run penalty
 ⊕ = one run penalty plus two no-ball extras
 ⊙ = one run penalty plus three runs scored off the bat

WIDE

- e.g. + = one run penalty
 † = one run penalty plus one wide extra

- (vi) The total runs scored by all batsmen plus all runs scored as no-balls or wides (the bowling extras) must equal the total runs conceded by all the bowlers.

The total runs conceded by all the bowlers plus all runs scored by byes, leg byes and penalty runs to the batting side (the fielding extras) must equal the total innings score.

The summary section of the bowling analysis should show the number of no-balls and wides bowled as opposed to how many runs have been scored off the no-balls and wides.

- (vii) During the progress of the game both scorers should frequently check the total to ensure that the score books agree; the home club scorer should complete the 'BDCL Result Sheet' as the game proceeds.

When recording details of the first innings of a match on the 'BDCL Result Sheet' before the end of the game, record any penalty runs, the total extras and the innings total in pencil. These are provisional and will have to be amended if, during the second innings of the match, any 5 run penalties are awarded to the team which batted first.

8.7 Completing of online scorecards via the ECB Play-Cricket Network

Where scorecards are entered via electronic means (e.g. Laptop using TCS), clubs need to ensure the validity of the uploaded data.

Where scorecards are not entered, incomplete or contain errors, Rule 2.7(v) will be applied.

To enter a result, log onto your club's ECB Play-Cricket Website as an Administrator user and enter the 'Administration' pages. Using the 'Result' button on the left hand side, locate the relevant fixture using the search field and once located, click on the icon under 'Edit Result'.

8.71 SUMMARY TAB

- (i) In the first section, check the information for the 'Date', 'Start Time' and 'Ground' is correct.
- (ii) In the second section, enter the following:
- The name of the officials (Umpire 1/Umpire 2) if applicable)
 - The name of the scorers (Scorer 1/Scorer 2)
- (ii) In the third section, enter the following:
- The result
 - Confirmation of the home team
 - Confirmation of which team batted first
 - Confirm which team won the toss
- (iii) For the home team:
- The total number of runs scored
 - The number of wickets fallen (where teams have less than 11 players and are all out, this will be the actual number of wickets fallen)
 - The number of overs and balls faced
 - Whether the innings was 'declared'
 - The number of penalty points gained (usually '0')
 - The number of batting points gained (0-4)

- g) The number of bowling points gained (0-4)

Where a match was conceded or cancelled, bonus points gained will be '0'.

- (iv) For the away team:

- a) The total number of runs scored
 b) The number of wickets fallen (where teams have less than 11 players and are all out, this will be the actual number of wickets fallen)
 c) The number of overs and balls faced
 d) Whether the innings was 'declared'
 e) The number of penalty points gained (usually '0')
 f) The number of batting points gained (0-4)
 g) The number of bowling points gained (0-4)

Where a match was conceded or cancelled, bonus points gained will be '0'.

- (v) Under 'Highlights', teams can enter in any highlights of the match which they deem appropriate, and also leave any additional information for the LMC.

To move onto the next section, click 'Save'.

8.72 HOME TEAM TAB

- a) Enter the players that played for the Home Team, from the registered player list.
 b) Indicate which players were the Captain and Wicket Keeper.

It is best practice to list the players in batting order.

Where a player is not listed, forward the name, match and date to the Player Registrar by email to registrar@bassetlaw-cricket.org.uk.

To move onto the next section, click 'Save'.

8.73 AWAY TEAM TAB

- a) Enter the players that played for the Away Team, from the registered player list.
 b) Indicate which players were the Captain and Wicket Keeper.

It is best practice to list the players in batting order.

Where a player is not listed, forward the name, match and date to the Player Registrar by email to registrar@bassetlaw-cricket.org.uk.

To move onto the next section, click 'Save'.

8.74 FIRST INNINGS SCORECARD TAB

- (i) In the first section:

Rules and Playing Conditions apply with the exceptions/additions as varied hereunder.

Rules & Playing Conditions

1 Title

The title of the Competition shall be the John J. Mallen t20 Trophy.

2 Entry

- (i) The competition is open to all member clubs.
- (ii) Each member club may enter one team.
- (iii) Member clubs are required to submit their application to the League Secretary prior to the LMC meeting in January of each year.
- (iv) Withdrawal after the draw has been made will be treated as non-fulfilment of fixture and the club will be fined £10.00 for each match affected and will be immediately eliminated from the competition. The game shall be counted as a win for their opponents.

3 Organisation

3.1 Constitution

- (i) The draw for the competition will be made by the LMC at its January meeting.
- (ii) Teams will be drawn in Groups based on geographical location in order to minimise travel and will play each other team once on a tournament basis.
- (iii) In Group Matches, two points shall be awarded for a win, one point for cancelled matches and no points for a loss.

The team winning each Group will go forward to the finals day. This will extend to best placed runners-up should there not be sufficient Groups.

- (iv) On Finals day the matches will be straight knock-out matches. The winner will proceed to the next round, or in the final, will be crowned winners.

The overall winner of the competition will go forward to the Mapperley Sports t20 Challenge Match to play the winner of the South Nottinghamshire Cricket League t20 competition.

The winner of the Mapperley Sports t20 Challenge Match will go forward to the Nottinghamshire Premier League t20 Finals day, the winner of which will enter the ECB National Club t20 competition.

3.2 Group Winners

In the event of two or more teams tying at the head of a Group on the same number of points, the matter shall be resolved by the following criteria, taken in order:

- a) The number of matches won.
- b) The head to head result between the teams involved.
- c) The net run rate over all completed matches.
- d) The toss of a coin.

3.3 Awards

- (i) The John J. Mallen Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the competition.
- (ii) The Harold Pope Trophy will be awarded to the Man of the Match in the Final.

4 Qualification and Registration of Players

- (i) No player who has played for a club in the competition is eligible to play for another club in the competition in the same season.
- (ii) A player with a Premier League Club shall not be eligible if he has played the majority of his Saturday cricket in that League during the current season.
- (iii) A player registered under Category 2 or Category 3 shall be eligible to play.
- (iv) Clubs playing ineligible or unregistered player(s) in group matches will retain no points from the game and will incur a £10.00 fine for each ineligible or unregistered player. Their opponents will be awarded the maximum points available.

Clubs playing ineligible or unregistered players(s) in the semi-final or final will be expelled from the competition and will incur a £10.00 fine for each ineligible or unregistered player. The match will be awarded to their opponents.

In the event of both teams playing any ineligible or unregistered player(s), the matter will be referred to the RC whom at their discretion will either order the game to be replayed, or order the result to stand, or, in group stage matches, order the result of 'cancelled'. Any fines levied shall stand in all circumstance.

- (v) The overall winner of the competition will need to consult the rules and regulations regarding Category 2, Category 3 and Category 3 (Exempt) players prior to playing in the Mapperley Sports t20 Challenge Match against the winner of the South Nottinghamshire Cricket League t20 competition and if successful, the Nottinghamshire Premier League Finals Day and beyond. Further information can be found by consulting the ECB 'Non First Class Rules

and Regulations’ and the ECB ‘National Club twenty20 Rules and Playing Conditions’, both available from the ECB website.

5 Matches

- (i) All matches shall be played on the appointed date, as arranged and published by the LMC.
- (ii) A match may be played on an artificial pitch.
- (iii) A cancellation due to adverse playing conditions may be made by the home club ONLY WITH THE VERBAL AGREEMENT OF THE AWAY CLUB (email and text messages should not be used).
- (iv) In the event of inclement weather where a match is not possible the match will be abandoned and declared ‘No Result’.

No such cancellation shall be made before 2.00pm on the day on which the match is to be played.

- (v) Finals Day will be played on a date and venue(s) chosen by the LMC.

In the event of inclement weather on finals day, the LMC holds the right to change the scheduled fixtures and/or re-arrange the date where necessary, with mutual agreement with the clubs concerned.

If no decision is reached before any further deadline dates, or for another reason, then in the last resort, the decision shall be made by the toss of a coin between the two Captains when both Captains are present. In the event of the Captains not being able to be present, the tossing of the coin shall be referred to the League Secretary.

6 Match Results

- (i) The home club shall notify the result of the match in accordance with Rule 2.7. For Group matches, when submitting the result to the Results Service, the total number of overs and part overs received by both teams is also required for the calculation of Net Run Rate.
- (ii) For the Semi-Finals and Final, the winner of each match shall be deemed the home side.

7 Umpires

- (i) Neutral umpires, appointed by the Umpires Appointments Secretary will officiate in all matches.
- (ii) Each appointed Umpire shall, not later than the end of the interval, be paid match expenses of £20.00 shared by both clubs concerned.

Should there be no play in the game following the arrival of both teams and the Umpires at the ground, the match expenses of the Umpires shall be £10.00 each, shared by the clubs concerned.

In the event of only one registered League Umpire being appointed, or turning up for a match, and that Umpire takes the bowling end throughout the match, they shall be paid full match expenses plus £10.00, shared by both clubs concerned.

- (iii) On Finals Day, the Umpire's expenses shall be the responsibility of the LMC.

8 Playing Conditions

8.1 Hours of Play

- (i) Group matches will commence between 6.15pm and 6.30pm.
Matches on Finals Day will commence at times arranged and published by the LMC.
- (ii) Teams have 1 hour 15 minutes to bowl 20 overs.
- (iii) There shall be an interval of a maximum of 15 minutes between the innings.
- (iv) The Umpires will have sole authority as to when intervals shall be taken.

8.2 Length of Innings

- (i) Each side shall bat for 20 overs unless all out earlier.
If the team batting first is dismissed in less than 20 overs, the team batting second shall be entitled to bat for 20 overs.
- (ii) All sides are expected to have completed their 20 overs within 1 hour 15 minutes playing time.
This equates to a minimum of 16 overs per hour.
It is the responsibility of the Captain to ensure that his team bowl their allocated overs within the playing time.
- (iii) Umpires shall make due time allowance for unavoidable stoppages caused by injury or other extenuating circumstances.
- (iv) If in the opinion of the Umpires, the team fielding first fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the first innings, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled. The batting side shall receive an additional six penalty runs for each over not started at that time. The bowlers end Umpire shall signal six runs to the scorers before the first ball of each late over is bowled. These shall be recorded as penalty runs.

The interval of the maximum of 15 minutes' duration will be taken and the innings of the team batting second shall commence thereafter.

If in the opinion of the Umpires, the team fielding second fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the second innings, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled. The batting side shall receive an additional six penalty runs for each over not started at that time. The bowlers end Umpire shall signal six runs to the scorers before the first ball of each late over is bowled. These shall be recorded as penalty runs.

If the penalty runs added under this provision take the team batting second beyond the total required for victory, the game will be over at that point.

8.3 In Delayed Start Matches

- (i) The number of overs shall be arranged so that both teams have the opportunity of batting for the same number of overs.
- (ii) No match shall be reduced to less than 20 overs duration scheduled at 10 overs per team.
- (iii) The calculation of the number of overs to be bowled and the time allowed is determined using the following table:

The calculation of the time allowance with which to bowl the allocated overs is based on one over for each 3½ minutes, rounded up to the nearest minute where appropriate.

Competition Rule 8.2(iv) will apply.

8.4 In Interrupted Matches

- (i) If a match is interrupted during the first innings, and unless the batting side is dismissed, the innings shall end 1 hour 15 minutes after the start of play, or on completion of the over in progress at that time, and a maximum of the same number of overs shall be bowled in the second innings.

When such interruption prevents a minimum of 10 overs being bowled by the scheduled time for the cessation of the second innings, the hours of play shall, subject to the prevailing ground, weather or light conditions, be extended until 10 overs have been bowled.

- (ii) If a match is interrupted during the second innings, and unless a result is achieved earlier, the innings shall end 1 hour 15 minutes after the start of the innings, or on completion of the over in progress at that time.

When such interruption prevents a minimum of 10 overs being bowled in the second innings by the scheduled time for the cessation of the second innings, the hours of play shall, subject to the prevailing ground, weather or light conditions, be extended until 10 overs have been bowled, or a result has been achieved.

- (iii) The calculation of the adjusted number of overs and the time remaining is calculated using the following formulas:

$$\text{Overs Remaining} = [A] - \text{Overs already bowled}$$

$$\text{Time Remaining} = [B] - \text{Time on field of play}$$

Using the following table as guidance:

Competition Rule 8.2(iv) will apply.

- (iv) Should it be deemed that there is no longer the opportunity for the side batting second to face the minimum of 10 overs required in order of achieving a result, the match should be abandoned.

On Finals Day, Competition Rule 8.5(vi) will apply.

8.5 The Result

- (i) When both sides have had the opportunity of batting for the same agreed number of overs, the side scoring the higher number of runs shall be the winner.

If the scores are equal, the result shall be determined by the following criteria, taken in order:

- a) The team that has lost the fewer wickets.
 - b) The team with the higher score at the end of the 10th completed over.
 - c) The team with the higher score at the end of the 9th completed over, or if tied, the previous over, and so on until a winner can be decided.
 - d) The toss of a coin.
- (ii) In an interrupted match, where the side in the 1st innings batted for longer than the side in the 2nd innings, a result can only be achieved if both teams have batted for at least 10 overs unless one team has been all out in less than 10 overs or unless the team batting second scores enough runs to win in less than 10 overs. In such circumstances, the result shall be determined by the following criteria, taken in order:
- a) The average run rate.
 - b) The team that lost the fewer wickets at the end of the 10th completed over.
 - c) In Group Matches, the match to be declared 'a tie'.
 - d) On Finals Day, the toss of a coin.
- (iii) In a Group game, if a match is abandoned before it has been played to a conclusion and before the team batting second has received its allocated number of overs (providing that it has received not less than 10 overs or reached their target), the match shall be declared 'No Result'.
- (iv) In a Group game, if a match is abandoned where no play was possible, the match shall be declared 'No Result'.
- (v) On Finals Day, in the event of no result being obtained and where there is no reserve date on which to play the game (in accordance with Competition Rule 5(v)), the result shall be made by the toss of a coin between the two Captains when both Captains are present. In the event of the Captains not being able to be present, the tossing of the coin shall be referred to the League Secretary.

8.6 Overs per Bowler

- (i) No bowler shall bowl more than one-fifth of the scheduled number of overs for the innings, therefore each bowler can bowl a maximum of 4 overs.

For matches that are delayed and there is a reduction in the scheduled number of overs, the maximum number of overs per bowler is shown in the following table:

- (ii) There shall be no reduction in the maximum number of overs per bowler in a match interrupted after the start.
- (iii) In matches of 20 overs or less per team, the ECB Fast Bowling Directives provision requiring an equivalent number of overs from the same end to have elapsed before a subsequent spell can commence shall not apply (e.g. the 4 overs may be bowled at any time in the innings irrespective of the number of spells bowled).

8.7 Restrictions on the Placement of Fielders

- (i) A fielding circle shall be marked on the field of play by white plastic or rubber disks.
- (ii) The fielding circle shall consist of two semi-circles which shall have as their centre the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The ends of which shall be joined by a straight parallel line.
- (iii) The radius of each semi-circle shall be 30 yards (27.4 metres).
- (iv) The first 5 overs of each innings will constitute a 'Power Play' whereby only two fielders are permitted to be outside the field restriction markings at the instant of delivery.

For the duration of the innings only five fielders are permitted to be outside the field restriction markings at the instant of delivery.

In the event of an infringement of the above fielding restriction, the Umpire at the striker's end shall call and signal 'No Ball'.

- (v) In circumstances when the number of overs of the batting team is reduced, the number of Fielding Restriction Overs shall be reduced in accordance with the table below. For the sake of clarity, it should be noted that the table shall apply to both the 1st and 2nd innings of the match.

8.8 Law 25 – Wide Ball – Judging a Wide

- (i) Any ball, not being a No Ball, that passes the striker's leg stump, irrespective of where that ball pitched, will be called and signalled a wide. It will not be a wide if the ball makes contact with the striker, his person or equipment, or the bat in hand before it passes the line of the stumps, or the ball passes between the striker and the leg stump.
- (ii) The overall winner of the competition will need to consult the rules and regulations regarding Law 25 prior to playing in the Mapperley Sports t20 Challenge Match against the winner of the South Nottinghamshire Cricket League t20 competition and if successful, the Nottinghamshire Premier League Finals Day and beyond. Further information can be found by consulting the ECB 'Non First Class Rules and Regulations' and the ECB 'National Club twenty20 Rules and Playing Conditions', both available from the ECB website.

8.9 Match Balls

- (i) Each club will provide its own ball(s) in accordance with League Rule 3.8(i) ('All Divisions').
- (ii) For the final, the match balls shall be provided by the LMC.

8.10 Average Run Rate

A team's average run rate is calculated by dividing the number of runs scored in its innings by the number of legitimate balls received during the innings. In the case of the team batting first being dismissed in less than the number of overs allocated for their innings, the calculation will be based on the number of balls that the team was scheduled to receive and not on the number actually received. In the case of the team batting second being unable to receive their allocated overs, the calculation of their average run rate will be based on the actual number of legitimate deliveries by them during the innings. The average run rate can be calculated to any number of decimal positions and a tie can only be achieved if the average run rates are identical.

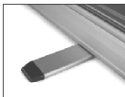

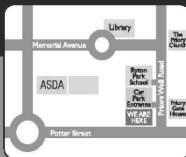

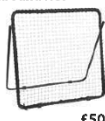

The ECB Association of Cricket Officials

The ECB ACO came into existence on 1 January 2008 as a result of the amalgamation of the Association of Cricket Umpires and Scorers (ACU&S) and the ECB Officials Association (ECBOA).

The ECB ACO has as its primary role, “the training and education of all who wish to become, and remain, cricket officials”. To this end it has created a set of accredited interlocking courses – ‘The Pathway’, for officials who wish to progress to officiate in multi-day cricket.

From the start of season 2011, the ECB ACO took complete responsibility for officiating in the recreational game at local, regional and national levels.

The ECB ACO has the following categories of membership and is open to all Umpires and Scorers at every level:

- Full Members – holding DBS clearance
- Associate Members – not active
- Junior Members – Under 21 – holding DBS clearance
- Overseas Members – outside the ECB
- Honorary Members – elected by the ACO Board

Education and training is proposed following this structure:

- 5-Level structure for Umpires and Scorers
- Entry level and introductory courses as appropriate
- Levels 1 to 3 based on National Standards set by Sports Officials UK conforming to Qualifications and Curriculum Authority National Framework
- Tutors trained to equivalent of Certificate in Tutoring Sport standard

Administration will be through the ECBACO Office based at Lord’s.

The League Cricket Conference

Established in 1962, the League Cricket Conference represents the interests of more than 60 Leagues throughout England and Wales with the aim of fostering the game of cricket in competitive League conditions.

It is also, in conjunction with the Club Cricket Conference and the Midlands Club Cricket Conference, a constituent of the National Cricket Conference, working with the England and Wales Cricket Board to further club and league cricket nationwide.

The League Cricket Conference meets three times each year, in March, September and December, at cricket clubs which are members of constituent Leagues, with the meetings providing the opportunity for delegates to meet ECB officials, the officers of Conference, and representatives of other Leagues.

Whilst having no mandatory powers the Conference provides a platform for discussion and, if necessary, arbitration in respect of matters of mutual interest such as the movement of clubs, discipline, player registration, grant aid and finance. It also provides a much valued Legal Advisory Service for both Leagues and Clubs.

The President's Trophy, a knockout competition for Leagues wishing to participate, should have celebrated 50 years in 2014 but, due to a lack of support and failure to fulfil fixtures, was declared null and void. Along with the Rhoades Trophy, for non-Premier Leagues, there will be no competition in 2015.

The Bassetlaw & District Cricket League won the President's Trophy on four occasions; in 1971 v Birmingham League, 1976 v North Staffordshire and South Cheshire Cricket League, 1978 v South Wales Cricket Association and 1984 v Birmingham League. The League XI also won the Rhoades Trophy in 2009 v Derbyshire & Cheshire League.

The Nottinghamshire Cricket Board

The Nottinghamshire Cricket Board is the governing body of recreational cricket within the county. We strive to promote and support cricket at all levels in partnership with Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club, the Trent Bridge Community Sports Trust, our local clubs, all professional and recreational cricketing bodies, and local councils and organisations.

In addition, the Board manages the Nottinghamshire Cricket Board Premier League, Nottinghamshire's most prestigious cricket league which boasts a regular presence of current and former first class cricketers.

Almost 200 clubs in Nottinghamshire are affiliated to the Board.

Affiliation Package

A package of benefits has been constructed to provide good value to clubs that choose to affiliate themselves to the Nottinghamshire Cricket Board.

The 'Primary Affiliation' fees for all Saturday and/or Sunday League Clubs is £50.00 per season and those engaged in Disability, Evening League or Friendly fixtures to be £35.00. For those clubs having a 'Secondary Affiliation' to the NCB the fee is £25.00. An ECB levy per Club and the cost of the NCCC/NCB Handbook are within the fee.

Clubs receive the following benefits when they become affiliated to the Nottinghamshire Cricket Board:

- Regular newsletters featuring competition, funding and event information.
- Specific information for groundsmen, coaches, umpires and scorers.
- Automatic affiliation to the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB).
- An understanding of the Board's primary aim i.e.: to support and develop the game.
- A clear set of NCB Recreational Council rules for the game (see Handbook).

The Board has access to six full-time Community Officers who work on behalf of the Board, a number of part-time paid professionals and a dedicated group of volunteers.

Affiliated Clubs can access subsidised courses for education and leadership in cricket development, coach education and scorers, umpires and officials development.

Board Structure

There are a number of committees who, working on behalf of the Board and are charged with shaping specific policies and practice:

Operation Management Group

A group tasked with evolving and implementing the Board's development plans.

The Recreational Council

This group acts as a forum for recreational cricket in Nottinghamshire.

Finance and Funding Group

Responsible for the Board's financial affairs.

Business, Publicity, Advisory Service and Promotions

This group is tasked with implementing a business strategy which complements the Board's aims and objectives and co-ordinates the distribution of information, contributes to the Cricket Annual and updates the official board website.

Senior Cricket and Leagues

Responsible for the Nottinghamshire Cricket Board Premier League and other senior cricket leagues in the county.

Appendix 1 – ECB Fast Bowling Directives

Age	Maximum overs per spell	Maximum overs per day
Up to U13	5 overs per spell	10 overs per day
U14, U15	6 overs per spell	12 overs per day
U16 to U19	7 overs per spell	18 overs per day

For the purpose of these Directives a fast bowler is defined as a bowler to whom a wicket keeper in the same age group would in normal circumstances stand back to take the ball.

Having completed a spell the bowler cannot bowl again, from either end, until the equivalent number of overs to the length of his* spell have been bowled from the same end. A bowler can change ends without ending his current spell provided that he bowls the next over that he legally can from the other end. If this does not happen his spell is deemed to be concluded. If play is interrupted, for any reason, for less than 40 minutes any spell in progress at the time of the interruption can be continued after the interruption up to the maximum number of overs per spell for the appropriate age group. If the spell is not continued after the interruption the bowler cannot bowl again, from either end, until the equivalent number of overs to the length of his spell before the interruption have been bowled from the same end. If the interruption is of 40 minutes or more, whether scheduled or not, the bowler can commence a new spell immediately.

Once a bowler covered by these Directives has bowled in a match he cannot exceed the maximum number of overs per day for his age group even if he subsequently bowls spin. He can exceed the maximum overs per spell if bowling spin, but cannot then revert to bowling fast until an equivalent number of overs to the length of his spell have been bowled from the same end.

If he bowls spin without exceeding the maximum number of overs in a spell the maximum will apply as soon as he reverts to bowling fast. Captains, Team Managers and Umpires are asked to ensure that these Directives are followed at all times.

For guidance it is recommended that in any 7 day period a fast bowler should not bowl more than 4 days in that period and for a maximum of 2 days in a row.

Age groups are based on the age of the player at midnight on 31st August in the year preceding the current season.

*Any reference to he/his should be interpreted to include she/her.

Appendix 2 – ECB Safety Guidance on the Wearing of Cricket Helmets (“Head Protectors”) by Young Players

In February 2000 the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) issued safety guidance on the wearing of helmets by young players up to the age of 18. In brief, the guidance recommends that:

- Helmets with a faceguard or grille should be worn when batting against a hard cricket ball in matches and in practice sessions.
- Young players should regard a helmet with a faceguard as a normal item of protective equipment when batting, together with pads, gloves and, for boys, an abdominal protector.
- Young wicket keepers should wear a helmet with a faceguard, or a wicketkeeper face protector when standing up to the stumps.

With the assistance of schools, cricket clubs and leagues, the wearing of helmets by young players is now standard practice in cricket throughout England and Wales. Helmets are widely available and are covered by a British Standard (BS7928:1998). A face protector represents an alternative head protection system for young wicket keepers. Face protectors are, at the time of publication of this guidance, a relatively new innovation. Wicketkeeper Face Protectors are covered by a new British Standard (BS7928-2:2009).

The original guidance allowed parents or guardians to give their written consent to allow a young player not to wear a helmet. However now parental consent not to wear a helmet should not be accepted in any form of cricket.

This guidance applies to all players up to the age of 18, both in adult cricket and in all junior cricket played with a hard cricket ball.

The guidance also applies during all practice sessions. Any individual taking responsibility for players should take all reasonable steps to ensure that this guidance is followed at all times.

The ECB asks that the guidance is communicated to the parents or guardians of all young players through clubs and schools, and that young players are not allowed to bat or stand up to the stumps when keeping wicket against a hard ball without wearing appropriate protection.

Update:

In March 2014 the following guidance was issued. This applies to head protectors worn by all cricketers.

New Cricket Head Protector Testing Standard (more commonly known as the Helmet testing standard)

The ECB, PCA and the ICC have worked with BSi and head protector manufacturers to develop a new specification for the testing of head protection for cricketers. This specification [was] approved by BSi Group, which is the national body responsible for producing appropriate safety standards in the UK.

With cricketers and bowling machines able to deliver cricket balls at high speeds, and given the obvious importance of protecting against head injuries wherever possible, head protectors are an essential part of a cricketer's kit.

It is important that individuals understand how the new specification [has applied] to head protectors on sale from Spring/ Summer 2014.

The key features of the new specification, **BS7928:2013**, are:

1. it now includes a facial contact projectile test that assesses for penetration of the ball through the faceguard, and contact of the faceguard onto the face, using realistic ball impact speeds and conditions; and
2. head protectors have been tested separately against men's and junior sized cricket balls (a five-and-a-half-ounce ball and a four-and-three-quarter ounce ball, respectively).

Head protectors that have been tested against the new standard will be clearly labelled with "**BS7928:2013**" and will contain clear labelling setting out whether a head protector has been tested against:

- i) men's standard ball size of 5 ½ ounces,
- ii) junior standard ball size of 4 ¾ ounces, or
- iii) both men's and junior size balls.

The manufacturers have advised that there is currently no specific women's head protector and so there is no specific standard for women's cricket head protectors. As the size of the standard women's cricket ball is between the standard men and junior balls, it is recommended that women use head protectors that have been tested against both the men's and junior sized ball or at least against the junior size ball (as the smaller ball could potentially get through the gap above the face guard on a men's head protector).

From 30 June 2014, the old BSI standard for cricket head protectors (**BS7928:1998**) [was] withdrawn and the ECB therefore recommends that all new head protectors brought to market are tested against the new standard.

However, head protectors which have already been tested against the old standard can and will continue to be available for sale and will not be withdrawn from the market.

In light of this, the ECB has issued this guidance to ensure that the public understands the meaning and merits of the new specification (and consequent labelling that will soon be introduced) and therefore to enable the public to make an informed decision as to which head protector to use.

Finally, whilst the ECB considers that head protectors are an essential part of a cricketer's kit to mitigate the risk of injury, it must be remembered that wearing a head protector and faceguard (whether or not it has been tested against the new standard) cannot always prevent death, injury or disability.

Appendix 3 – Fielding Restrictions

The ECB has regulations covering the minimum fielding distances for young players in all matches where a hard ball is used.

- No young player in the Under 15 age group, or younger, shall be allowed to field closer than 8 yards (7.3 metres) from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side, until the batsman has played at the ball.
- For players in the Under 13 age group and below the distance is 11 yards (10 metres).
- These minimum distances apply even if the player is wearing a helmet.
- Should a young player in these age groups come within the restricted distance the Umpire must stop the game immediately and instruct the fielder to move back.
- In addition any young player in the Under 16 to Under 18 age groups, who has not reached the age of 18, must wear a helmet and, for boys, an abdominal protector (box) when fielding within 6 yards (5.5 metres) of the bat, except behind the wicket on the off side. Players should wear appropriate protective equipment whenever they are fielding in a position where they feel at risk.
- These fielding regulations are applicable to all cricket in England and Wales. Age groups are based on the age of the player at midnight on 31st August in the year preceding the current season.

Appendix 4 – ECB Guidelines for Junior Players in Open Age Cricket

The ECB has issued guidance covering the selection and participation of young players in open age group cricket. This is to help clubs decide when to select young players in open age cricket and how best to help their cricketing development when they play within open age groups. The ECB keeps these guidelines under review and, following feedback from clubs and leagues, has revised these guidelines for the 2014 season. The ECB will continue to monitor the impact of these guidelines and you are invited to feedback your thoughts and comments in writing to the ECB Non-First Class Cricket Department.

The guidance is as follows:

General

- Making the step up from junior to open age group cricket is a significant event in any player's cricket experience. Ensure the player's safety, personal development needs and overall cricket experience are considered
- Clubs, squad coaches and managers must take into account the requirements on age detailed in this guidance
- Each case is to be determined on an individual basis, depending on the player's ability and stage of cognitive and emotional maturity to take part at this level – however, the minimum age guidance provided below must be adhered to
- Juniors should be involved in all aspects of the game wherever possible i.e. socialising, team talks, practice, decision making and so on, so they feel part of the team
- Children will often feel more comfortable and able to perform if they have a family member or friend also playing in the side
- Remember, children's early experiences will remain with them always and will often determine whether they want to remain playing the game or give up and do something else
- Provide an opportunity for players to show their talents in an appropriate way. Children who are just used as fielders will not fully experience the game.
- Be supportive, at all times, for all forms of effort even when children are not successful. Try and put them in situations where they will experience some success (however small) and ensure plenty of praise and encouragement
- The captain should inform the Umpires of under 18s in the side

Restrictions

ECB Helmets, Fast Bowling Directives and Fielding Regulations should always be adhered to for junior players in Open age group cricket

Minimum age^{#1}

Players who are selected in a County U12 squad in spring for a summer squad or in another squad deemed by ECB Performance Managers to be of a standard above 'district level' for that season are eligible to play Open age cricket

Players who are selected in a County U12 squad in spring for a summer squad or in another squad deemed by ECB Performance Managers to be of a standard above 'district level' for that season are eligible to play Open age cricket

This is providing that they are at least 11 years old, are in School Year 7 on 1st September in the year preceding the season, and have written parental consent to play. In allowing these players to play in open age cricket it is essential clubs and coaches recognise the 'duty of care' obligations they have towards these young players

This means boys and girls who are county squad and area squad players, are able to play open age group cricket if they are in an U12 age group and are a minimum of 11 years old on 1st September of the year preceding the season

District and club players who are not in a county or area squad must wait until they reach the U13 age group, be in Year 8 and be 12 years old on 1st September of the preceding year before being able to play in any open age group cricket. As before written parental consent is required for these players

The duty of care should be interpreted in two ways:

- Not to place a young player in a position that involves an unreasonable risk to that young player, taking account of the circumstances of the match and the relative skills of the player
- Not to create a situation that places members of the opposing side in a position whereby they cannot play cricket as they would normally do against adult players

In addition, the guidelines note the need for clubs and leagues to recognise the positive experience young players should have in open age cricket. Clubs should provide an opportunity for players to show their talents in an appropriate way

^{#1} The NCB policy on the minimum age for junior players playing in open age cricket within Nottinghamshire overrides the ECB guidance above. The NCB policy is covered under League Rule 5.5(i)c and Appendix 5.

Appendix 5 – NCB Guidelines for Junior Players in Open Age Cricket

On 14th December 2015 following its regular review of this policy the Nottinghamshire Cricket Board Directors decided to make a small but significant change to their policy. With immediate effect the following policy will apply to Nottinghamshire cricket:

- a) A small number of Year 7 Under 12 age group County players (Under 12 years on 31st August 2015) can be selected to play in open age cricket. Their names will be published on an 'Approved List' available on the NCB website (www.nottscricket.co.uk).
- b) The Board's Player Pathway Development Officer will be responsible for identifying which players are assessed as fit and ready to play in open age cricket. This decision will be based on the players' skills & abilities, cricket experience, stage of cognitive & emotional development and their future potential playing levels.
- c) No appeals will be permitted for any Under 12 County Player (Under 12 on 31st August 2015) not selected.
- d) The 'Approved List' will appear on the NCB website each year. Selected players and their parents/guardians will be informed. **The player and a parent/guardian MUST give explicit written consent to play in open age cricket, the same process any Year 8 player (Under 13 on 31st August 2015) has to undertake. Club Welfare Officers can assist with this process.** Leagues will be informed in order that appropriate player registrations may be carried out including entry on Play-Cricket. Clubs who have players on the 'Approved List' will also be notified. This list will be published following the completion of the squad's winter training programme which is around the start of the playing season.
- e) Each year the County Under 12 squad (Under 12 on 31st August 2015) will be selected following trials around September of the previous year and will generally consist of 14 players. Some members of this squad may not be selected to play in open age cricket and therefore their name will not appear on the 'Approved List'.
- f) If a player in Year 6 or below (Under 11 on 31st August 2015) is selected for the County Under 12 squad, they will **NOT** be considered for inclusion on the 'Approved List'.

- g) The NCB's Player Pathway Development Officer will monitor the Under 12's squad during the playing season. If a player not on the 'Approved List' develops during the playing season in such a way that they ought to be included on the list then their name will be added, published and circulated as d) above.
- h) This policy will be constantly monitored and will be formally reviewed at the end of each playing season.
